Items that are required by one or more subsystems are <u>underlined</u>. Items that are always optional in all subsystems are in normal type.

Reporter Credentials/Profile

<u>Names</u>, <u>Device Account Name</u>, <u>PL User Name</u>, <u>PL User Password</u>, <u>PL User Category/Role</u>, <u>Email</u> <u>Address</u>, Preferred Language, Phone Numbers, Social Media Link/Avatar.

Reported Person

Record and Context <u>Record IDs</u>, <u>Hospital or Organization ID/Names</u>, <u>Disaster Event ID/Name</u>, Disaster Nominal Geolocation.

Date/Times:

When reported at source, sent, received, updated, expired.

Media Items:

Photographs (or URL to photo, ID of photo), Voice Note, Social Media URL.

Structured Text Items (or checkboxes, enumerated choices):

<u>Names</u>, <u>Health & Missing/Found Status</u>, <u>Hospital Triage Status</u>, Approximate Address, Gender, Birthday/Age/Age Range/Age Group, Skin Color, Hair Color, Eye Color, Height, Weight, Race, Religion, Caption (for photo), Speaker (for voice note).

Free Text Items:

Last Known Location, Distinctive Features, Last Seen Clothing/Appearance, General Notes/Comments (including by others than original reporter).

Reporting Organization/Hospital

<u>IDs</u>, <u>Long Name</u>, <u>Short Name</u>, <u>Patient ID Format (and other data-entry policies)</u>, Address, Phone, Fax, Email, Web Address, Facility Geolocation, Icon, Legal Statements

Glossary of Abbreviations and Acronyms

ID. Identifier, some unique string of characters, typically constrained to a particular format.

IP. Internet Protocol, as in "IP Address".

OS. Operating System.

PL. NLM's "PEOPLE LOCATOR[®]" Web site.

URI. Unique Resource Identifier, e.g., URL, email address, repository name.

URL. Unique Resource Locator, e.g., Web site address.
