


Active ingredient (in each XX) Naloxone hydrochloride X mg.....	Purpose Temporarily reverses opioid overdose
Uses	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ if you are in an opioid overdose emergency situation right now, skip to Directions ■ use for temporary emergency treatment of opioid overdose ■ see Directions for the signs of opioid overdose ■ opioids include heroin and some other street drugs, methadone, and many prescription pain medicines ■ always CALL 911 if you think someone has an opioid overdose

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ the effect of naloxone is temporary. CALL 911 immediately (see Directions).

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ if you are not in an opioid overdose emergency situation right now, read all the information in this package, so that you know what to do when an opioid emergency situation occurs. 	
 <p>1</p>	<p>Directions</p> <p>1. If you think a person used opioids, and the person will not wake up, or is very sleepy and not breathing well, these are signs of an opioid overdose.</p> <p>Do these things to see if the person will respond:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ yell "Wake up!" ■ shake the person gently ■ rub your knuckles hard on the middle of their chest. ▼
	<p>2. If the person is still not awake, give one dose of naloxone immediately. (**Add 1-sentence statement of how to use; product-dependent**).</p>
	<p>3. ALWAYS CALL 911!</p>
	<p>4. ■ 2-3 minutes after the first naloxone dose, give a second dose if the person is not fully awake.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ If available, give another dose every 2-3 minutes if the person is not fully awake.
	 <p>5</p> <p>5. Stay with the person until emergency personnel arrive, even if the person wakes up. The naloxone might wear off before the opioid wears off.</p>
