#### PART I.—GENERAL INFORMATION

<u>Background.</u> — This proceeding was instituted in response to a petition filed on October 16, 2014, by American Cast Iron Pipe Company, Birminghham, AL; Energex, a division of JMC Steel Group, Chicago, IL; Maverick Tube Corporation, Houston, TX; Northwest Pipe Company, Vancouver, WA; Stupp Corporation, Baton Rouge, LA; Tex-Tube Company, Houston, TX; TMK IPSCO, Houston, TX; and Welspun Tubular LLC USA, Little Rock, AR. Countervailing and antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these proceedings if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce makes an affirmative determination of subsidization/dumping. <u>Certain Welded Line Pipe</u>.—Certain welded line pipe is circular welded carbon and alloy steel (other than stainless steel) pipe of a kind used for oil or gas pipelines, not more than 609.6 mm (24 inches) in nominal diameter, regardless of wall thickness, length, surface finish, end finish, or stenciling. Such pipe is normally produced to the American Petroleum Institute ("API") specification 5L, but can be produced to comparable foreign specifications, to proprietary grades, or can be non-graded material. All pipe meeting the physical description set forth above, including all multiple-stenciled pipe with an API line pipe stencil, is covered by the scope of these investigations.

The welded line pipe that is subject to these investigations is currently classifiable in the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) under statistical reporting numbers 7305.11.1030, 7305.11.5000, 7305.12.1030, 7305.12.5000, 7305.19.1030, 7305.19.5000, 7306.19.1010, 7306.19.1050, 7306.19.5110, and 7306.19.5150. While the HTSUS subheadings are provided for convenience and customs purposes, the written description of the scope of this investigation is dispositive.

**Reporting of information**.-- If information is not readily available from your records, provide carefully prepared estimates. If your firm is completing more than one questionnaire (i.e., a producer, importer, and/or purchaser questionnaire), you need not respond to duplicated questions.

**Electric Resistance Welded Line Pipe ("ERW")**--ERW pipe is formed from hot-rolled coils through the application of pressure and without the use of filler metal.
