<b>Who must comply?</b>	Owners and operators of certain vessels.
<b>What is this collection about?</b>	The information is needed to ensure that a vessel complies with the ballast water management (BWM) regulations prior to entry into U.S. waters from beyond the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) (i.e., 200 mile limit).
<b>Where do I find the requirements for this information?</b>	Title 33 CFR 151, is available at— <a href="http://ecfr.gpoaccess.gov">http://ecfr.gpoaccess.gov</a> , select TITLE 33 – NAVIGATION AND NAVIGABLE WATERS, and follow to Part 151, subparts C & D.
<b>When must information be submitted to the Coast Guard?</b>	In general, you must submit BWM information at least 24 hour prior to entry into the U.S. For a voyage of less than 24 hour, you must submit the information before you depart on your voyage. For an owner/operator of a vessel seeking a ballast water discharge standards (BWDS) compliance extension request, at least 12 months before the implementation date.
<b>How is the information submitted?</b>	The BWM information may be submitted by one for four methods—by mail, or electronically via an on-line form, e-mail or fax. For details, go to <a href="http://invasions.si.edu/nbic/">http://invasions.si.edu/nbic/</a> . The BWDS extension request, may be submitted by mail or electronically via e-mail. For details, see below.
<b>What happens when complete information is received?</b>	The information is used by the Coast Guard (CG) to analyze the BWM practices of commercial ships that operate in the waters of the United States.
