- 8) Who are the main partners, supporters, or collaborators?
- 9) What will be different in the (local/regional/state) community after activities are completed?
- 10) What does this project do that no one/no other resource does?
- 11) To date, what have been the key accomplishments?
- 12) How are these funded? For this incident/project, what have you been able to accomplish that you couldn't have accomplished without CDC-preparedness and response funding?
- 13) Are there any other federal partners involved?
- 14) Are there any existing materials about the incident/project that you could send me?
