### TITLE OF INFORMATION COLLECTION:

2018 Public Health and Preparedness Webinar Learner Feedback Survey

#### **PURPOSE:**

The fourteen basic-intermediate level webinars produced by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Division of Laboratory Systems during October 1, 2017 – September 30, 2018 provide educational content relevant to laboratory scientists working in hospitals, reference laboratories, universities and public health laboratory settings. These one-hour long programs are free of charge, hosted on CDC TRAIN, offer 1.0 contact hour of ASCLS P.A.C.E.® credit, and are available in two formats: as a live broadcast and then in an archived (recorded) format available for one year after the broadcast date. Multiple webinar topics provide relevant information to the same audience; consequently, many laboratory scientists complete more than one webinar annually. Webinar topics are grouped into two broad categories:
