Instructions for Reporting by Occupation

 Report employees in the occupations in which they are working, not necessarily in occupations for which they have been trained.

For example: An employee trained as an engineer, but working as a drafter, should be reported as a drafter.

- Report each employee only once in the occupation that requires the highest level of skill if the employee performs work in two or more occupations. If there is no measurable difference in skill requirements, report employees in the occupation in which they spend the **most** time.
