## **Change Request Justification for Select Instructions in 0925-0002**

0925-0002 received clearance in August 2012. Since then several Federal-wide and agency-specific initiatives have begun that require modification to instructions used for progress reports cleared in this package, specifically the PHS 2590 and the NIH Research Performance Progress Report (RPPR). There is no new data collection being proposed. Changes are described below for those source documents within 0925-0002 that are being revised; with corresponding information explaining the background and nature of the change.
