This information collection is designed to collect information from businesses that meet one of the definitions of a Section 3 Business set forth at 24 CFR § 135.5. The information collected will be added to HUD's Section 3 Business Registrydatabase so eligible firms can be notified by recipients of covered financial assistance and their contractors about local HUD-funded contracting opportunities. Reapplication procedures must be completed each subsequent year and will require businesses to self-certify that they remain eligible to receive preference on HUD-funded contracts and update business contact information.
