Students selected for this competitive volunteer program will participate in cutting-edge research at NIST, and will work closely with NIST staff scientists and engineers on a specific research problem. The information collected is necessary to select the students from the available applicants for this competitive program.

The first round of the application process will be completed via an on-line application through the Student Information System which collects basic biographical information about the student. This information will be reviewed and finalists will be invited to submit secondary materials via e-mail to ship@nist.gov. These secondary materials include a resume, transcript, letters of recommendation, personal statement, and parental consent and commitment form. The latter information will be used to determine the student's interests and skills to best match them with available projects and mentors. None of the information is disseminated to the public.
