PA permits U.S. citizens or lawful permanent residents to gain access to information pertaining to themselves in Federal agency records; to have a copy made of all or any part thereof; to correct or amend such records; and to permit individuals to make requests concerning what records pertaining to themselves are collected, maintained, used, or disseminated. PA also prohibits disclosure of any person's records without his or her written consent, except under certain circumstances as prescribed by PA.</p>
