We are writing to let you know it will soon be time for your next Medical Expenditure Panel Survey (MEPS) interview. An interviewer will contact you in the near future to schedule an appointment.



To ensure that everyone is compensated for his/her time, each person who completes a booklet will receive a \$5 check from the interviewer. Of course, you will also receive the \$50 payment at the conclusion of the in-person interview as compensation for the time you spend keeping records for the next interview.
