<u>Background</u>.--This proceeding was instituted in response to a petition filed on March 31, 2016, by Compass Chemical International LLC, Smyrna, GA. Countervailing and antidumping duties may be assessed on the subject imports as a result of these proceedings if the Commission makes an affirmative determination of injury, threat, or material retardation, and if the U.S. Department of Commerce makes an affirmative determination of subsidization and dumping. <u>HEDP</u>.—The products covered by these investigations include all grades of aqueous, acidic (non-neutralized) concentrations of 1–hydroxyethylidene–1,1–diphosphonic acid ("HEDP"), also referred to as hydroxethlylidenendiphosphonic acid, hydroxyethanediphosphonic acid, acetodiphosphonic acid, and etidronic acid. The CAS (Chemical Abstract Service) registry number for HEDP is 2809–21–4.

The merchandise subject to this investigation is currently classified in the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) at subheading 2931.90.90. Merchandise covered by the scope may also be imported under HTSUS subheadings 2811.19.6090, 2931.00.9043, 2931.90.9041, and 2931.90.9047. While HTSUS subheadings are provided for convenience and customs purposes only, the written description of the scope of this investigation is dispositive.

<u>Importer</u>.--Any person or firm engaged, either directly or through a parent company or subsidiary, in importing HEDP (as defined above) into the United States from a foreign manufacturer or through its selling agent.
