

### Attachment 3: EXAMPLE from PREVIOUS Study Welcome Screen

This example screenshot from the welcome screen of a **previous** OMB-approved study conducted during initial development of the IRT-CAT Instruments demonstrates how the welcome screen for phases 2 and 3 of this Calibration Study will appear to respondents. They will be provided with a brief introduction to the Functional Assessment Battery (IRT-CAT Instrument) and current OMB Control Number and contact information. This is the first screen that will appear when a participant attempts to complete the instrument. A select number of questions (from the list provided in Attachment 2) will then be asked of the respondents. It is estimated that completion of an IRT-CAT instrument will take no more than 15 minutes, with the average respondent being asked fewer than 10 questions.

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Functional Assessment Profile

**Introduction**

The Functional Assessment Profile is intended to measure self-reported functioning in the areas of Physical and Behavioral health. The Physical Function CAT includes items covering four content areas: Changing and Maintaining Body Position, Whole Body Mobility, Upper Body Function and Upper Extremity Fine Motor. The Behavioral Health Function CAT includes items covering four content areas: Social Interactions, Behavioral Control, Mood and Emotions and Self-Efficacy. The Functional Assessment Profile works by choosing the questions that best fit your functional level based on your answers to previous questions. Each area (Physical and Behavioral health function) takes a few minutes to complete. For the purposes of this demonstration when you have completed all the questions a score report will be generated to show how your scores in each content area compare to our claimant sample ("Claimant Based T-Score") and to the general public ("Normative Based T-Score").
