Introduction

Hello, my name is ______, and I work for the Census Bureau. Thank you for agreeing to participate in our study. Let me start by telling you a little about what we will be doing today. The U.S. Census Bureau counts the population in the United States and also conducts various kinds of surveys. Today we will be trying out some new questions for one of these surveys called the American Community Survey, or the ACS.

Before questions are added to surveys, it's important to try out questions with the help of people such as yourself. It is important that the questions make sense, are easy to answer, and that everyone understands the questions the same way.

If you agree to take part in this study, I will ask you to answer the questions as if they were a part of the ACS. I am interested in your answers, but I am also interested in the process you go through in your mind when you answer the questions. I will ask you some questions about your answers, or about the questions themselves. There are no right or wrong answers. Our purpose is not to compile information about you. Instead, your interview, along with those of others, will show us how to improve these questions for the survey.

Your participation in this interview is voluntary, and you may decline to answer any question at any time.

Please ask me any questions you have about this document. Once you have finished reading the document, please sign and date it.

ALL RESPONDENTS
