GENERAL BORROWER CERTIFICATIONS

I. ASSURANCE AGREEMENT (TITLE VI, CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964)

C. The obligations of this agreement shall continue:

The contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by USDA, advising the said labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this agreement as required pursuant to section 202(3) of Executive Order 11246, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- 4. The contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 and with all rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor, and of any prior authority which remain in effect.
- 5. The contractor shall furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246, rules, regulations, and orders or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by USDA, the Office of Civil Rights, and the Secretary for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- 6. Monthly Employment Utilization Report, Form CC-257, as required and such other information as may be required for the supervision of such compliance, and to otherwise assist the USDA in the discharge of its primary responsibility for securing compliance.

- F. To refrain from entering into any contract or extension or other modification of a contract, subject to such Executive Order with a contractor debarred from Government contracts or Federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to part 11, subpart D, of such Executive Order or to prior authority; and to carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the provisions of the Equal Opportunity Clause as may be imposed upon contractors and subcontractors by the USDA or the Secretary pursuant to such subpart D.
