Who must comply?	Manufacturers of boats, inboard engines, outboard motors, sterndrive engines or inflatable personal flotation devices approved under 46 CFR 160.076
What is this collection about?	This information collection requires manufacturers conducting product recalls to provide an initial report and progress reports to the Coast Guard (CG) about products being recalled, the numbers of owners notified and the number of units corrected.
Where do I find the requirements for this information?	Title 33 CFR 179, is available at: http://ecfr.gpoaccess.gov/cgi/t/text/text-idx?c=ecfr&tpl=%2Findex.tpl select TITLE 33 – NAVIGATION AND NAVIGABLE WATERS, and follow it to Part 179.
When must information be submitted to the Coast Guard?	Quarterly. At the start of a recall, the manufacturer submits the Defect/Noncompliance Report (CG-4917). The first Campaign Update Report (CG-4918) must be submitted within 60 days after the manufacturer submits the Defect Noncompliance Report. An additional CG-4918 form must be submitted within 90-day intervals thereafter, until the recall campaign reaches an acceptable level of completion.
How is the information submitted?	In writing or electronically via e-mail. Information must be submitted to the Recreational Boating Product Assurance Branch (CG-54223) at Coast Guard Headquarters. Contact info for CG-54223 is provided once a recall campaign is initiated.
What happens when information is received?	Once all required information per 33 CFR 179 has been provided information is entered into a database and used to monitor progress in conducting recall.
