You have been selected to participate in the **2013 Annual Capital Expenditures Survey (ACES)** and the **2013 Information and Communication Technology Survey (ICTS)**. The ACES collects capitalized spending for new and used structures and equipment. The ICTS is a supplement to the ACES in that it collects both capitalized and non-capitalized spending for information and communication technology (ICT) equipment and computer software. The ACES and ICTS data are a key source of information about U.S. economic performance. Business investment in structures and equipment is a key component of the official estimate of the Gross Domestic Product. The ICTS data are very important in calculating the investment component of the Gross Domestic Product. The ACES and ICTS data also help U.S. businesses identify market opportunities, develop new products, and conduct strategic planning.
