The DHS Privacy Office agrees with the FEMA Privacy Office's recommendation that the Request for Site Inspection/Landowners Authorization/Ingress/Egress Agreement form is a privacy sensitive system with coverage required under the DHS/FEMA/PIA – 027 NEMIS-IA PIA and the DHS/FEMA – 008 Disaster Recovery Assistance Files SORN. A Privacy Act Statement is also required for this system.

This form collects PII from members of the public seeking direct housing assistance from FEMA. Members of the public must provide this information in order to apply for and obtain this assistance before the site can be physically assessed and before housing can be placed at the landowner's property.

The DHS/FEMA/PIA – 027 NEMIS-IA PIA is currently being updated to support a number of DHS systems and process. However, the purpose of the PIA is to allow FEMA to collect and process information obtained from disaster recovery assistance applications via the Disaster Assistance Improvement Program (DAIP)/Disaster Assistance Call Center (DAC) system. This form will be covered under the newest version of the NEMIS-IA PIA when it is published.

The DHS/FEMA - 008 Disaster Recovery Assistance Files SORN provides coverage to information collected by this form in order to register applicants seeking disaster assistance from FEMA, determine eligibility of the applicants, and to inspect damaged property. The information collection by this form is consistent with the purpose, categories of records, categories of individuals, and the routine uses within this SORN.
