Crew Member's Declaration

Justification

CBP Form 5129, *Crew Member's Declaration*, is a declaration made by crew members listing all goods acquired abroad which are in his/her possession at the time of arrival in the United States. The data collected on CBP Form 5129 is used for compliance with currency reporting requirements, supplemental immigration documentation, agricultural quarantine matters, and the importation of merchandise by crew members who complete the individual declaration. This form is authorized by 19 USC 1431 and provided for by 19 CFR 4.7, 4.81, 122.83, 122.84, 148.61-148.67. CBP Form 5129 is accessible at <http://www.cbp.gov/sites/default/files/documents/CBP%20Form%205129.pdf>.

The data submitted on CBP Form 5129 is used by CBP to determine applicable duty payments and/or compliance with all applicable laws.

This form is filled out on vessels and submitted at seaports; therefore, it would not be appropriate to submit it electronically.

This information is not duplicated in any other place or any other form.

This information collection does not have an impact on small businesses or other small entities.

The information collected on CBP Form 5129 is necessary upon every arrival in the United States as part of the requirements to declare items acquired abroad or to be landed in the United States. Less frequent collection compromises revenue collection, agriculture quarantines, and compliance with other applicable laws.

This information is collected in a manner consistent with the guidelines of 5 CFR 1320.5(d)(2).

Public comments were solicited through two Federal Register notices published on November 21, 2014 (Volume 79, Pages 69516) on which no comments were received, and on February 3, 2015 (Volume 80, Pages 5772) on which no comments were received.

There is no offer of a monetary or material value for this information collection.

A SORN was published on November 18, 2008 (Volume 73, Page 68435) entitled Passenger-Crew Lists. A copy of this SORN will be submitted with this ICR. There are no assurances of confidentiality provided to the respondents of this information collection.

Public Cost

The estimated cost to the respondents is \$50,616,720. This is based on the estimated burden hours associated with this collection (996,000) multiplied by (x) the average hourly wage rate (\$50.82).

13. Provide an estimate of the total annual cost burden to respondents or record keepers resulting from the collection of information.

There are no record keeping, capital, start-up, or maintenance costs associated with this information collection.

The estimated annual cost to the Federal Government associated with reviewing and processing the information is \$30,836,160. This is based on the time spent per response (5 minutes or 0.083 hours) multiplied by (x) the number of responses that must be reviewed (6,000,000) = 498,000 hours expended multiplied by (x) an average hourly wage rate of \$61.92 = \$30,836,160.

There has been no increase or decrease in the estimated annual burden hours previously reported for this information collection. There is no change to the information collected or to CBP Form 5129.

This information collection will not be published for statistical purposes.
