REPORTABLE VOLUNTARY MEDICAL CONDITIONS

Pursuant to 42 CFR Part 71.21(b), the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) requires the commander of an aircraft destined for a U.S. airport to report the presence on board of any death or any ill person among passengers or crew to the quarantine station at or nearest the port of arrival.

An immediate report must be made for any ill passenger or crew member. For this purpose, an ill person exhibits:

- Temperature of 100°F (38°C) or greater accompanied by rash, or
- Temperature of 100°F (38°C) or greater accompanied by glandular swelling, or
- Temperature of 100°F (38°C) or greater accompanied by jaundice, or
- Temperature of 100°F (38°C) or greater which has persisted for more than 48 hours, or
- Diarrhea defined as the occurrence in a 24-hour period of three or more loose stools or a greater than normal amount of loose stool.

In addition to the aforementioned required certain illnesses, CDC is asking that reports be made for the following conditions:

- Hemorrhagic fever syndrome (persistent fever accompanied by abnormal bleeding from any site); or
- Acute respiratory syndrome (severe cough or severe respiratory disease of less than 3 weeks in duration); or
- Acute onset of fever and severe headache, accompanied by stiff neck or change in level of consciousness.
