(Form 1139)

1. CIRCUMSTANCES NECESSITATING COLLECTION OF INFORMATION

Section 6411 allows corporations that expect to incur a net operating loss, net capital loss, or unused general business credit in the current tax year to carryback the expected loss or credit to a prior tax year.

2. USE OF DATA

Form 1139 is filed on an occasional basis. IRS uses Form 1139 as a check against the amount of net operating loss, net capital loss, or unused general business credit claimed on the income tax return. If the amount claimed on Form 1139 is more than the amount show on the corporation's income tax return, IRS collects the tax erroneously refunded.

Low filing volume does not justify the cost of electronic enabling.
