#### PART I.—GENERAL INFORMATION

<u>Background.</u> On June 25, 2005, the Department of Commerce issued antidumping duty orders on imports of chlorinated isos from China and Spain. On September 1, 2015, the Commission instituted a review pursuant to section 751(c) of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1675(c)) (the Act) to determine whether revocation of the orders would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to the domestic industry within a reasonably foreseeable time. If both the Commission and Commerce make affirmative determinations, the orders will remain in place. If either the Commission or Commerce makes negative determinations, the Department of Commerce will revoke the orders. <u>Chlorinated Isocyanurates ("chlorinated isos"):</u> Chlorinated isos, which are derivatives of cyanuric acid, described as chlorinated s-triazine triones. There are three primary chemical compositions of chlorinated isos:

- (1) Trichloroisocyanuric acid (Cl<sub>3</sub>(NCO)<sub>3</sub>),
- (2) sodium dichloroisocyanurate (dihydrate) (NaCl<sub>2</sub>(NCO)<sub>3</sub>(2H<sub>2</sub>O)), and
- (3) sodium dichloroisocyanurate (anhydrous) (NaCl<sub>2</sub>(NCO)<sub>3</sub>).

Chlorinated isos are available in powder, granular, and tableted forms. The orders cover all chlorinated isos.

<u>Purchaser</u>.--Any firm engaged, either directly or through a parent company or subsidiary, in purchasing chlorinated isos from another firm that produces, imports, or otherwise distributes chlorinated isos.
