### Introduction

The entire session will last about an hour.

Keep in mind that difficulties you may run into reflect the design of the website and materials, not *your* skills or abilities.
- In order for us to get a better idea on what to suggest improving, we would you like you to think out loud when responding to the questions and working on the tasks. We'd really like to hear if you like or dislike something, what you are expecting to see on a page, where you are expecting a link to take you, and why you are going to a page or section for information.

We did not create the materials we are testing, so please do not feel like you have to hold back on your thoughts to be polite. Please share both your positive and negative reactions to the site.
