<p>The High School Longitudinal Study of 2009 (HSL:09) is a nationally representative, longitudinal study of more than 20,000 ninth graders in 944 schools who will be followed through their secondary and postsecondary years. The main study students were re-surveyed in 2012 when most were high school 11th graders. The study focuses on understanding students' trajectories from the beginning of high school into postsecondary education or the workforce and beyond. What students decide to pursue when, why, and how are crucial questions for HSL:09, especially, but not solely, in regards to science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) courses, majors, and careers. This submission amends the clearance obtained on April 19, 2013, for the 2013 update of HSL:09 high school students who were in 9th grade in the base year (June 2013 – October 2013), collection of their high school transcripts (September 2013 – May 2014), and 2nd follow-up sample panel maintenance (FT: between 2012 Update & 2FU – Fall 2013; Main Study: between 2013 Update and 2FU – Fall 2014). The change request provides a revised plan for responsive design model to be used in the 2013 update study and a corresponding incentive plan.</p>
