## Instructions for Reporting by Occupation

- Report employees in the occupations in which they are working, not necessarily in occupations for which they have been trained.
For example: An employee trained as an engineer, but working as a drafter, should be reported as a drafter.
- Report each employee only once in the occupation that requires the highest level of skill if the employee performs work in two or more occupations. If there is no measurable difference in skill requirements, report employees in the occupation in which they spend the most time.
- Use the description of duties along with the job titles to determine where to place employees. Do not rely on job titles alone.
- Report apprentices and trainees in the job for which they are being trained. Report helpers separately because they are not in training for the occupation they are helping.
