Supporting Statement General Declaration 1651-0002

A. Justification:

CBP Form 7507, *General Declaration*, must be filed for all aircraft entering under the provisions of 19 CFR 122.41. This form is used to document clearance by the arriving aircraft at the required inspectional facilities and inspections by appropriate regulatory agency staffs.

CBP Form 7507 collects information about the flight routing, the numbers of passengers embarking and disembarking, a declaration of health for the persons on board, details about disinfecting and sanitizing treatments during the flight, and a declaration attesting to the accuracy and completeness and truthfulness of all other documents that make up the manifest.

CBP Form 7507 is authorized by 19 U.S.C. 1431, 1433, and 1644a; 39 U.S.C. 602(b) and provided for by 19 CFR 122.43, 122.48, 122.54, 122.73, and 122.144. This form is accessible at http://forms.cbp.gov/pdf/CBP Form 7507.pdf

2. Indicate how, by whom, and for what purpose the information is to be used. Except for a new collection, indicate the actual use the agency has made of the information received from the current collection.

CBP Form 7507 is used by CBP as a declaration attesting to the accuracy, completeness and truthfulness of all other documents that make up the manifest. The form also allows the airlines to meet the needs of four separate Federal inspection agencies. If this information were not collected, several Federal agencies would be unable to enforce their regulatory requirements.

3. Describe whether, and to what extent, the collection of information involves the use of automated, electronic, mechanical, or other technological collection techniques or other forms of information technology, e.g. permitting electronic submission of responses, and the basis for the decision for adopting this means of collection. Also describe any consideration of using information technology to reduce burden.

CBP plans to automate the collection of this information in the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE), although it is anticipated that this form will not be

paperless until 2015.

This information is not duplicated elsewhere.

This information collection does not involve small businesses.

Public comments were solicited through two Federal Register notices dated March 7, 2012 (Volume 77, Page 13617) on which no comments were received, and on May 9, 2012 (Volume 77, Page 27242) on which no comments have been received.

There is no offer of a monetary or material value for this information collection.

Public Cost

The estimated cost to the respondents is \$1,660,000. This is based on the estimated burden hours (83,000) multiplied (x) hourly rate (\$20.00).

There are no recordkeeping, capitalization or start-up costs associated with this collection.

The estimated cost associated with collecting the information is \$7,022,000. This is based on an estimated time per response (10 minutes or .166 hours) x total responses (1,000,000) = 166,000 hours expended multiplied (x) by the estimated average hourly rate of \$42.00 = \$6,972,000; plus printing costs are \$50,000 based

on the number of forms filed annually (1,000,000) multiplied by 5 cents per copy = \$50,000.

There has been no increase or decrease in the estimated annual burden hours previously reported for this information collection. There is no change to the information collected or to CBP Form 7507.
