*Note for OMB: This survey does not collect PII. In the network enumeration modules, respondents are prompted that they may list their contacts (e.g., relatives and friends) in any manner that is helpful to them. This information is not collected by us, rather it is temporarily stored in memory cache that can only be read by the survey instrument on respondents' computers. When respondents complete, or otherwise exit, the survey, these data are completely lost. Full disclosure to the respondent that we are not collecting PII is made both at the time of consent and in the network enumeration question prompt.
