### How did you get my address?

Your address was either randomly selected from a database of licensed anglers in your state or you completed the South Atlantic Survey of NOAA Services within the last two months. Addresses were selected using scientific sampling methods. You and your household represent many other households in your part of the State.

## Nobody in my house fished in the last few months. Should I still respond to the survey?

Yes. It is important that everyone who receives this questionnaire complete it and return it. For this survey to be scientific, we need basic information about all households selected for the survey whether they fished recently or not.

### Why can't you interview another household instead of mine?

For the results to be scientific, we need all households who receive this questionnaire to complete the questionnaire and send it back.

### Who is sponsoring the survey?

This study is being sponsored by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). NOAA's mission is to understand and predict changes in the Earth's environment and conserve and manage coastal and marine resources to meet our Nation's economic, social and environmental needs

### How will the information I provide be used?
