We now have the information necessary to publish how many horses, ponies and other equine were located in Virginia for 2006.

Another very important part of telling the equine story in Virginia is to include information on the economic importance of equine in Virginia. How much money is spent on equine-related activities? How many workers are employed in the industry? These are important questions that need to be answered. That is why we are conducting this second phase of the survey.

The Virginia Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service is charged with conducting the second phase of the 2006 Virginia Equine Survey. You have been selected to participate. Only a small portion of those included in the first phase of the survey were selected for this phase. We need detailed expense, asset and income information if we are to accurately estimate the huge economic contribution that the equine industry provides to Virginia's overall economy.

Your response is voluntary. However, your response is essential to ensure an accurate and reliable report. Your information represents your own and similar operations throughout the state.
