1 Introduction

This document presents the user guide for the Office of Pollution Prevention and Toxics (OPPT) Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms application submission process. This document is the user guide for the Primary Support user of the Section 5 Notices and Supports application.

The Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms application is the electronic, web-based tool provided by Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for the submission of Section 5 Notices and Supports data. As a Primary Support, you can modify a Section 5 Notices and Supports form that a Primary Authorized Official (AO) has assigned to you.

2 System Requirements

To use the Section 5 Notices and Supports application to submit a Section 5 Notices and Supports form, the following are required:

- An e-mail account
- JavaScript enabled web browser
- Internet access
- Adobe Acrobat Reader 5.0 or higher
- CDX username and password

2.2 Screen Resolution

- Screen resolution should be set to 1024 x 768 or greater.

3 Primary Support Functions

This section describes how to:

- Access the application
- Navigate the Section 5 Notices and Supports ‘Home’ screen
- Edit the Section 5 Notices and Supports forms – Premanufacture Notice (PMN), Biotechnology, Notice of Commencement (NOC), Support, Bona Fide, and Alternative Control Measures (ACM) 721.30
- Upload an Extensible Markup Language (XML) file

The Primary Support is designated by a Primary AO to provide supporting information on behalf of a company. A Primary Support may either work on behalf of a United States (U.S.)-based company or non-U.S. based company. Examples of a Primary Support may include, but are not limited to, a corporate on-site contact, a technical contact, a paid employee of the company, an outside consultant for the company, or an authorized representative agent for the company. Primary Supports do not have the ability to sign the certification statement required for a form, but they may enter or modify data for a form for which they have access. The Primary Support does not have access rights to create or submit a form.

Once the Primary AO creates a new form, the Primary AO will provide the Primary Support with the passphrase to access the form and complete all sections of the form. The Primary Support can edit a form that is created by the Primary AO. The Primary Support can only access forms to which the Primary AO has granted access.

The system will allow the Primary Support to save a form at any point during the data entry process. The save functionality allows you to return to a form at any point in the future. After the Primary Support completes a form, the Primary AO will access, review, and submit the form to EPA via CDX.

3.1 Log into Section 5 Notices and Supports Application

After you create an account in CDX and click the ‘Primary Support’ link for the Chemical Safety and Pesticide Programs (CSPP) data flow, you will be taken to the ‘Chemical Information Submission System’ screen.

Section 5 of TSCA, EPA's New Chemicals Program, helps manage the potential risk to human health and the environment from chemicals prior to entry to the marketplace. Anyone who plans to manufacture or import a new chemical substance (i.e. one not listed on the TSCA inventory) for a non-exempt commercial purpose is required by Section 5 of TSCA to provide EPA with notice before initiating the activity. A Premanufacture Notice, or PMN, must be submitted at least 90 days prior to the manufacture or import of the chemical. Additional notice types which use the PMN form are listed to reflect different circumstances under which a chemical may be manufactured or imported such as Significant New Use Notices (SNUN), Low Volume Exemptions (LVE), Test Market Exemption Applications (TMEA), and Low Volume and Low Release Exemptions (LoREX). Biotechnology notice forms will be used to submit Microbial Commercial Activity Notices (MCAN), TSCA Experimental Release Applications (TERA), Tier 1 Exemptions, Tier 2 Exemptions, and Biotechnology Test Market Exemption Applications (Biotechnology TMEA). For a PMN or MCAN, the manufacturing or importing company must also notify EPA via a Notice of Commencement within 30 days after the start of the first manufacture or import of the chemical for non-exempt commercial purposes.

Please note: The public reporting and recordkeeping burden for this collection of information is estimated to average 93 hours per response for PMN, SNUN, LVE, and LOREX applications (TMEA is estimated to average 88 hours per response), including time for reviewing instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and completing and reviewing the collection of information. The public reporting and recordkeeping burden for this collection of information is estimated to average 290 hours per response for MCAN applications and the NOC is estimated to average 0.8 hours per response. Send comments on the Agency's need for this information, the accuracy of the provided burden estimates, and any suggested methods for minimizing respondent burden, including through the use of automated collection techniques to the Director, Collection Strategies Division, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (2822T), 1200 Pennsylvania Ave., NW, Washington, D.C. 20460. Include the OMB control number in any correspondence. Do not send the completed EPA Form 7710-25 (PMN) or Form 6300-14 (Biotechnology) or Form 7710-56 (NOC) to this address.

The software includes submission forms, embedded help files and a downloadable user manual to guide you through the Section 5 Notices and Supports submission process. Click OK to complete a Section 5 Notices and Supports reporting form, using the Section 5 Notices and Supports software. If you are not reporting on Section 5 Notices and Supports, please select a different application in the drop-down menu.

Navigation: To access the Section 5 Notices and Supports ‘Home’ screen, select ‘TSCA Section 5 Notices and Supports – ePMN’ from the submission type drop-down menu and click the ‘OK’ button.

3.2 Home Screen Navigation

You can access the Section 5 Notices and Supports ‘Home’ screen by selecting ‘TSCA Section 5 Notices and Supports – ePMN’ from the submission type drop-down menu on the ‘Chemical Information Submission System’ screen and clicking the ‘OK’ button.

The Section 5 Notices and Supports ‘Home’ screen is the first screen within the Section 5 Notices and Supports application. It provides you with links and tabs to access the ‘Section 5

Notices and Supports Forms’ and ‘Resources’ screens. To navigate to either of these screens, click the screen link (highlighted in blue text), or click the screen tab (located within the application header). The links and tabs provide the same functionality.

There is a ten (10) minute logout timer for this application; the application will automatically log you out after ten minutes of inactivity and navigate you back to the CDX login screen.

- **Forms:** Click the ‘Forms’ link or tab to navigate to the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen. You can access Section 5 Notices and Supports forms using the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen. For additional details about the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen, please refer to **Section 3.3**.
- **Resources:** Click the ‘Resources’ link or tab to navigate to the ‘Resources’ screen. You can find the Section 5 Notices and Supports user guide, as well as useful links for guidance documents on the ‘Resources’ screen. For additional details about the ‘Resources’ screen, please refer to **Section 12**.

Navigation: Click the ‘Forms’ link or tab to access the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen.

3.3 Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms

You can access the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen by clicking the ‘Forms’ link from the Section 5 Notices and Supports ‘Home’ screen, or by clicking the ‘Forms’ tab located within the application header.

Only one Section 5 Notices and Supports form is created per form alias, which helps differentiate between forms. Each column within the table of the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen can be sorted by clicking the individual column headers.

Edit an ‘In Progress’ Form: To modify an existing Section 5 Notices and Supports form, click the alias link for a form that has a status of ‘In Progress.’ You are required to enter the passphrase created by the AO and associated with that particular form to access and edit the form. Refer to **Section 3.4** for further instructions on viewing and modifying a form that is ‘In Progress.’

The ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen displays the following columns of information:

- **Alias:** Displays the form alias provided on the ‘General Form Information’ screen within a PMN, Biotechnology, NOC, or Support form; the ‘General Document Information’ screen within a Bona Fide Notice; or ‘Contact Information’ screen within an ACM form. The ‘Alias’ column will display a default alias comprised of a form type, date stamp, and time stamp in the following format: <Form Type-YYYYMMDD-HH:MM:SS Time Zone> if you accept the system-generated ‘Form Alias’ on the first screen in a Section 5 Notices and Supports form. A form alias is helpful when a user or company has multiple forms and/or when you must differentiate between forms.
- **Type:** Displays the form type pertaining to the reported chemical substance or mixture. This column can contain the following values: ‘Primary PMN,’ ‘Biotechnology,’ ‘Support,’ ‘NOC,’ ‘Bona Fide,’ or ‘ACM.’
- **Subtype:** Displays the form subtype pertaining to the form type for the reported chemical substance or mixture.
 - This column contains one of the following values for a PMN form: ‘MOCK_SUBMISSION,’ ‘LOREX_MODIFICATION,’ (Low Release/Low Exposure Exemption Modification) ‘LVE_MODIFICATION,’ (Low Volume Exemption Modification) ‘LOREX,’ ‘LVE,’ ‘TMEA,’ (Test Marketing Exemption Application) ‘SNUN,’ (Significant New Use Notice) or ‘PMN.’
 - This column contains the following values for a Biotechnology form: ‘MCAN,’ (Microbial Commercial Activity Notice) ‘TERA,’ (TSCA Experimental Release Application) ‘TIER1,’ ‘TIER2,’ or ‘Biotechnology_TME’ (Biotechnology Test Market Exemption).
 - This column contains the following values for a Support form: ‘Amendment,’ ‘TestData,’ ‘TransferOfOwnership,’ ‘WithdrawalRequest,’ ‘SuspensionRequest,’ or ‘OtherCorrespondence.’
 - NOC forms, ACM forms, and Bona Fide Notices do not have subtypes.
- **Case Number:** Displays the form case number pertaining to the reported chemical substance or mixture after EPA receives the submission. In all cases, the ‘XX’ represents the fiscal year in which the form was submitted, and the ‘XXXX’ represents the order in which the form was received. A consolidated submission will generate sequential case numbers for each chemical identified within the form and will display all case numbers associated with that specific form. If the form has not been submitted and received, the ‘Case Number’ field remains blank.

- A PMN submission can have the following case number formats: P-XX-XXXX for PMN, SN-XX-XXXX for SNUN, L-XX-XXXX for LVE, LM-XX-XXXX for LVE Modifications, X-XX-XXXX for LOREX, XM-XX-XXXX for LOREX Modifications, T-XX-XXXX for TMEA, and I-XX-XXXX for Mock PMN notice types.
- A Biotechnology form can have the following case number formats: J-XX-XXXX for MCAN, R-XX-XXXX for TERA, G-XX-XXXX for Tier I Exemption, and H-XX-XXXX for Tier II.
- Bona Fide forms will have a case number format of BF-XX-XXXX.
- ACM forms will have a case number format of ACM-XX-XXXX.
- NOC and Support forms will display user-specified case numbers.
- **Status:** Displays the status of the Section 5 Notices and Supports form. The values will display as either 'In Progress' or 'Submitted.'
- **Modify Date:** Displays the date the form was last modified.
- **Submission Date:** Displays the date the form was submitted to EPA via CDX. This date populates only after the form has been submitted.
- **Export Options:** Displays 'CSV,' 'Excel,' 'XML,' and 'PDF' links for you to export the 'Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms' screen in one of the specified formats as an Excel spreadsheet, Comma-Separated Values (CSV), Extensible Markup Language, or Portable Document Format (PDF). The export options section will not display until a form is created.

Navigation: Click the alias link in the ‘Alias’ column of an ‘In Progress’ form to navigate to the ‘Enter Passphrase’ screen.

3.4 Enter Passphrase

To edit a form click the ‘Alias’ link for a Section 5 Notices and Supports form with a status of ‘In Progress’ on the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen. The ‘Enter Passphrase’ screen requires you to enter the passphrase that is associated with the form.

Enter Passphrase: Enter the passphrase supplied by the Primary AO that was originally associated with the form.

Exhibit 3-5 shows a screen capture of the ‘Enter Passphrase’ screen:

Navigation: Enter the passphrase that the Primary AO originally created and associated with the form and click the ‘Next’ button to navigate to the ‘General Form Information’ screen in a PMN, Biotechnology, NOC, or Support form. Click the ‘Next’ button to navigate to the ‘General Document Information’ screen in a Bona Fide form. Click the ‘Next’ button to navigate to the ‘Contact Information’ screen in an ACM form.

3.5 Navigation Tree

The navigation tree is located on the left-hand side of each screen. It allows you to navigate between the various screens within the application and the different sections of the form. You can perform the following functions using the navigation tree:

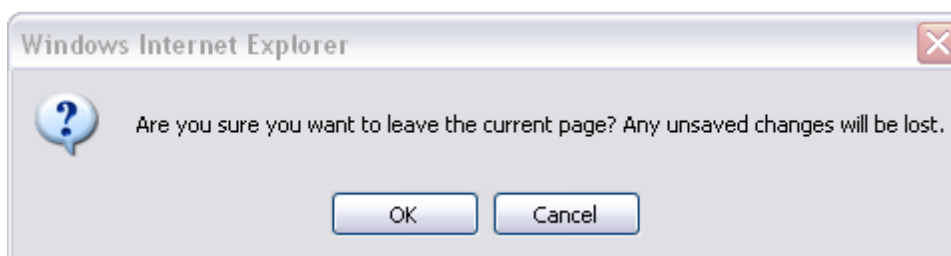
- **Open and close the navigation tree:** A navigation arrow that opens and closes the navigation tree is located to the right of the navigation tree to provide more visual form space. Click the arrow (◀) on the open navigation tree to close the navigation tree and increase the space of the form content. Likewise, click the arrow (▶) on the closed navigation tree to open the navigation tree.
- **Collapse and Expand folders:** Each section of the form falls under a collapsible folder within the navigation tree which allows you to save space or easily view items in the navigation tree. When a folder is expanded, you can click the minus sign (-), the ‘Folder’ icon (📁), or the folder title link to collapse that section of the navigation tree. When a folder is collapsed, you can click the plus sign (+), the ‘Folder’ icon (📁), or the folder title link to

expand that section of the navigation tree. When you place your cursor over a folder title link, it will highlight in red.

- **Navigate between screens:** You can use the navigation tree to navigate between the various screens within the application and the different sections of the form. Each section of the form is denoted with a 'Form' icon (📄). You can click a 'Form' icon (📄) or a section title link to navigate between screens. You are required to save all information entered on a particular screen before navigating to the next screen or all entered information will be lost. A prompt will appear after you click a link in the navigation tree indicating, 'Are you sure you want to leave the current page? Any unsaved changes will be lost.' If you click the 'OK' button, you will be taken to the requested screen without saving any of the data in the previous screen. If you click the 'Cancel' button, the prompt will close and you will not be taken to the requested screen.

- **Delete chemical folders:** To delete specific chemical folders, a 'Delete' icon (✖) displays at the bottom of each chemical folder within the navigation tree of a PMN form. When a chemical folder is deleted, all information entered within the deleted chemical folder is lost and cannot be retrieved. You can add a new chemical folder by clicking the 'Add Consolidated Chemical' link, and filling in all corresponding data. This delete functionality is not applicable to the Biotechnology, NOC, Support, Bona Fide Notice, or ACM forms, and is unavailable when amending a PMN form.
- **Copy chemical folders:** To copy a specific chemical folder, click the 'Copy' icon (📄) that displays at the bottom of each chemical folder within the navigation tree of a PMN form. When a chemical folder is copied, the chemical name, Chemical Abstracts Service Registry Number (CASRN), and attached documents are removed from the copied chemical. This copy functionality is not applicable to the Biotechnology, NOC, Support, Bona Fide, or ACM forms, and is unavailable when amending a PMN form.
- **Delete 'Submitter Controlled Operations' or 'Operations Controlled By Others' folders:** Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) that displays at the bottom of each 'Submitter Controlled Operations' or 'Operations Controlled by Others' folder within the navigation tree to delete a specific operations folder. When a 'Submitter Controlled Operations' or 'Operations Controlled By Others' folder is deleted, all information entered within the deleted operation is lost and cannot be retrieved. You can add a new 'Submitter Controlled Operations' or 'Operation Controlled By Others' folder by clicking the 'Add Operation' link under the appropriate folder and filling in all corresponding data. The delete functionality is not applicable while a user is navigating on a screen within the 'Operations Controlled by

Others' folder. This delete functionality is not applicable to the Biotechnology, NOC, Support, Bona Fide Notices, or ACM forms.

- **Upload XML:** The system displays an 'Upload XML' button in the navigation tree to allow a user to upload an XML file into a PMN form or joint PMN form, or to export an existing PMN form into an XML file format. A user may also upload eTSCA thick client files into a PMN form. If an XML file is uploaded into an existing form, the contents of that XML file overwrite the contents within the PMN form. For more information about the upload XML functionality, refer to **Section 4.33**.

Please note that in IE 7, the scroll bar within the navigation bar may freeze or portions of the bar may be missing which can prevent you from using the navigation tree. If the scroll bar freezes, click the 'Previous' and 'Next' buttons on a page to navigate, or click other links within the navigation tree to continue within the form.

Exhibit 3-7: Premanufacture Notice Navigation Tree (Scroll 1)

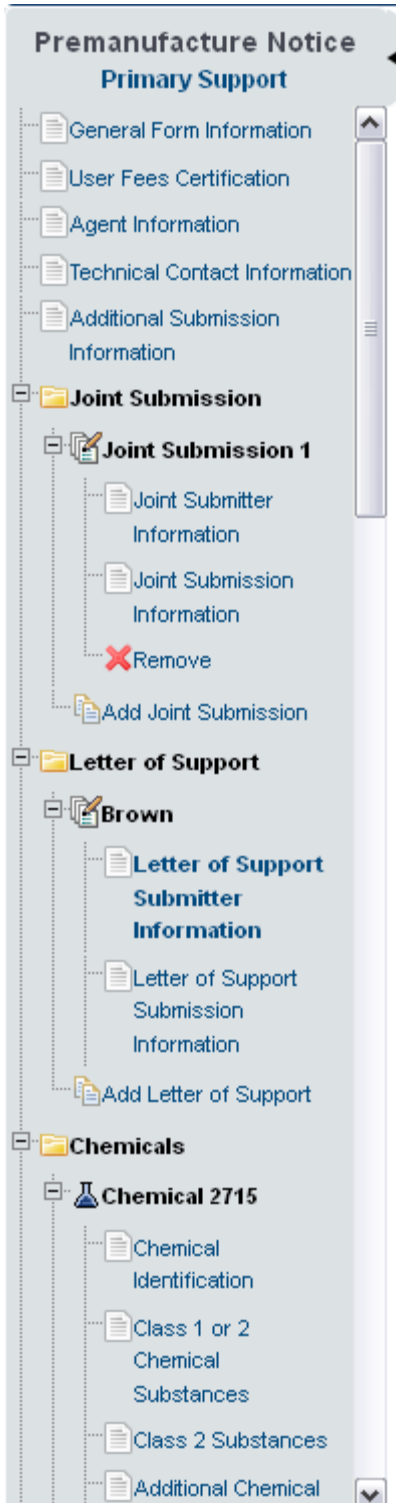

Exhibit 3-8: Premanufacture Notice Navigation Tree (Scroll 2)

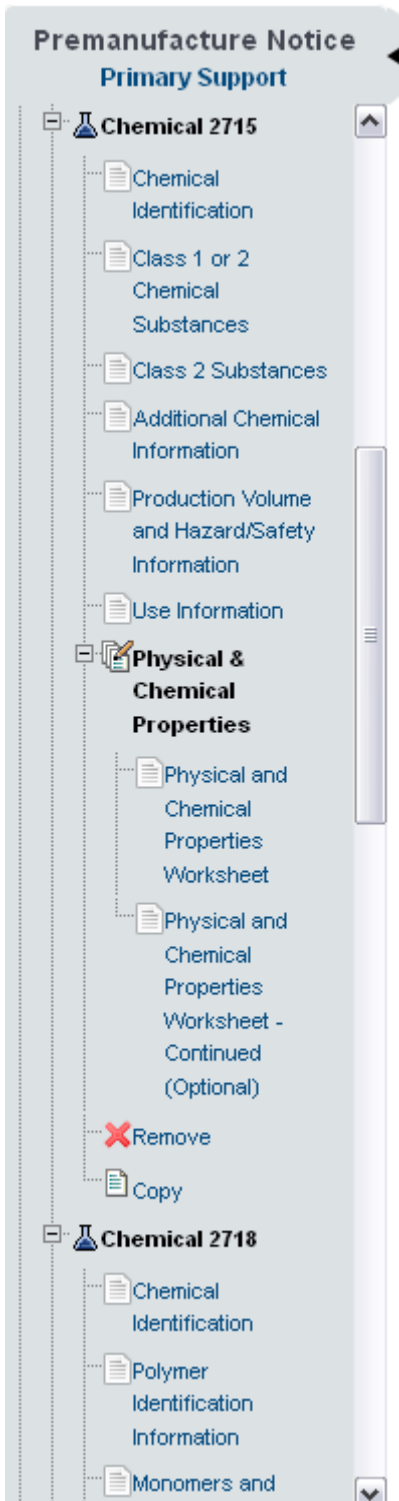


Exhibit 3-9 shows a screen capture of the PMN navigation tree (Scroll 3):

Exhibit 3-9: Premanufacture Notice Navigation Tree (Scroll 3)

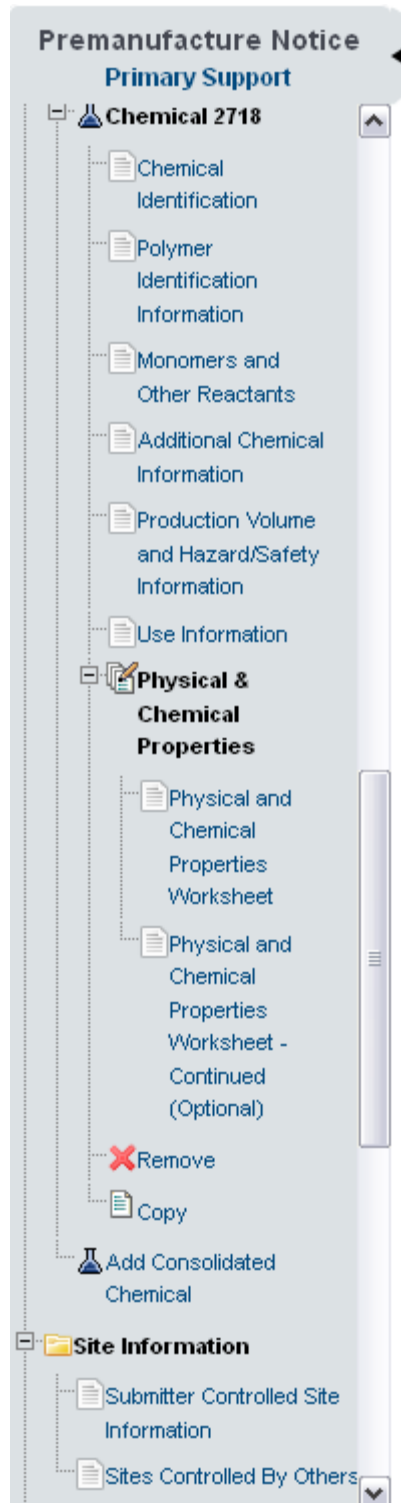


Exhibit 3-10 shows a screen capture of the PMN navigation tree (Scroll 4):

Exhibit 3-10: Premanufacture Notice Navigation Tree (Scroll 4)

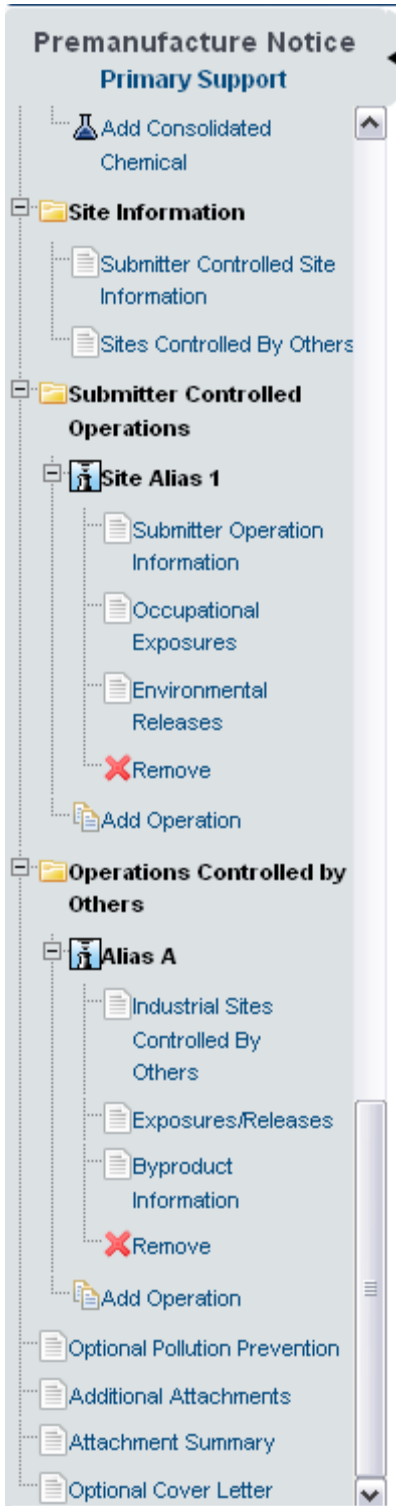


Exhibit 3-11 shows a screen capture of the Biotechnology navigation tree:

Exhibit 3-11: Biotechnology Navigation Tree

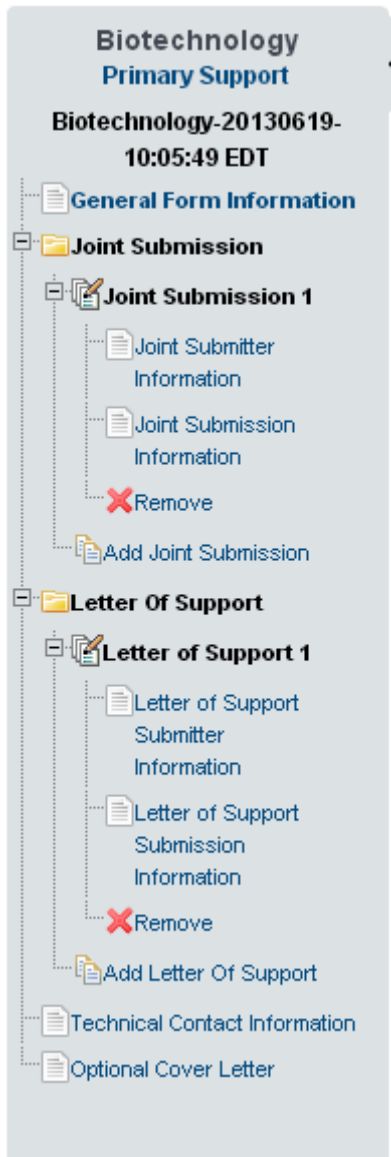


Exhibit 3-12 shows a screen capture of the NOC navigation tree:

Exhibit 3-12: Notice of Commencement (NOC) Navigation Tree

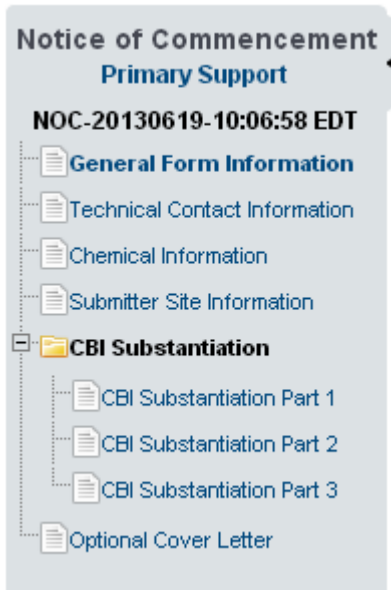

Exhibit 3-14: Bona Fide Navigation Tree (Class 2 Substance)

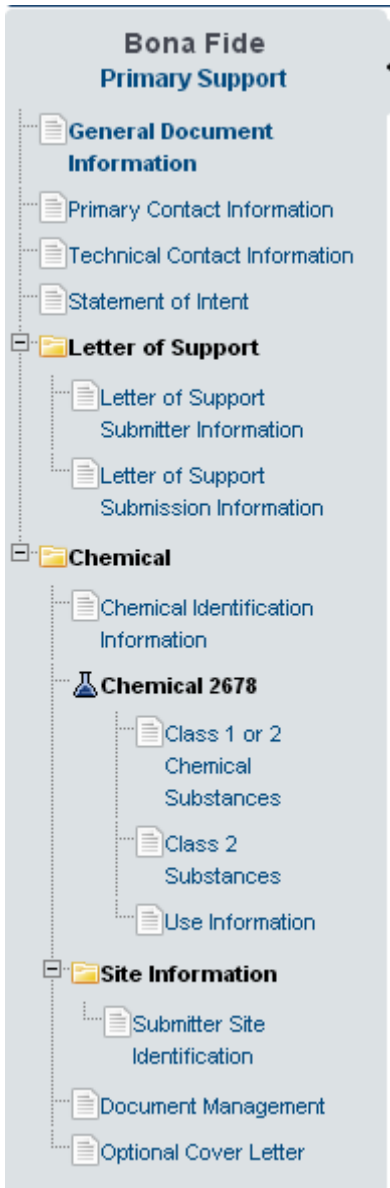


Exhibit 3-15 shows a screen capture of the Bona Fide navigation tree (Polymer):

Exhibit 3-15: Bona Fide Navigation Tree (Polymer)

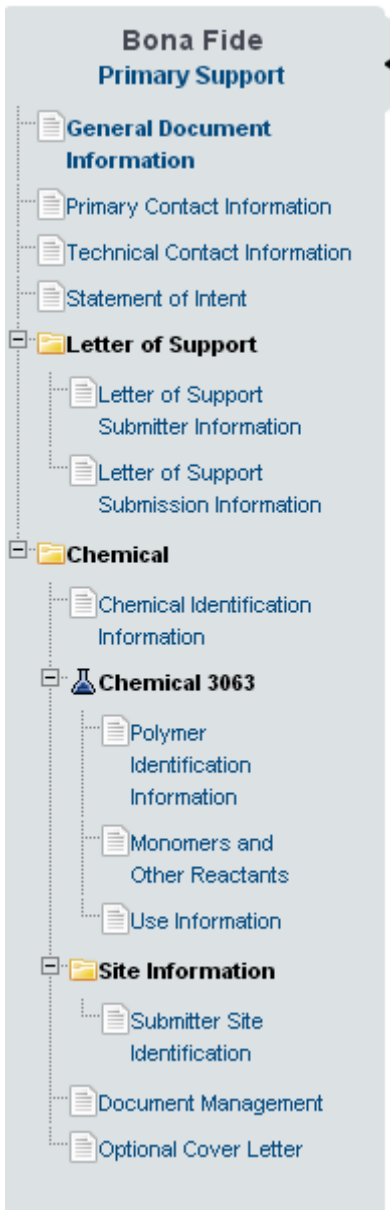


Exhibit 3-16 shows a screen capture of the ACM navigation tree:

Exhibit 3-16: Alternative Control Measures Navigation Tree



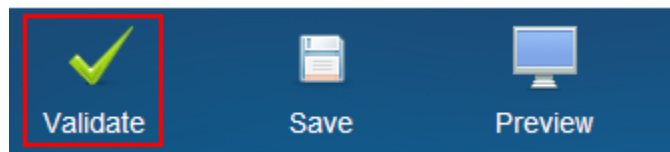
3.6 Action Bar

The action bar is located at the bottom of the form section on each screen. You can perform the following functions using the action bar:

- Validate:** You can click the ‘Validate’ icon (✓) at any stage of completing a Section 5 Notices and Supports form. A ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Validation’ pop-up window generates when you click the ‘Validate’ icon (✓) if you disable the pop-up blocker within your internet browser. The ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Validation’ pop-up window displays a report of all warning messages and validation errors. On screens that display an expandable/collapsible field set, you must click the ‘Save’ button displayed within the expandable/collapsible field set to save the information entered within the field set before the ‘Validate’ functionality initiates. Refer to **Section 11** for more information on validating a form.

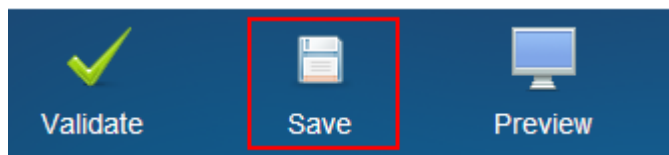

Exhibit 3-17: Action Bar – Validate



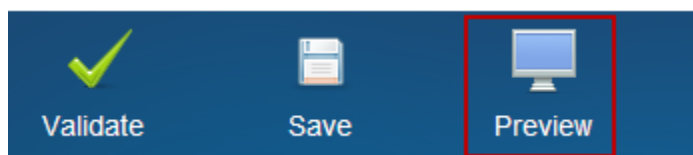
- Save:** Click the ‘Save’ icon (📄) at any stage of completing a Section 5 Notices and Supports form to save the form. To generate and access a links to other pages of the form within the navigation tree, you must click the ‘Save’ icon (📄) within the action bar. After you click the ‘Save’ icon (📄), you will receive a prompt indicating that all data entered in the form has been saved successfully. The save function does not validate any entered data. On screens that display an expandable/collapsible field set, you must click the ‘Save’ button displayed within the expandable/collapsible field set to save the information entered before being able to click the ‘Save’ icon (📄) located within the action bar or use the ‘Previous’ and ‘Next’ buttons to navigate to another page. Click the ‘Previous’ and ‘Next’ buttons on a form to save the data entered within a form. Click the ‘X’ button in the upper right-hand corner of the form in your browser to close the form without saving.

Preview: Click the ‘Preview’ icon (🖥️) at any stage of completing a Section 5 Notices and Supports form to preview the form. After you click the ‘Preview’ icon (🖥️), you will be given the option to view a regular version of the PDF (the confidential business information (CBI) version of the form or the non-CBI version if the form contains no CBI) or a sanitized version of the PDF. Choosing either option will generate and display a watermarked PDF of the form in a separate tab of your internet browser. Please note that attachment header sheets no longer generate within the PDF.

Exhibit 3-19: Action Bar – Preview

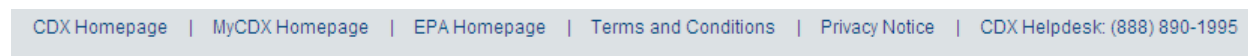

- **Help Links:** You can click the ‘Help’ links, located at the bottom of each screen, at any stage of completing a Section 5 Notices and Supports form.
 - If you click the ‘CDX Homepage’ link, the application takes you to the CDX Homepage.
 - If you click the ‘MyCDX Homepage’ link, the application takes you to the CDX Login screen.
 - If you click the ‘EPA Homepage’ link, the application takes you to the EPA Homepage.
 - If you click the ‘Terms and Conditions’ link, the application takes you to the CDX Terms and Conditions screen.
 - If you click the ‘Privacy Notice’ link, the application takes you to the CDX Privacy and Security Notice screen.

3.7 Attach Documents

The ‘Attach Document’ button displays on various screens within a Section 5 Notices and Supports form, and provides functionality for you to attach supporting documents where needed.

You can access the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window by clicking the ‘Attach Document’ button displayed on a screen. You can attach a file and enter a description, number of pages, and indicate CBI status. There is no limit on the size of the file that can be attached; however, the application prevents a user from uploading an empty document.

The system allows you to claim an uploaded document as CBI. If you claim a document as CBI, the system requires you to upload a sanitized version of the attached document. If you wish to change a CBI attachment to be non-CBI by un-checking the ‘CBI’ checkbox, a warning appears to notify you that un-checking the ‘CBI’ checkbox will delete the sanitized file. If you neglect to populate a required field and click the ‘OK’ button, an error message will display to indicate the missing field and the application will delete the previously attached file.

After you upload a document to be attached, the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window will close and the document’s information will display in a table format on the screen. Depending on the screen, the attachment table may display the section of the page the file is associated with, the file name and file extension of the document, a description of the document, the number of pages in the document, and if the document was claimed CBI. The system allows you to delete unwanted documents by clicking the ‘Delete’ icon (✖) located under the ‘Actions’ column. To view, open, or edit previously attached documents, click the appropriate file name of the document within the ‘File Name’ column of the document table to view previously entered document information.

Please note that in IE 7, the ‘Cancel’ button within the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window disappears and reappears when checking the ‘CBI’ checkbox.

- **Type:** Select the document type of the document that you upload. This drop-down menu contains the following values: ‘Aquatic Ecotoxicity,’ ‘Chemical Structure Diagram,’ ‘Fate,’ ‘GPC,’ ‘Genetic Toxicity,’ ‘Health Toxicity,’ ‘IES Report,’ ‘Safety Datasheet,’ and ‘Terrestrial Ecotoxicity.’ This is a required field.
- **Subtype:** Select the subtype of the document that you upload. This drop-down menu contains the following values, which are grouped under specific document types: ‘Partitioning (e.g., Koc, Kd, Kow, Koa, Henry’s law constant),’ ‘Hydrolysis,’ ‘Fugacity,’ ‘Photolysis,’ ‘Monitoring data (e.g. air, water, soil, biota, human),’ ‘Biodegradation,’ ‘Bioconcentration Factors/Bioaccumulation Factors (BCF/BAF),’ ‘Material Safety Data Sheet/Safety Data Sheet (MSDS/SDS),’ ‘Technical Datasheet,’ ‘Eye Irritation,’ ‘Combined Repeated-Dose/Developmental/Reproductive Toxicity,’ ‘Sensitization,’ ‘Carcinogenicity,’ ‘Repeated-Dose Toxicity,’ ‘Neurotoxicity,’ ‘Acute Toxicity,’ ‘Developmental Toxicity,’ ‘Pharmacokinetics/Metabolism,’ ‘Dermal Irritation,’ ‘Reproductive Toxicity,’ ‘Fish Chronic Toxicity,’ ‘Invertebrate Acute Toxicity,’ ‘Invertebrate Chronic Toxicity,’ ‘Algae Toxicity,’ ‘Fish Acute Toxicity,’ ‘Chromosomal Aberrations Assay,’ ‘Unscheduled DNA Synthesis,’ ‘Genetic Mutation Assay,’ ‘Plant Toxicity,’ ‘Invertebrate Toxicity,’ ‘Avian Toxicity,’ and ‘Other.’ This is a required field when displayed.
- **Attachment:** Click the ‘Browse’ button to generate the ‘File Upload’ window to search for a document on your hard drive. The application prevents the upload of empty documents. The attached file can be one of the following file types: .pdf, .ppt, .pptx, .xls, .xlsx, .doc, .docx, .rtf, .txt, .gif, .jpg, .png, .bpm, .fas, .gbk, or .embl.

- **Description:** Enter a description associated with the attached document. Submitters should not include any CBI information in the document description. This is a required field.
- **Number of Pages:** Enter the number of pages in a document. This is a required field.
- **Check to claim the attachment as CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim the attached document as confidential. Un-checking the ‘CBI’ checkbox for a CBI document generates a warning notifying you that un-checking the CBI claim will delete the sanitized file.
- **Sanitized Attachment:** Click the ‘Browse’ button to generate the ‘File Upload’ window to search for a document on your hard drive. The attached file can be one of the following file types: .pdf, .ppt, .pptx, .xls, .xlsx, .doc, .docx, .rtf, .txt, .gif, .jpg, .png, .bpm, .fas, .gbk, or .embl. For any attached document claimed as CBI, you will be required to attach a sanitized version of the document.
- **Cancel:** Click the ‘Cancel’ button to cancel the attach document process.
- **OK:** Click the ‘OK’ button to attach and link the document uploaded on the ‘Attach Documents’ window to the form. If a field is missing, a warning message will display notifying you that all attachments must be re-attached and the missing field must be populated.

Navigation: Click the ‘Cancel’ button or ‘X’ icon in the upper right-hand corner to cancel the document attachment process. Click the ‘OK’ button to attach the document to the form and navigate back to the original screen from which the document attachment process was initiated.

3.8 Search Substance Registry Services (SRS)

The 'Search SRS' button displays on various screens within a Section 5 Notices and Supports form to identify chemicals that may be stored in SRS.

Search SRS: Click the 'Search SRS' button to generate the 'Search Substance Registry Services' window. You can search for the reported chemical(s) by either the 'Chemical Abstracts Service Registry Number (CASRN)' or 'CA Index Name or Other Synonym.' The application also offers the option of entering user-specified chemical information by clicking the 'Create New Chemical' button. Click the 'Create New Chemical' button to generate the 'Chemical Not Found In Substance Registry Services' window and enter chemical information by filling in the 'Chemical Name' and 'CASRN' (if desired) field under the manual entry field set.

The system allows you to enter each chemical by clicking the 'OK' button located at the bottom of the 'Search SRS' window. Once you enter all known chemical information and click the 'OK' button, the chemical information saves and populates into the chemical description table. The 'Actions' column of the chemical table allows you to delete chemicals that have been added.

The Section 5 Notices and Supports application contains functionality to prevent a user from adding duplicate chemicals within a multi-component submission. Chemicals are checked in the following order:

- If both chemicals have CASRNs, they will be compared.
- If only one chemical has a CASRN, they will not be compared and are considered different.
- If neither chemicals have CASRNs, their chemical names will be compared.

An error message generates within the expandable/collapsible field set if a user attempts to add a duplicate chemical within a multi-component submission.

Please note in IE 7, the CSPP logo might be misaligned in the 'Search Substance Registry Services' window.

- **CASRN:** Enter the CASRN of the chemical. Either the 'CASRN' or 'CA Index Name or Other Synonym' field is required when searching SRS.
- **CA Index Name or Other Synonym:** Enter the chemical abstract '(CA) Index Name or Other Synonym' of the chemical. This field displays the following options: 'Matches Exactly,' 'Contains,' and 'Begins With.' Either the 'CASRN' or 'CA Index Name or Other Synonym' field is required when searching SRS.
- **Search:** Click the 'Search' button to initiate the database search for the CASRN or CA Index Name or Other Synonym for the desired chemical.
- **Create New Chemical:** Click the 'Create New Chemical' button to display the 'Chemical Not Found In Substance Registry Services' pop-up window.

- **CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim the entered chemical as confidential. The ‘CBI’ checkbox will not be displayed on the ‘Chemical Not Found In Substance Registry Services’

window for the 'Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substances,' 'Polymer Identification Information,' or the 'Monomers and Other Reactants' screen.

- **Chemical Name:** Enter the chemical name. This is a required field.
- **CASRN:** Enter the manually entered CASRN, if available.
- **Maximum Percent:** Enter the maximum percentage for the impurity. This field is displayed only in the 'Chemical Not Found In Substance Registry Services' window on the 'Additional Chemical Information' screen.
- **Cancel:** Click the 'Cancel' button to navigate back to the 'Search Substance Registry Services' window.
- **OK:** Click the 'OK' button to enter the manually entered chemical information into the fields on the screen from which the SRS search was initiated.

Click the ‘Cancel’ button to navigate back to the ‘Search SRS’ pop-up window. Click the ‘X’ located in the upper right-hand corner to close the pop-up window and navigate back to the screen from which the SRS search was initiated.

3.9 Add Facility

The 'Add Facility' button displays on the 'Submitter Operation Information' screen and the 'Industrial Sites Controlled By Others' screen within a PMN form. This button also displays on the 'Site Information' screen within a NOC form and the 'Submitter Site Identification' screen within a Bona Fide form. The 'Add Facility' button is used to generate the 'Add Facility' pop-up window and select the applicable sites for which you will be reporting. The 'Add Facility' drop-down menu contains the sites that all AO users within the user's organization are registered for within CDX registration; additional facilities can be added within CDX to further populate this drop-down menu.

If you are not registered to any facilities within CDX registration, or you have finished identifying all possible sites, a message displays within a pop-up window notifying you to add additional sites within your CDX registration profile to add additional sites to a form.

Click the 'Add Facility' button to generate the 'Add Facility' pop-up window which displays the following fields: 'Select a site from the drop-down menu below,' 'CBI,' 'Alias,' 'EPA Registry ID,' 'Facility Name,' 'Facility Address,' 'City,' 'State,' and 'Postal Code.' Each individual site may be claimed as CBI.

- **Select a site from the drop-down menu below:** Select a site from the drop-down menu that you will be reporting on.
- **CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the facility information as confidential.
- **Alias:** Enter the site alias. This is a required field if a Joint Submission or Letter of Support is pending for the form.
- **EPA Registry ID:** Displays the EPA registry ID of the site selected from the drop-down menu.
- **Facility Name:** Displays the name of the site selected from the drop-down menu.
- **Facility Address:** Displays the address of the site selected from the drop-down menu.
- **City:** Displays the city of the site selected from the drop-down menu.
- **State:** Displays the state of the site selected from the drop-down menu.
- **Postal Code:** Displays the postal code of the site selected from the drop-down menu.
- **Add Facility:** Click the button to add the selected site to the main page from which you are initiating the search.
- **Cancel:** Click the button to cancel the process of adding a site.

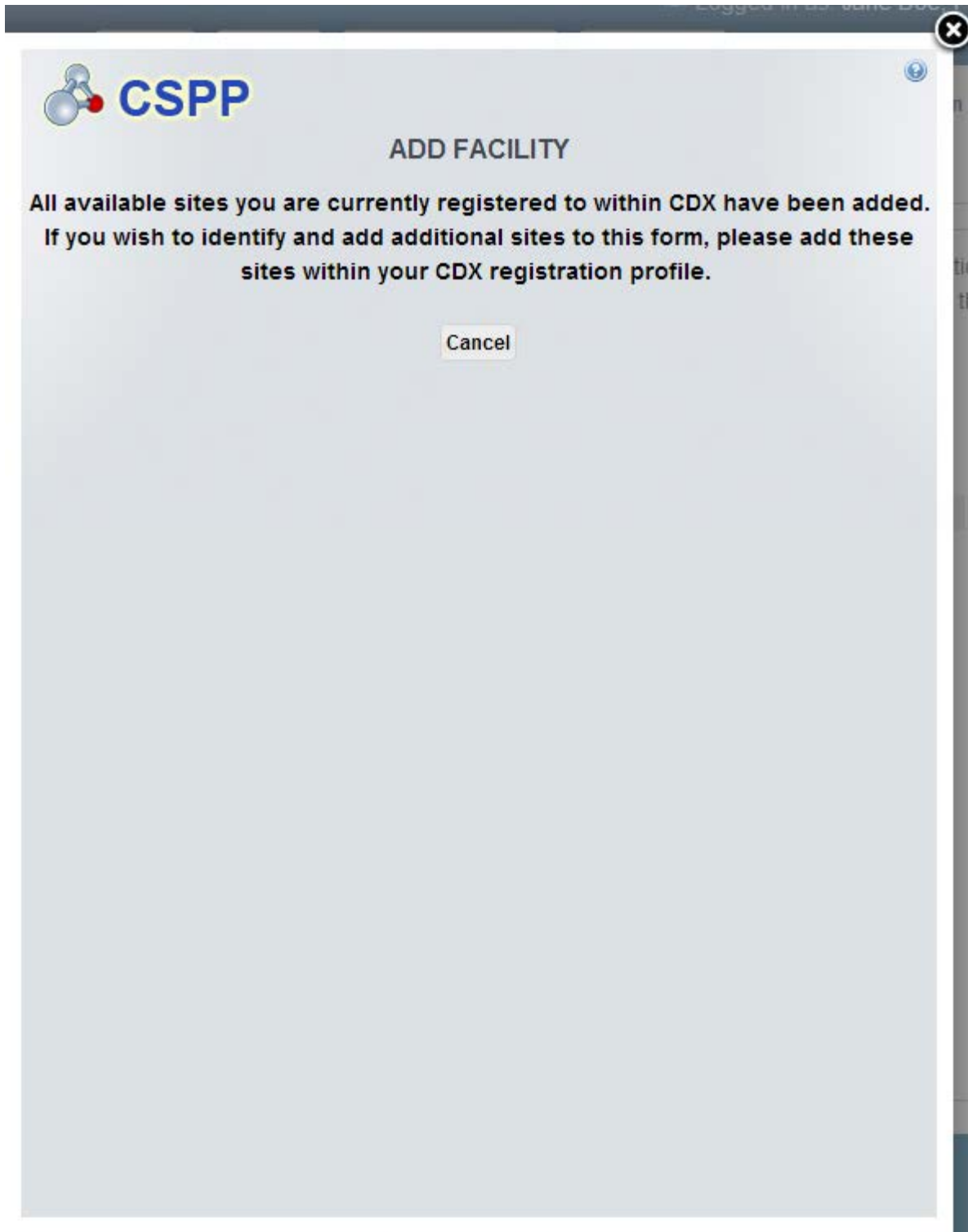


4 Edit Premanufacture Notice (PMN)

Anyone who plans to manufacture or import a new chemical substance for a non-exempt commercial purpose is required by Section 5 of TSCA to provide EPA with notice before initiating the activity, known as a PMN form. A PMN must be submitted at least ninety (90) days prior to the manufacture or import of the chemical.

4.1 Edit PMN Form

To edit a PMN form, navigate to the 'Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms' screen and click the alias link in the 'Alias' column of a form with a status of 'In Progress.' Refer to **Section 3.3** for additional details regarding the 'Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms' screen.

Refer to **Section 3.4** for additional details regarding the enter passphrase process.

4.2 General Form Information

You can navigate to the 'General Form Information' screen by accessing a Section 5 Notices and Supports form that is 'In Progress' and entering the passphrase associated with the selected form.

The 'General Form Information' screen provides fields to input identifying information for a form. You will have the option to assign a 'Form Alias' to identify the form. A unique form alias is helpful when a user or company has multiple forms and/or when you must differentiate between forms to the help desk. Upon navigating to the 'General Form Information' screen, the system auto-generates a default alias comprised of a form type, date stamp and time stamp in the following format: <Form Type-YYYYMMDD-HH:MM:SS Time Zone>.

The application contains the following functionality and may generate additional screens for a PMN form based on the type of notice selected from the 'Type of Notice' drop-down menu on the 'General Form Information' screen:

- If you select 'Premanufacture Notice (PMN)' or 'Significant New Use Notice (SNUN)' from the 'Type of Notice' drop-down menu, the 'Payment ID' and the 'TS Number' fields are required. Click the 'Next' button to navigate to the 'User Fees Certification' screen.
- If you select 'SNUN' from the 'Type of Notice' drop-down menu, it is recommended that a cover letter be provided. Otherwise, a warning message will display during validation of the form.
- If you are not filing a PMN or SNUN, click the 'Next' button to navigate to the 'Agent Information' screen.
- If 'Low Volume Exemption (LVE) @ 40 CFR 723.50(c)(1)' or 'LVE Modification' is selected from the 'Type of Notice' drop-down menu, a 'LVE Certification' screen generates and displays during the submission process. The 'LVE Modification' form type requires only identification of a technical contact, and selection of a 'Manufacture' or 'Import' option.
- If 'Low Release/Low Exposure Exemption (LOREX) @ 40 CFR 723.50(c)(2)' or 'LOREX Modification' is selected from the 'Type of Notice' drop-down menu, a 'LOREX Certification' screen generates and displays during the submission process. The 'LOREX Modification' form type requires only identification of a technical contact, and selection of a 'Manufacture' or 'Import' option.
- If 'Test Marketing Exemption Application (TMEA)' is selected from the 'Type of Notice' drop-down menu, click the 'Next' button to navigate to the 'Agent Information' screen. The

'TMEA' form type requires only identification of a technical contact, and selection of a 'Manufacture' or 'Import' option.

The 'PMN Identification' section provides fields for you to enter information regarding other communications with EPA by entering a 'TS Number' and 'Payment ID.' The TS number is determined by a company and is used to identify the form for both payment and connect related submissions when additional communications (Letters of Support, Joint Submissions, and corrections) are sent before a PMN/LVE case number has been assigned. The TS number can be any six (6) character alphanumeric combination. The TS number should include two (2), three (3), or four (4) letters. Company names, recognizable words, and numeric series are not recommended. A unique identification number for the form will generate later if a Letter of Support or Joint Submission is being filed.

The 'Payment ID' is a user supplied alphanumeric value that corresponds to the method of payment used to submit the user fee (e.g. a check number, a wire transfer number, or a Pay.gov transaction number). The 'Payment ID' is a required field when you are filing a PMN or SNUN.

The 'Test Data' section provides checkboxes to identify data that is included in the notice selected from the 'Type of Notice' drop-down menu. The following values will display as checkboxes: 'Environmental fate data,' 'Health effects data,' 'Environmental effects data,' 'Physical/Chemical properties,' 'Risk assessments,' 'Structure/Activity relationships,' 'Test data not in the possession or control of the submitter,' and 'Other data.'

You are required to submit all test data in your possession or control and to provide a description of all other data known to or reasonably ascertainable by you if the data is related to the health and environmental effects on the manufacture, processing, distribution in commerce, use, or disposal of the new chemical substance. Standard literature citations may be submitted for data in the open scientific literature. Complete test data (written in English), not summaries of data, must be submitted if they do not appear in the open literature. You should clearly identify whether test data is on the substance or on an analog. In addition, the chemical composition of the tested material should be characterized. Data should be submitted according to the requirements of §720.50 of the Premanufacture Notification Rule (40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 720).

The 'Identify whether any of the below options apply' section provides checkboxes for you to indicate how interactions with other companies occur within the form. If the company is filing a Joint Submission, a 'Joint Submission' folder generates within the navigation tree for you to enter information concerning the Joint Submission. A unique identification number will be generated and sent to the joint submitter by the primary submitter and will link the two forms together. You will also be able to indicate that a Letter of Support submitted by a Secondary AO is expected with the original PMN form. You will also be able to indicate that a Letter of Support is expected with the PMN form. The Letter of Support will be submitted by a Secondary AO, with a unique identification number linking the forms.

- **Form Alias:** Displays the form alias created by the Primary AO. This is an editable field that can be modified if necessary. This is a required field.
- **Type of Notice:** Select a value to indicate the type of notice for the PMN form. Valid values include: 'Premanufacture Notice (PMN),' 'Significant New Use Notice (SNUN),' 'Test Marketing Exemption Application (TMEA),' 'Low Volume Exemption (LVE) @ 40 CFR

723.50 (c)(1), 'Low Release/Low Exposure Exemption (LOREX) @ 40 CFR 723.50(c)(2),' 'LVE Modification,' 'LOREX Modification,' and 'Mock Submission.' Select 'PMN' if the application is for a standard, fine-product new chemical substance for placement on the TSCA inventory. Select 'Significant New Use Notice' for any notice that is marked in accordance with a Significant New Use Rule (SNUR). Select 'TMEA' for any notice submitted in accordance with the criteria listed in 40 CFR §720.38. A 'Mock Submission' is an enforcement case where the chemical was manufactured/imported in the past and is not currently being manufactured/imported by the company. This is a required field.

- **TS Number:** Enter the TS number related to the PMN form; this field accepts any six (6) character alphanumeric combination. It is used by the financial institution that receives payment for EPA when it notifies the Agency that the fee has been received. The TS number should include two (2), three (3), or four (4) letters. Company names, recognizable words, and numeric series are not recommended. TS numbers should be unique to the submission and should not be reused in subsequent submissions. This field is required if 'Premanufacture (PMN)' or 'Significant New Use Notice (SNUN)' is selected from the 'Type of Notice' drop-down menu.
- **Payment ID:** The 'Payment ID' can be entered as free text, but refers to a check number, wire transfer number, or a Pay.gov transaction number used to electronically transmit a fee. This field is required if either 'Premanufacture (PMN)' or 'Significant New Use Notice (SNUN)' is selected from the 'Type of Notice' drop-down menu.
- **Environmental fate data:** Check the 'Environmental fate data' checkbox to indicate that the form contains environmental fate data.
- **Health effects data:** Check the 'Health effects data' checkbox to indicate that the form contains health effects data.
- **Environmental effects data:** Check the 'Environmental effects data' checkbox to indicate that the form contains environmental effects data.
- **Physical/Chemical properties:** Check the 'Physical/Chemical properties' checkbox to indicate that the form contains physical/chemical properties data.
- **Test data not in the possession or control of the submitter:** Check the 'Test data not in the possession or control of the submitter' checkbox to indicate that the form contains test data not in the possession or control of the submitter.
- **Risk assessments:** Check the 'Risk assessments' checkbox to indicate that the form contains risk assessments data.
- **Structure/Activity relationships:** Check the 'Structure/Activity relationships' checkbox to indicate that the form contains structure-activity relationships (SAR) data.
- **Other data:** Check the 'Other data' checkbox to indicate that the form contains other types of data.
- **Check here if you are filing a joint PMN:** Check the 'Check here if you are filing a joint PMN' checkbox to indicate that the form is pending a joint PMN form. A 'Joint Submission' folder generates within the navigation tree upon clicking the 'Save' icon located at the bottom of the screen within the action bar or by clicking the 'Next' button on the 'General Form Information' screen.

- **Check here if you have a Letter of Support pending:** Check the ‘Check here if you have a Letter of Support pending’ checkbox to indicate that the form is pending a Letter of Support. A ‘Letter of Support’ folder displays within the navigation tree upon clicking the ‘Save’ icon located at the bottom of the screen within the action bar or by clicking the ‘Next’ button on the ‘General Form Information’ screen.

4.3 User Fees Certification

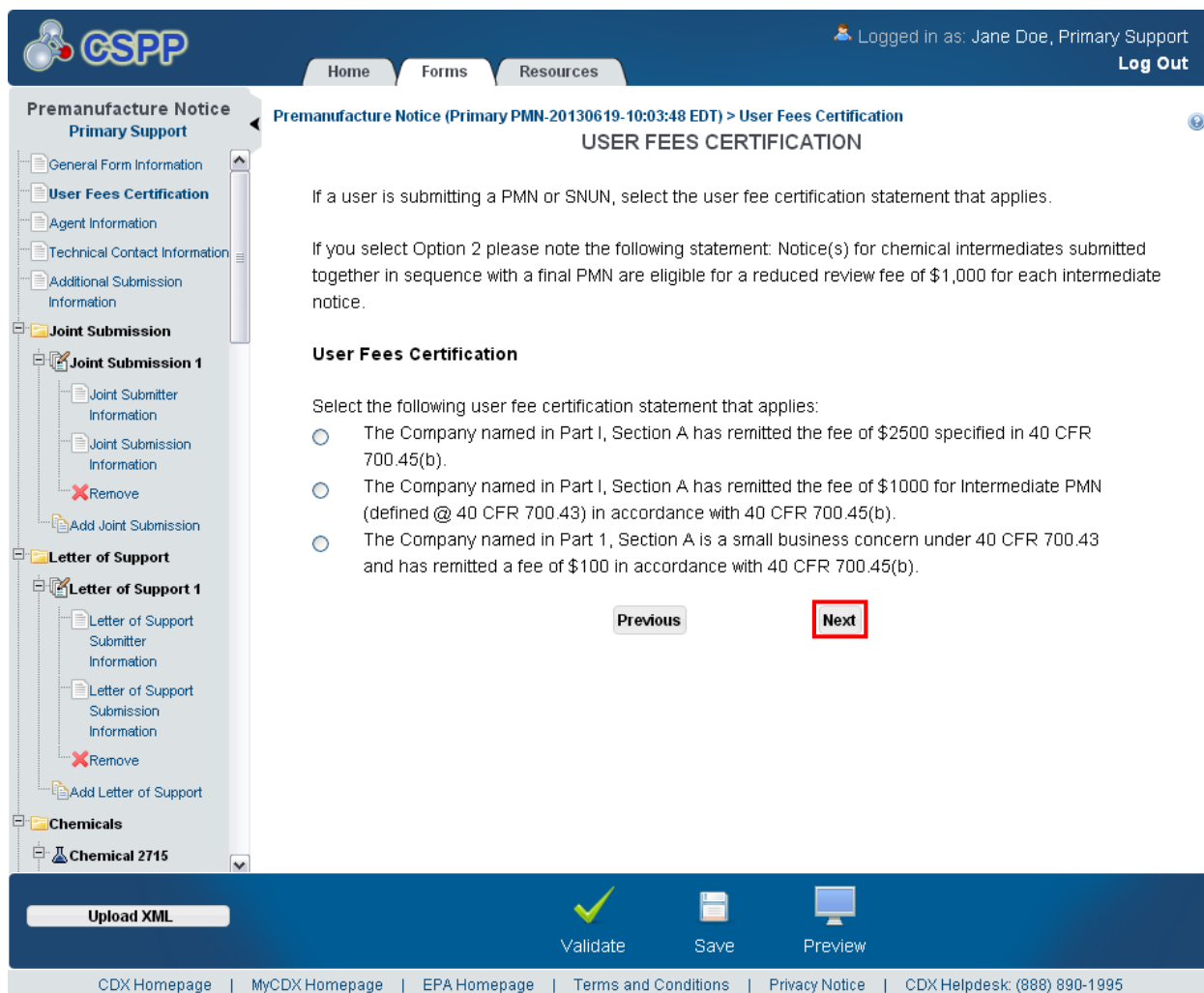
You can access the ‘User Fees Certification’ screen by selecting ‘Premanufacture Notice (PMN)’ or ‘Significant New Use Notice (SNUN)’ from the ‘Type of Notice’ drop-down menu and by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘General Form Information’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘User Fees Certification’ link within the navigation tree.

The purpose of the ‘User Fees Certification’ screen is to inform EPA of how the user fees were paid. You will have three (3) options to select from to notify EPA which user fee was selected. A company will indicate whether ‘\$100’ was submitted for a small business, ‘\$1,000’ was submitted for an intermediate PMN, or ‘\$2,500’ was submitted for a large business. You can find the specifics of which category to file under by reviewing 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Section 700.

- **The Company named in Part 1, Section A has remitted the fee of \$2,500 specified in 40 CFR 700.45(b):** Select this radio button to indicate that you have submitted a user fee in the amount of \$2,500. One of the three user fee options must be selected.
- **The Company named in Part 1, Section A has remitted the fee of \$1,000 for Intermediate PMN (defined @ 40 CFR 700.43) in accordance with 40 CFR 700.45(b):** Select this radio button to indicate that you have submitted a user fee in the amount of \$1,000. One of the three user fee options must be selected.
- **The Company named in Part 1, Section A is a small business concern under 40 CFR 700.43 and has remitted a fee of \$100 in accordance with 40 CFR 700.45(b):** Select this radio button to indicate that you have submitted a user fee in the amount of \$100. One of the three user fee options must be selected.

4.4 Agent Information

You can access the ‘Agent Information’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘General Form Information’ screen if you are not filing a ‘PMN’ or ‘SNUN.’ You can also navigate to this screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘User Fees Certification’ screen if you are filing a ‘PMN’ or ‘SNUN.’ Click the ‘Agent Information’ link within the navigation tree to access this screen.

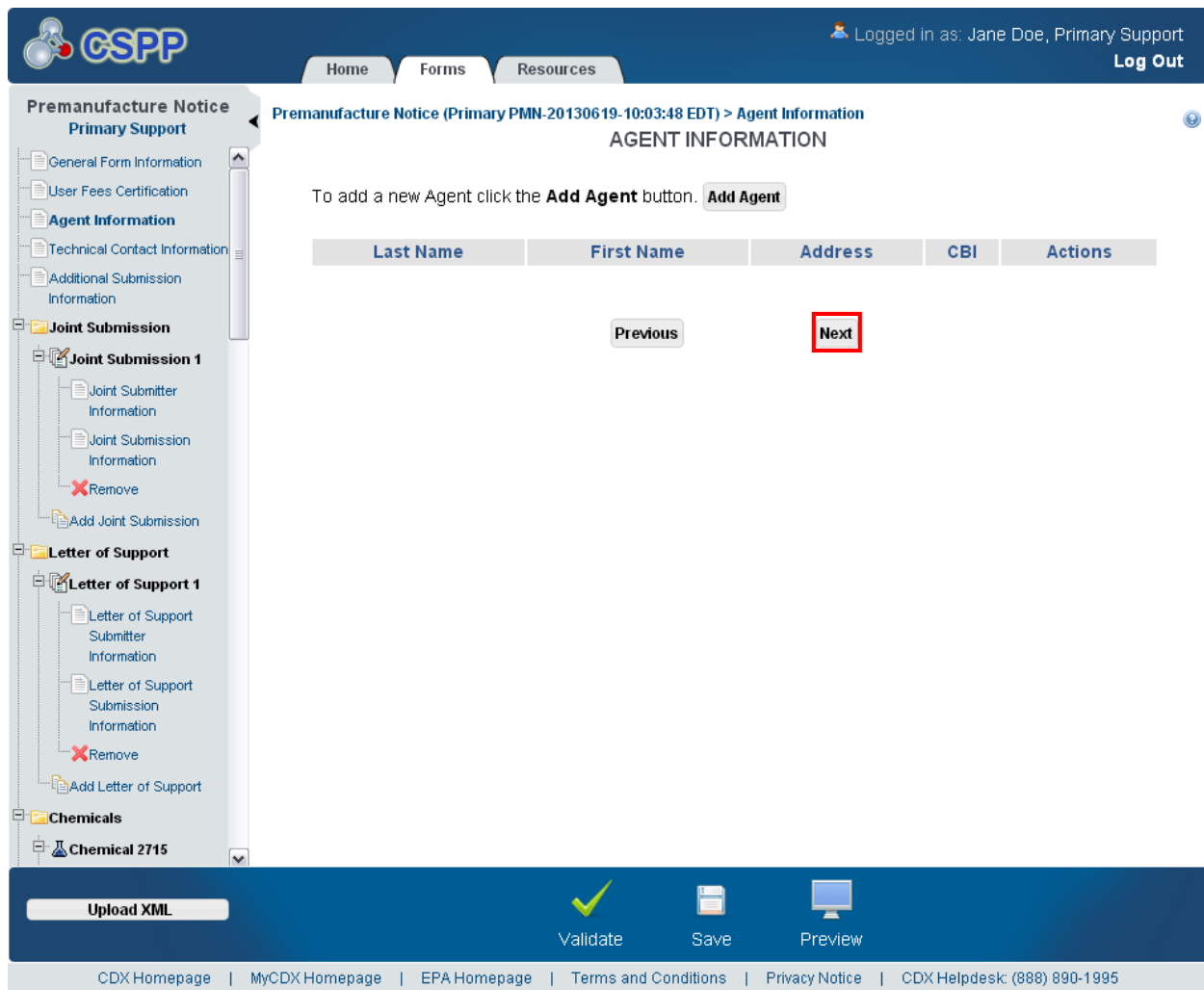
The ‘Agent Information’ screen provides fields for you to enter information regarding all parties involved in representing the PMN form. The agent should be a person who can answer questions about the form. The ‘Agent Information’ screen displays an ‘Add Agent’ button that generates the ‘Add Agent’ pop-up window for you to input the contact information on behalf of whom the

submission is being made. You will be able to enter multiple agents; if the agent is the same individual who is filling out the form, click the 'Copy CDX Registration' button to retrieve user information entered during CDX registration. The system provides a checkbox for you to claim entered contact information as confidential by checking the 'Check here to claim this information as CBI' checkbox. Each agent will have an individual CBI claim. You will be able to enter contact information for each agent, and click the 'OK' button, which will populate the agent table located on the 'Agent Information' screen. Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) located under the 'Actions' column to delete agents. To edit agent information, click the agent name link within the 'Last Name' column, which will generate the 'Add Agent' pop-up window with the previously entered agent information.

- **Add Agent:** Click this button to display the 'Add Agent' pop-up window, which provides fields for you to enter agent contact information.
- **Last Name:** Displays the last name of the reported agent. Click the last name link to edit the agent information.
- **First Name:** Displays the first name of the reported agent.
- **Address:** Displays the address of the reported agent.
- **CBI:** Indicates the CBI status of the agent information by displaying either a 'Y' or an 'N.'
- **Actions:** Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) to delete specific agents. A warning message displays to confirm deletion of the agent information.

- **Check here to claim this information as CBI:** Check the ‘Check here to claim this information as CBI’ checkbox to claim agent information as confidential. If the ‘CBI’ checkbox is checked before clicking the ‘Copy CDX Registration’ button, the ‘CBI’ checkbox will become unchecked upon navigating back to the pop-up window after copying CDX registration information. To claim agent information as confidential, check the ‘CBI’ checkbox after importing CDX registration information.
- **First Name:** Enter the agent’s first name. Click the ‘Copy CDX Registration’ button to populate the fields with CDX registration information. This is a required field.
- **Last Name:** Enter the agent’s last name. Click the ‘Copy CDX Registration’ button to populate the fields with CDX registration information. This is a required field.
- **Position:** Enter the agent’s job title.
- **Company Name:** Enter the agent’s company name. Click the ‘Copy CDX Registration’ button to populate the fields with CDX registration information. This is a required field.
- **Phone Number:** Enter the agent’s daytime phone number: U.S. or international. This field does not allow dashes. Click the ‘Copy CDX Registration’ button to populate the fields with CDX registration information. This is a required field.

- **Email Address:** Enter the agent’s email address. The email address must follow the standard email address format: John.Doe@abc.com. Click the ‘Copy CDX Registration’ button to populate the fields with CDX registration information. This is a required field.
- **Mailing Address 1:** Enter the first line of the agent’s mailing address. Click the ‘Copy CDX Registration’ button to populate the fields with CDX registration information. This is a required field.

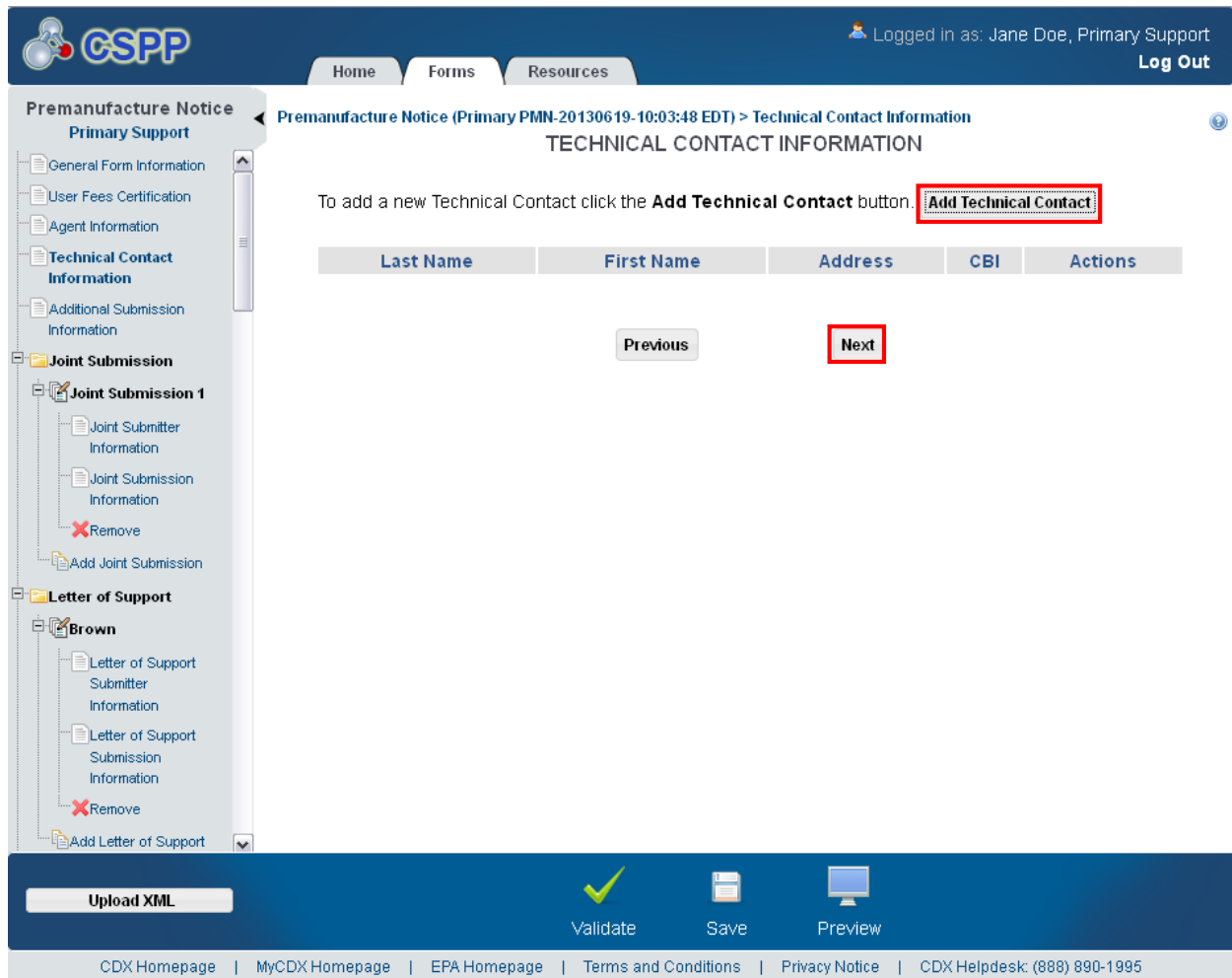
The technical contact should be able to answer, or obtain answers to, questions related to the chemical submitted to EPA within the PMN form. The technical contact does not have to physically work at the site reported on the form, but must be readily available by phone or email. It is required to identify at least one technical contact.

The system provides functionality to enter multiple technical contacts. If the contact is the same person who is filling out the form, the system presents a 'Copy CDX Registration' button for you to retrieve your user information from CDX. You will enter the contact information for each technical contact within the 'Add Technical Contact' window and click the 'OK' button at the bottom of the window, which will populate the technical contacts table located on the screen. Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) located under the 'Actions' column to delete a technical contact. Click the technical contact name within the 'Last Name' column to edit technical contact information.

- **Add Technical Contact:** Click the 'Add Technical Contact' button to generate the 'Add Technical Contact' pop-up window, which provides fields for you to enter technical contact information.
- **Last Name:** Displays the last name of the reported technical contact. Click the 'Last Name' link to edit the technical contact information.
- **First Name:** Displays the first name of the reported technical contact.
- **Address:** Displays the address of the reported technical contact.
- **CBI:** Indicates the CBI status of the technical contact information by displaying either a 'Y' or an 'N.'
- **Actions:** Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) to delete specific technical contacts.



Click the ‘OK’ button to save and populate the entered technical contact information and navigate back to the ‘Technical Contact Information’ screen.

4.6 Additional Submission Information

You can access the ‘Additional Submission Information’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Technical Contact Information’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Additional Submission Information’ link within the navigation tree.

The 'Additional Submission Information' screen gathers information concerning the PMN form that references generic information allowing EPA to set a base point for the project.

The 'Prenotice Communication Number' is a number given to a user during past communication with EPA. The 'Prenotice Communication Number' is required if you are filing a consolidated PMN. EPA must approve all consolidated PMN forms prior to submission. The system will require that you either enter a number into the text field or check the 'None' checkbox. You may declare the number confidential by checking the 'CBI' checkbox.

EPA uses the 'Previously Submitted Notice Number' to link past, current, and future forms. This number allows EPA to associate previous renditions of the current submission in the PMN process. The system will require that you either enter a case number into the text field or check the 'None' checkbox. You may declare the number confidential by checking the 'CBI' checkbox.

The 'Bona Fide Intent Notice Number' is listed to show the company previously contacted EPA to determine whether the chemical in question was previously listed on the TSCA inventory. The system will require that you either enter a number into the text field or check the 'None' checkbox. You may declare the number confidential by checking the 'CBI' checkbox.

On this screen, a company must also declare whether the newly registered chemical will be manufactured or imported. You will have the option to select 'Manufacture' and/or 'Import' and depending on whether the company only intends to do one of the available options, the system provides 'Binding' checkboxes to indicate a binding option. If the 'Manufacture' checkbox is checked, the screens within the 'Submitter Controlled Operations' folder automatically generates.

The binding option demonstrates that you intend to only do the one option selected and would be willing to legally bind to that situation if EPA chooses to regulate that chemical. The purpose of the binding option is to enable EPA (if necessary) to efficiently negotiate with a PMN submitter the development of §5(e) consent orders and promulgate SNUR for those new chemical substances that the Agency determines may present an unreasonable risk if certain control actions are not implemented. This option is intended to reduce delays that can slow the development of consent orders. At one time, SNUR were limited to environmental release activities and certain industrial, commercial, or consumer activities, but now they can include other important activities, such as protection in the workplace and hazard communications. Control measures instituted by the submitter to reduce exposures and/or releases of the substance may have a direct bearing on the Agency's conclusions regarding risk. Therefore, you may wish to indicate your willingness to be bound to certain submitted information on the form, which relates to the issue of potential risk such as use, production volume, protective equipment, engineering controls, and/or process description. By indicating your willingness to make these commitments, you would be indicating an interest in future negotiations if EPA deems them necessary.

Please note that in IE 7, leaving an identification number field blank and clicking the 'Save' icon associated with an identification number does not cause the empty field to turn yellow. In addition, entering identification numbers with incorrect formats into the 'Previously Submitted Notice Number' field does not cause the field to turn yellow.

- **Prenotice Communication Number – None:** Check the ‘None’ checkbox for the ‘Prenotice Communication Number’ to indicate that there is no prenotice communication number. Checking the ‘None’ checkbox removes the ‘Prenotice Communication Number’ fields and associated actions. Un-check the ‘None’ checkbox to re-generate a ‘Prenotice Communication Number’ field and enter a value.
- **Prenotice Communication Number:** Enter the prenotice communication number to associate with a previous contact with EPA. Click the ‘Save’ icon (📁) to save an individual entry. Click the ‘Form’ icon (📄) that displays after saving to edit an individual entry. Click the ‘Delete’ icon (✖) to delete individual entries. Click the ‘Add’ icon (+) to generate blank text fields to provide additional entries. This field is required if a form is a consolidated submission, regardless of whether the ‘None’ checkbox is checked.
- **Prenotice Communication Number – CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim all identified prenotice communication numbers as confidential.
- **Previously Submitted Notice Number – None:** Check the ‘None’ checkbox for the ‘Previously Submitted Notice Number’ to indicate that there is no previously submitted notice number. Checking the ‘None’ checkbox removes the ‘Previously Submitted Notice Number’ fields and associated actions. Un-check the ‘None’ checkbox to re-generate a ‘Previously Submitted Notice Number’ field and enter a value.
- **Previously Submitted Notice Number:** Enter the previously submitted notice number to associate with a previous contact with EPA. Enter this number in a case number format; this value accepts alphanumeric characters and dashes. Click the ‘Save’ icon (📁) to save an individual entry. Click the ‘Form’ icon (📄) that displays after saving to edit an individual entry. Click the ‘Delete’ icon (✖) to delete individual entries. Click the ‘Add’ icon (+) to generate blank text fields to provide additional entries. This field is required, or the ‘None’ checkbox must be checked.
- **Previously Submitted Notice Number – CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim all identified previously submitted notice numbers as confidential.
- **Bona Fide Intent Notice Number – None:** Check the ‘None’ checkbox for the ‘Bona Fide Intent Notice Number’ to indicate that there is no bona fide intent notice number. Checking the ‘None’ checkbox removes the ‘Bona Fide Intent Notice Number’ fields and associated actions. Un-check the ‘None’ checkbox to re-generate a ‘Bona Fide Intent Notice Number’ field and enter a value.
- **Bona Fide Intent Notice Number:** Enter the bona fide intent notice number to associate with a previous contact with EPA. Click the ‘Save’ icon (📁) to save an individual entry. Click the ‘Form’ icon (📄) that displays after saving to edit an individual entry. Click the ‘Delete’ icon (✖) to delete individual entries. Click the ‘Add’ icon (+) to generate blank text fields to provide additional entries. This field is required, or the ‘None’ checkbox must be checked.
- **Bona Fide Intent Notice Number – CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim all identified bona fide intent notice numbers as confidential.
- **Manufacture:** Check the ‘Manufacture’ checkbox to claim the intent to manufacture. The screens within the ‘Submitter Controlled Operations’ folder automatically generate when the ‘Manufacture’ checkbox is checked.

- **Binding:** Check the 'Binding' checkbox to claim intent to manufacture information as binding.
- **Import:** Check the 'Import' checkbox to claim the intent to import.
- **Binding:** Check the 'Binding' checkbox to claim intent to import information as binding.

4.7 Joint Submitter Information

You can access the ‘Joint Submitter Information’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Additional Submission Information’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Joint Submitter Information’ link within the navigation tree. Click the ‘Add Joint Submission’ link within the navigation tree to add an additional joint submitter; a maximum of two joint submitters may be listed in a PMN form.

The ‘Joint Submitter Information’ screen is used to enter contact information regarding the joint submitter that will be submitting separate information regarding the PMN form. The joint submitter will be sent the unique identification number by the Primary AO. The provided email address will be used to send the joint submitter the unique identification number.

- **Check here to claim this information as CBI:** Check the ‘Check here to claim this information as CBI’ checkbox to claim the joint submitter contact information as confidential.
- **First Name:** Enter the joint submitter’s first name. This is a required field.
- **Last Name:** Enter the joint submitter’s last name. This is a required field.
- **Position:** Enter the joint submitter’s job title.
- **Company Name:** Enter the joint submitter’s company name. This is a required field.
- **Phone Number:** Enter the joint submitter’s daytime phone number; U.S. or international. This field does not accept dashes. This is a required field.
- **Phone Extension:** Enter the joint submitter’s U.S. phone number extension if applicable.
- **Email Address:** Enter the joint submitter’s email address. The email address must follow the standard email address format: John.Doe@abc.com. This is not a required field, but is suggested for this contact.

4.8 Joint Submission Information

You can access the ‘Joint Submission Information’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Joint Submitter Information’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Joint Submission Information’ link within the navigation tree.

The ‘Joint Submission Information’ screen is used as a communication point between two companies. The ‘Joint Submission Information’ screen displays fields that capture information that will be passed on to the joint submitter. A text box is used by the Primary AO or Primary

Agent/Consultant to send information to the joint submitter in an unencrypted email. A ‘Unique Identifier for Joint Submissions’ box will also display on this screen. The unique identification number displays when a user declares a joint submission is being established.

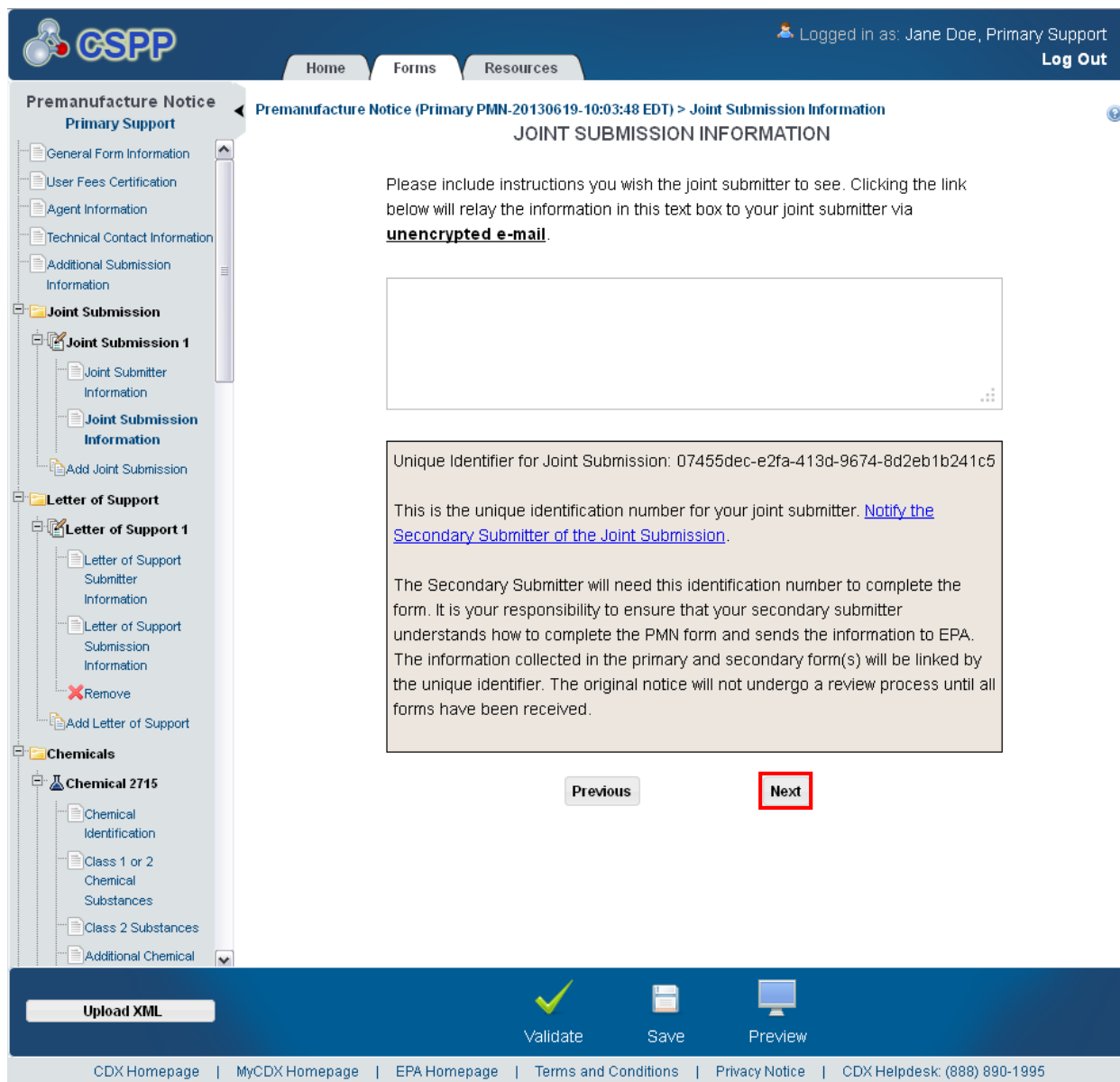
Joint Submission Process: When a Primary AO, Primary Agent/Consultant, or Primary Support designates that a joint submission is being filed, you will be asked to enter contact information for a joint submitter. When the Primary AO or Primary Agent/Consultant navigates to the ‘Joint Submission Information’ screen, the Primary AO or Primary Agent/Consultant can choose to send an email to the joint submitter identified on the ‘Joint Submitter Information’ screen. The email will contain the unique identification number that will link the two forms.

When the joint submitter (Secondary AO or Secondary Agent/Consultant) accesses the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen and creates a new form, the joint submitter will be prompted to enter the unique identification number on the ‘Create Passphrase’ screen. Once the unique identification number has been entered, the system will link the primary and joint forms. The original notice will not undergo a review process until all forms are received.

- **Joint Submission Information Instructions:** Enter the information that the primary submitter is sending to the joint submitter.
- **Joint Submission Informational Text:** Displays instructional text provided by OPPT, the unique identification number automatically generated for the form, and provides functionality to email the unique identification number to the joint submitter by clicking the ‘Notify the Secondary Submitter of the Joint Submission’ link.
- **Unique Identification Number:** The unique identification number is a random, auto-generated number that must be provided to the joint submitter to create a joint submission.

Navigation: Click the ‘Notify the Secondary Submitter of the Joint Submission’ link to access the unique identifier notification pop-up window. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Add Consolidated Chemical’ link within the navigation tree. Click the ‘Next’ button to navigate to the ‘Letter of Support Submitter Information’ screen if you are submitting a Letter of Support. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Letter of Support Submitter Information’ link within the navigation tree. A warning generates on this screen after

clicking the 'Next' or 'Previous' button if you have not sent an email notification to the Joint Submitter.

4.8.1 Notify Joint Submitter of Joint Submission Information

You can access the unique identifier notification window by clicking the 'Notify the Secondary Submitter of the Joint Submission' link from the 'Joint Submission Information' screen.

The unique identifier notification window is used to provide the unique identification number to the joint submitter. The unique identifier notification window displays a 'CC' field for you to add other email addresses to the notification (including the original submitter), a 'To' field, and an 'Additional Comments' text box.

- **Chemical Checkbox (es):** The chemical(s) identified within a form displays on the unique identifier notification pop-up window. Check the checkbox (es) for the chemical(s) identified within the form for which the secondary submitter should provide supporting information.
- **From:** Displays the email address of the user that created the form.
- **CC:** This editable field automatically populates with the email address of the user that created the original form and the email address(es) of the technical contact(s) identified within the form.
- **To:** Contains instructional text for you to enter multiple email addresses. Contains the editable email address of the joint submitter specified on the 'Joint Submitter Information' screen; this email address will be pre-populated upon navigating to the window. Enter any additional email addresses to which the email should be sent.
- **Subject:** Displays 'YYYY Primary PMN.'
- **Message:** Contains a pre-determined message that will display in the email sent to a joint submitter.
- **Additional Comments:** Enter any other additional comments or instructions that should be passed onto the joint submitter.
- **Send:** Click the 'Send' button to generate and send the email to the email addresses identified in the 'CC' and 'To' fields.

4.9 Letter of Support Submitter Information

Click the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Joint Submission Information’ screen to access the ‘Letter of Support Submitter Information’ screen if a Letter of Support is pending. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Letter of Support Submitter Information’ link within the navigation tree. If you are only filing a Letter of Support, click the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Additional Submission Information’ screen to navigate to the ‘Letter of Support Submitter Information’ screen. Click the ‘Add Letter of Support’ link within the navigation tree to add extra Letters of Support.

The ‘Letter of Support Submitter Information’ screen is used to enter contact information for the Letter of Support submitter who will enter separate information for the PMN form. The unique identification number will be sent to the Letter of Support submitter via the email address provided.

An unlimited number of Letters of Support can be identified for each form.

- **Check here to claim this information as CBI:** Check the ‘Check here to claim this information as CBI’ checkbox to claim the Letter of Support submitter contact information as confidential.
- **First Name:** Enter the Letter of Support submitter’s first name. This is a required field.
- **Last Name:** Enter the Letter of Support submitter’s last name. This is a required field.
- **Position:** Enter the Letter of Support submitter’s job title.

- **Postal Code:** Enter the postal code of the Letter of Support submitter’s mailing address. This is a required field if the ‘Country’ field is set to ‘United States.’
- **Country:** Select the country of the Letter of Support submitter’s mailing address from the drop-down menu. This is a required field.

The 'Letter of Support Submission Information' screen is used as a communication point between two companies. The 'Letter of Support Submission Information' screen displays fields that capture information to pass onto the Letter of Support submitter. A text box is used to send information to the Letter of Support submitter in an email sent by the Primary AO. A 'Unique Identifier for Letter of Support Submissions' box will also display on this screen. The unique identification number generates when you declare a Letter of Support is being established.

Letter of Support Submission Process: When you designate that a Letter of Support is pending, you will be asked to enter all the information within the 'Letter of Support' folder.

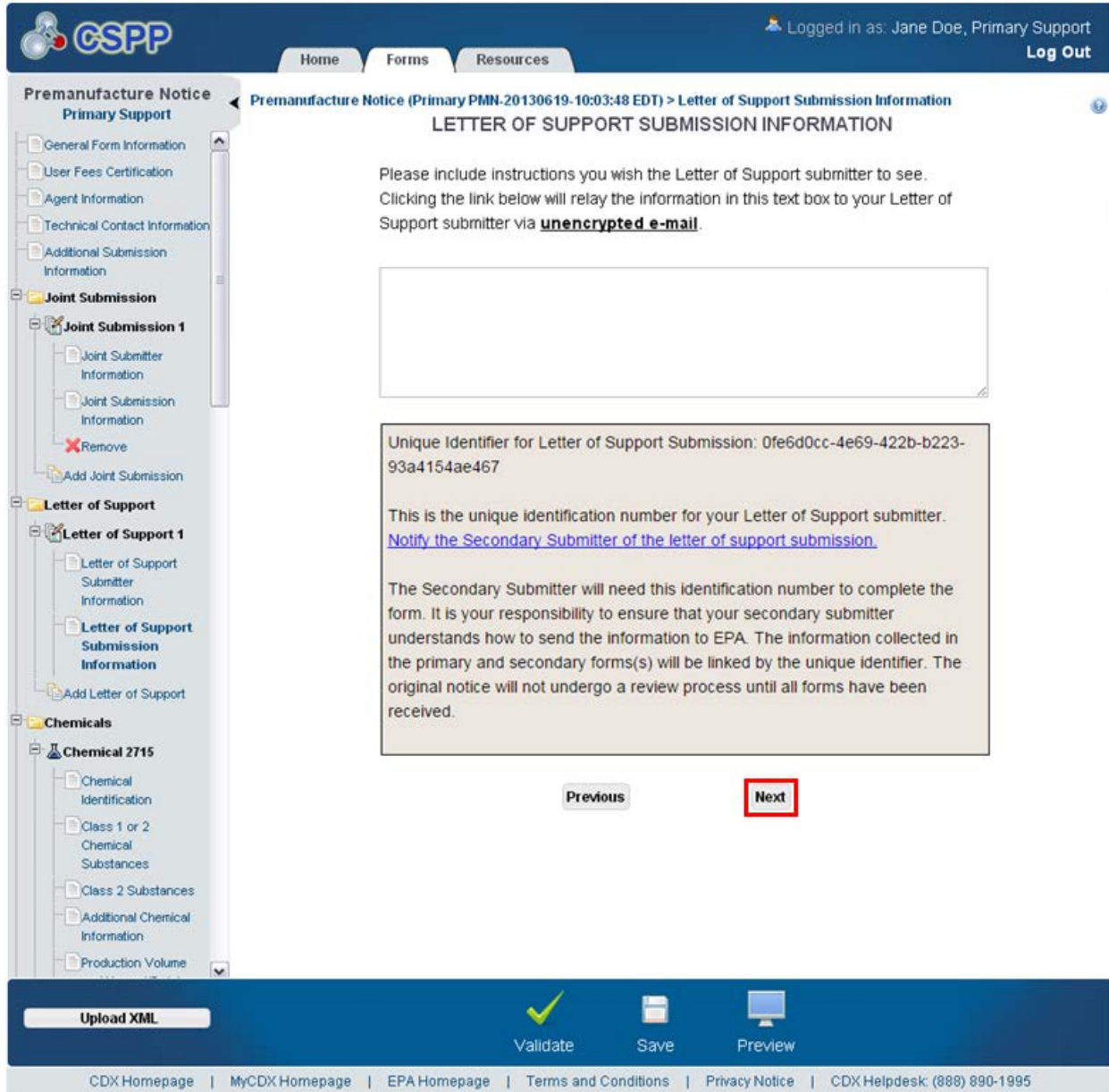
When the primary submitter chooses to, the system will send an email to the Letter of Support submitter designated on the 'Letter of Support Submitter Information' screen. The email will contain the unique identification number that will link the two forms.

When the Letter of Support submitter accesses the 'Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms' screen and clicks the 'Start New Form' button, the Letter of Support submitter will be prompted to enter the unique identification number on the 'Create Passphrase' screen. Once the unique identification number has been entered, the system will link the primary form and Letters of Support. Click the 'Add Letter of Support' link within the navigation tree to add extra Letters of Support as needed.

- **Letter of Support Submission Information Instructions:** Enter the information that the primary submitter is sending to the Letter of Support submitter.
- **Letter of Support Submission Informational Text:** Displays instructional text provided by EPA, the unique identification number generated for the form, and provides functionality to email the unique identification number to the Letter of Support submitter by clicking the 'Notify the Secondary Submitter of the letter of support submission' link.
- **Unique Identification Number:** The unique identification number is a random number auto-generated to pass on to the Letter of Support submitter to create a Letter of Support.

The unique identifier notification window is used to notify the Letter of Support submitter of the unique identification number. The unique identifier notification window displays a ‘CC’ field for you to add other email addresses to the notification (including the original submitter), a ‘To’ field, and an ‘Additional Comments’ text box.

- **Chemical Checkbox(es):** The chemical(s) identified within a form displays on the unique identifier notification pop-up window. Check the checkbox(es) for the chemical(s) identified within the form for which the secondary submitter should provide supporting information.
- **From:** Displays the email address of the logged in user that created the form.
- **CC:** This field automatically populates with the email address of the logged in user that created the form and the email address (es) of the technical contact(s).
- **To:** This field contains instructional text for you to enter multiple email addresses. Contains the editable email address of the Letter of Support submitter specified on the ‘Letter of Support Submitter’ screen; this field is pre-populated with an email address upon navigating to the unique identifier notification window.
- **Subject:** Displays ‘YYYY Primary PMN.’
- **Message:** Displays a pre-determined message in the email sent to a Letter of Support submitter.
- **Additional Comments:** Enter any other additional comments or instructions to pass onto the Letter of Support submitter.
- **Send:** Click the ‘Send’ button to generate and send the email to the email addresses identified in the ‘CC’ and ‘To’ fields.

4.11 Chemical Identification

You can navigate to the 'Chemical Identification' screen by clicking the 'Next' button from the 'Additional Submission Information' screen if you have not identified a joint submitter and/or Letter of Support submitter. You can access this screen by clicking the 'Next' button from the 'Joint Submission Information' screen if you have identified a joint submitter. You can navigate to this screen by clicking the 'Next' button from the 'Letter of Support Submission Information' screen if you have identified a Letter of Support submitter. You can also navigate to this screen by clicking the 'Add Consolidated Chemical' link within the navigation tree.

The 'Chemical Identification' screen identifies the type of chemical the submitter will be entering into the application. You will be able to file a PMN form for a class 1 or 2 chemical substance or a polymer. Based on your selection, the appropriate screens for the respective chemical will appear. If you select the 'Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substance' radio button, click the 'Save' icon () within the bottom action bar, or click the 'Next' button to generate the 'Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substances' screen within the navigation tree. If you identify the chemical as a polymer by selecting the 'Polymer' radio button, click the 'Save' icon () within the bottom action bar, or click the 'Next' button to generate the 'Polymer Identification Information' screen and the 'Monomers and Other Reactants' screen within the navigation tree.

This screen provides a field to identify an alias for the chemical substance, and allows you to identify chemicals in a consolidated chemical submission. The chemical alias is required if a Joint Submission or Letter of Support is being filed and renames the chemical folder within the navigation tree.

- **Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substance:** Select the 'Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substance' radio button to indicate that the chemical is a class 1 or 2 substance. If you select the 'Polymer' radio button after initially selecting the 'Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substance' radio button, the application generates a confirmation message warning you that you will lose all data for this chemical if the chemical type changes. Selecting either the 'Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substance' or 'Polymer' radio button is required.
- **Polymer:** Select the 'Polymer' radio button to indicate that the chemical is a polymer. If you select the 'Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substance' radio button after initially selecting the 'Polymer' radio button, the application generates a confirmation message warning you that you will lose all data for this chemical if the chemical type changes. Selecting either the 'Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substance' or 'Polymer' radio button is required.
- **Chemical Alias:** Enter the chemical alias to associate with a chemical. This field will auto-generate a chemical alias in the navigation tree upon leaving the screen if this field is left blank. This field is required if the form is pending a Joint Submission or a Letter of Support.

The chemical report folder alias is required if a joint submission and/or letter of support is being filed. Its purpose is to make it easier to distinguish between chemical folders when there is more than one and for joint and/or letter of support submitters to refer to when they supply information for that chemical.

Navigation: If you selected the ‘Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substance’ radio button, click the ‘Next’ button to navigate to the ‘Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substances’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substances’ link within the navigation tree.

If you selected the ‘Polymer’ radio button, click the ‘Next’ button to navigate to the ‘Polymer Identification Information’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Polymer Identification Information’ link within the navigation tree.

4.12 Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substances

You can access this screen if you selected the ‘Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substance’ radio button on the ‘Chemical Identification’ screen and clicked the ‘Next’ button. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substances’ link within the navigation tree.

The ‘Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substances’ screen provides fields for you to enter information describing the chemical for which the PMN is to be filed. This screen will outline the unique chemical properties that show the name, composition, and structure of the chemical. The system provides fields for you to identify several key aspects concerning a chemical’s identity.

For a single component submission, create the field set by clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button. Upon clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button, the application generates an expandable/collapsible field set containing numerous fields for you to enter information pertaining to that particular chemical.

For a multi-component submission, create another field set by clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button. Multi-component chemical submissions occur when two or more chemicals are always generated together in a single pot and are never isolated. Upon clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button, the application generates a field set containing numerous fields for you to enter information pertaining to that particular chemical. Enter additional chemical components, each with unique identifying information, by clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button for each additional chemical that is part of the multi-component mixture. All multi-component chemicals will reside in one chemical folder in the navigation tree. Duplicate chemicals are not allowed within a multi-component submission.

For a consolidated submission, create and identify chemicals in separate chemical folders by clicking the ‘Add Consolidated Chemical’ link within the navigation tree.

If you select the ‘Class 1’ radio button on the ‘Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substances’ screen, click the ‘Next’ button to navigate to the ‘Additional Chemical Information’ screen. If you select the ‘Class 2’ radio button on the ‘Class 1 or 2 Chemical Substances’ screen, click the ‘Next’ button to navigate to the ‘Class 2 Substances’ screen.

For a class 1 substance chemical structure diagram, provide a complete and correct chemical structure diagram. A class 1 structural diagram should clearly and completely indicate the identity of the atoms and the nature and location of the bonds joining the atoms. Provide ionic charges and known stereo chemical details. Carbon atoms in ring systems do not need to be explicitly shown.

For a class 2 substance chemical structure diagram:

- 1) List the immediate precursor substances with their respective CASRN.
- 2) Describe the nature of the reaction or process.
- 3) Indicate the range of composition and the typical composition (where appropriate).
- 4) Provide a correct representative or partial chemical structure diagram, as complete as can be known, if one can be reasonably ascertained.

Provide partial, complete, or representative structural diagrams to the extent possible. The diagram should indicate the characteristic or variable compositional structural components of the substance. If you are unsure of the exact structure, provide the best information you have and indicate that it is your best estimate of the chemical structure.

- **Add New Chemical:** Click the button to generate the class 1 or 2 chemical substances expandable/collapsible field set.
- **Cancel:** Click the ‘Cancel’ link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to prevent edits from saving and to remove a field set. The ‘Cancel’ link displays when the expandable/collapsible field set is open for editing. A confirmation message displays to confirm the action.

- **Edit:** Click the 'Edit' link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to modify the information entered in the fields. The 'Edit' link displays when the expandable/collapsible field set has been saved and the data is not currently editable.
- **Delete:** Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to delete the field set. A confirmation message displays to confirm the deletion.
- **Expand All:** Click the link located at the upper-right of the expandable/collapsible field sets to expand a series of field sets.
- **Collapse All:** Click the link located at the upper-right of the expandable/collapsible field sets to collapse a series of field sets.
- **B.1.a. Class of Substance:** In section B.1.a., select the 'Class 1' or 'Class 2' radio button to identify whether a 'Class 1' or 'Class 2' chemical substance is being reported. Selecting the 'Class 2' chemical substance radio button indicates that some portions of the structure may not be known and a 'Class 2 Substances' screen will appear within the navigation tree after clicking the 'Next' button for you to enter information concerning how the chemical was created. If multiple 'Class 2' chemical components are added, only one 'Class 2 Substances' screen will generate that applies to all the components. You may claim the chemical substance class as confidential by checking the 'CBI' checkbox. Either the 'Class 1' or 'Class 2' radio button must be selected.
- **Class 1:** Select the 'Class 1' radio button to identify the chemical as a 'Class 1' substance. A 'Class 1' substance is a single molecular entity that can be represented by a single, definite structural diagram. Either the 'Class 1' or the 'Class 2' radio button in the 'B.1.a. Class of Substance' section is required.
- **Class 2:** Select the 'Class 2' radio button to identify the chemical as a 'Class 2' substance. A 'Class 2' substance is a substance whose composition cannot be represented by a single, definite chemical structural diagram. Class 2 substances include substances of unknown, variable, or uncertain composition, complex mixtures or reaction products, or well-defined substances without specific structures. Either the 'Class 1' or the 'Class 2' radio button in the 'B.1.a. Class of Substance' section is required.
- **CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the 'Class of Substance' as confidential.
- **Search SRS:** Click the 'Search SRS' button to generate the 'Search Substance Registry Services' pop-up window. Refer to **Section 3.8** for further details regarding the search SRS functionality.
- **CASRN:** Displays the CASRN of the chemical identified on the 'Search Substance Registry Services' pop-up window, if applicable.
- **Chemical Name:** Displays the chemical name of the chemical identified on the 'Search Substance Registry Services' pop-up window. For class 1 substances, a 'Chemical Abstracts (CA) Index Name' must be provided. For class 2 substances either a 'CA Index Name' or 'CA Preferred Name' must be provided, whichever is appropriate based on current CA nomenclature rules and conventions. This is a required field.
- **CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the 'Chemical Name' field as confidential; this generates the 'Generic Chemical Name' field.

- **B.6. Generic Chemical Name:** Enter the generic name to associate with a chemical. This field only displays when 'CASRN' and 'Chemical Name' are marked as 'CBI.' This is a required field when displayed.
- **Method 1 (CAS Inventory Expert Service):** Select the 'Method 1 (CAS Inventory Expert Service)' radio button to identify the ID method as the CAS Inventory Expert Service (IES) method and generate the 'IES Order #' field. A copy of the identification report obtained from the CAS Inventory Expert Services must be submitted as an attachment to this notice; an IES report is required. For a consolidated submission, each chemical must be 'Method 1' except when the submission is pending a Letter of Support for that chemical. In the case of an LVE/LOREX modification form type, this 'Method 1' requirement is not applicable. A single response option in the 'B.1.c. ID Method' section is required.
- **Method 2 (Other Method):** Select the 'Method 2 (Other Method)' radio button to identify the ID method as 'Other Method.' An alternative method of providing a name, such as a Scientific and Technical Information Network (STN) database report or a CAS Client Services report, qualifies as 'Method 2.' The chemical can be 'Method 2' if the consolidated submission is pending a Letter of Support. A single response option in the 'B.1.c. ID Method' section is required.
- **IES Order #:** Enter the IES order number of the report. This field only displays when the 'Method 1 (CAS Inventory Expert Service)' radio button is selected. This is a required field.
- **B.1.d. Molecular Formula:** Enter the molecular formula associated with a chemical. The molecular formula must give the correct identity and number of atoms of each element contained in the PMN molecule or a description if the substance is a class 2 material. The system will not allow subscripts and superscripts to be used. This is a required field.
- **CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the 'Molecular Formula' data as confidential.
- **Attachments:** Select the section of the page the file is associated with that you intend to attach from the drop-down menu. This drop-down menu contains the following values: 'Chemical Structure Diagram' and 'ID Method.' This is a required field to upload an attachment.
- **Attach Document:** Click the 'Attach Document' button to generate the 'Attach Documents' pop-up window. Refer to **Section 3.7** for further details regarding the attach document functionality.
- **Section:** Displays the section associated with a document.

The 'Class 2 Substances' screen captures information regarding a class 2 chemical substance. A class 2 chemical substance is a substance that may not have a defined chemical structure that has been identified. This screen provides fields to identify specific elements in the creation of the chemical using the following fields: 'Precursor Substances,' 'Nature of Reaction,' and 'Range of Composition.'

Enter precursor substances by searching SRS or using manual entry when the substance is not in SRS. The selected substances will display in a table listing the 'Chemical Name' and 'CASRN.'

The system provides fields to capture 'Nature of Reaction' and 'Range of Composition' in text boxes. The 'Nature of Reaction' and 'Range of Composition' text fields can be claimed as CBI.

The 'Additional Chemical Information' screen captures information regarding the chemicals produced as byproducts and impurities when a chemical is manufactured. This screen also captures other names for the chemical at hand in the 'Synonyms' and 'Trade Identification' tables.

An 'Impurities' table displays information regarding the impurities that may be reasonably anticipated to be in the respective chemical or polymer as manufactured for commercial purpose. Click the 'Search SRS' button to access the 'Search SRS' pop-up window and populate the 'Impurities' table. You will also be able to enter a chemical using the 'Chemical Name' and 'CASRN' field (if applicable) on the 'Chemical Not Found In Substance Registry Services' pop-up window. If there are unidentified impurities, enter "unidentified." You also have the option of claiming the chemical as confidential by checking the 'CBI' checkbox. A 'Maximum %' field is also displayed which captures the maximum percentage for the impurity. Documents may be attached for the 'Impurities' section if necessary.

A 'Byproducts' table provides fields to capture information regarding the byproducts that may be produced from the manufacture of the respective chemical or polymer. Click the 'Search SRS' button to access the 'Search SRS' pop-up window and populate the 'Byproducts' table. You may associate a CASRN with a byproduct (if applicable) and check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim a byproduct as confidential. Documents may be attached for the 'Byproducts' section if necessary.

A 'Synonyms' table provides fields to capture the synonyms that the respective chemical or polymer may be referred to in the documentation. A maximum of five synonyms can be entered in the table. The search SRS functionality cannot be used to populate the 'Synonyms' table. You may attach documents associated with the 'Synonyms' section to provide additional synonyms if necessary.

A 'Trade Identification' table provides fields to capture information about the trade names by which the respective chemical or polymer may be referred in documentation. There is no limit to the number of trade names that may be added. You may attach documents associated with the 'Trade Identification' section to provide additional information if necessary.

The 'Attach Documents' pop-up window provides fields to upload documents related to the 'Impurities,' 'Byproducts,' 'Synonyms,' and/or 'Trade Identification' section(s). Select the section of the page the document is associated with from the 'Section' drop-down menu, and click the 'Attach Document' button to generate the 'Attach Documents' pop-up window and attach a document. The system provides a 'CBI' checkbox to claim the uploaded document as confidential. If you claim a document as CBI, the system requires you to upload the sanitized version of the attached document.

4.15 Polymer Identification Information

You can access the ‘Polymer Identification Information’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Chemical Identification’ screen if you select the ‘Polymer’ radio button. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Polymer Identification Information’ link within the navigation tree after selecting the ‘Polymer’ radio button on the ‘Chemical Identification’ screen.

The ‘Polymer Identification Information’ screen captures information describing the polymer(s) for which the PMN will be filed. This screen outlines the unique chemical properties that show the name, composition, and structure of the polymer. The system will provide fields for you to identify several key aspects concerning a polymer’s identity.

To reference a monomer cleared with an LVE, comments should be included in an attachment (for example, on a reaction scheme).

Click the ‘Add New Chemical’ button to create a chemical field set. Upon clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button, an expandable/collapsible field set generates that contains numerous fields that pertain to the particular polymer. You are able to enter multiple chemical substances, each with unique information, by clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button for each chemical you wish to identify.

For a single component submission, create the field set by clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button. Upon clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button, the application generates a field set containing numerous fields that captures information pertaining to that particular chemical.

For a multi-component submission, click the ‘Add New Chemical’ button to create a field set. Multi-component chemical submissions occur when two or more chemicals always generate together in a single pot and are never isolated. Upon clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button, the application generates a field set that provides numerous fields to enter information pertaining to that particular chemical. Enter additional chemical substances, each with unique identifying information, by clicking the ‘Add New Chemical’ button for each additional chemical that is part of the multi-component mixture. All multi-component chemicals will reside in one chemical folder in the navigation tree.

For a consolidated submission, create separate chemical folders by clicking the ‘Add Consolidated Chemical’ link within the navigation tree. A form may contain a maximum of six (6) separate chemical folders.

- **Add New Chemical:** Click the ‘Add New Chemical’ button to generate a polymer identification information expandable/collapsible field set.
- **Cancel:** Click the ‘Cancel’ link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to prevent edits from saving and to remove a field set. The ‘Cancel’ link displays when the expandable/collapsible field set is open for editing. A confirmation message displays to confirm the action.
- **Edit:** Click the ‘Edit’ link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to modify the information entered in the fields. The ‘Edit’ link displays when the expandable/collapsible field set has been saved and the data is not currently editable.

- **Delete:** Click the ‘Delete’ icon (✖) located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to delete the field set; a confirmation message displays to confirm the deletion.
- **Expand All:** Click the link located at the upper-right of the expandable/collapsible field sets to expand a series of field sets.

- **Method 1 (CAS Inventory Expert Service):** Select the ‘Method 1 (CAS Inventory Expert Service)’ radio button to identify the ID method as the ‘CAS Inventory Expert Service’ method. Submit a copy of the identification report obtained from the CAS Inventory Expert Services as an attachment to this notice. For a consolidated submission, each chemical must be ‘Method 1’ except when the submission is pending a Letter of Support for that chemical. - **Method 2 (Other Method):** Select the ‘Method 2 (Other Method)’ radio button to identify the ID method as ‘Other Method.’ An alternative method of providing a name, such as a STN database report or a CAS Client Services report, qualifies as ‘Method 2.’ If the chemical is pending a Letter of Support, the method can only be ‘Method 2.’ A single response option in the ‘ID Method’ section is required if there is no pending Letter of Support or Joint Submission for the form.
- **Attachments:** Select the section of the page with which the document is associated from the drop-down menu. This drop-down menu contains the following values: ‘Chemical Structure Diagram’ and ‘ID Method.’ It is required that a document be attached for the ID Method if there is no pending Letter of Support or Joint Submission for the form.
- **Attach Document:** Click the button to generate the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window. Refer to **Section 3.7** for additional details regarding the attach document functionality.
- **Section:** Displays the section of the page with which the file is associated.

- **File Name:** Displays the file name and file extension of a document that is uploaded on the 'Attach Documents' window.

4.16 Monomers and Other Reactants

You can navigate to the 'Monomers and Other Reactants' screen by clicking the 'Next' button from the 'Polymer Identification Information' screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the 'Monomers and Other Reactants' link within the navigation tree.

The 'Monomers and Other Reactants' screen is used to identify the chemical measurements and monomers that make up a polymer. The screen is divided into two sections to identify different

elements describing a polymer: ‘Polymer Weight Information’ and ‘Monomers and Other Reactants.’

In the ‘Monomers and Other Reactants’ section, enter the typical weight percent of each monomer or other reactant in the polymer. Enter the maximum weight percent of each monomer or other reactant that may be present as a residual in the polymer as manufactured for commercial purposes. The maximum residual should be less than the typical composition. Do not use parts per million (ppm) units (1 ppm = 0.0001 wt%).

To reference a monomer cleared with an LVE, include an attachment detailing any specifics.

- **CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim the ‘Polymer Weight Information’ section as confidential.
- **Method of Measurement:** Only a single response option can be selected for ‘Method of Measurement;’ valid values include ‘GPC’ and ‘Other (Specify).’ Gel-permeation chromatography (GPC) is a well-established method for establishing the number average molecular weight (M_n) and weight fractions below 500 and 1,000 Daltons. It may not be useful for all polymer evaluations; however, solubility problems and misleading calibration standards can lead to questionable GPC data. Correction estimates can be documented and presented in cases where only a soluble fraction of the polymer can be analyzed. This is a required field if there is no pending Letter of Support or Joint Submission for the form.
- **Specify other method of measure:** Enter the method of measurement when you select the ‘Other (Specify)’ radio button as the method of measurement. This is a required field when the ‘Other (Specify)’ radio button is selected.
- **(i) lowest number avg. molecular weight:** Enter the lowest number average molecular weight; the entered value must be a positive numerical value and can contain decimal values. This is a required field if there is no pending Letter of Support or Joint Submission.
- **(ii) max. weight % below 500 molecular weight:** Enter the maximum weight percentage below 500 molecular weight; the value entered must be a positive numerical value greater than or equal to zero (0), but less than or equal to one hundred (100) and can contain decimal values. This value must be less than or equal to the value specified in the ‘(iii) max. weight % below 1000 molecular weight’ field. This is a required field if there are no pending Joint Submissions or Letters of Support. Please note that in IE 7, the % symbols might be slightly misaligned.
- **(iii) max. weight % below 1000 molecular weight:** Enter the maximum weight percentage below 1,000 molecular weight; the value entered must be a positive numerical value greater than or equal to zero (0) but less than or equal to one hundred (100) and can contain decimal values. This value must be greater than or equal to the value specified in the ‘(ii) max. weight % below 500 molecular weight’ field. This is a required field if there are no pending Joint Submissions or Letters of Support. Please note that in IE 7, the % symbols might be slightly misaligned.
- **Add Monomer:** Click the button to generate the monomer expandable/collapsible field set.
- **Cancel:** Click the ‘Cancel’ link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to prevent edits from saving and to remove a field set. The

'Cancel' link is displayed when the expandable/collapsible field set is open for editing. A confirmation message displays to confirm the action.

- **Edit:** Click the 'Edit' link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to modify the information entered in the fields. The 'Edit' link is displayed when the expandable/collapsible field set has been saved and the data is not currently editable.

This checkbox is most applicable for monomers that are less than or equal to 2% since the monomer is not considered to be included in the identity unless this checkbox is checked. This checkbox appears when a value of '2' or less is entered into the 'Typical Composition' text field.
- **CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the monomer or other reactant name and CASRN as confidential.
- **CAS Registry Number:** Displays the CASRN for the specified monomer; this field populates based on information entered on the 'Search SRS' pop-up window.
- **Chemical Name:** Displays the name of the chemical identified on the 'Search SRS' pop-up window.
- **Typical Composition:** Enter the typical composition value that a monomer contributes to a polymer; the value entered must be a positive numerical value greater than zero (0) and less than or equal to one hundred (100) and can contain decimal values. If the value entered is less than or equal to '2' a warning will be displayed in the global 'Validate' function or during the submission process indicating that the typical composition is a value that is less than or equal to 2 percent and asking you whether it should be included in the chemical identity. This is a required field, and the value must be greater than zero (0).
- **CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the 'Typical Composition' and 'Include In Identity' fields as confidential.
- **Maximum Residual:** Enter the maximum residual value. Indicate the maximum weight percent of each monomer or other reactant that may be present as a residual in the polymer as manufactured for commercial purposes. Enter a percent value less than or equal to the

maximum weight; do not use ppm units (1 ppm = 0.0001 wt%). The value entered must be a positive numerical value that is less than or equal to the typical composition value. This is a required field.



- **CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the 'Maximum Residual' field as confidential.
- **Save:** Click the button to save the information entered within the expandable/collapsible field set. You must click this button instead of the 'Save' icon () located within the bottom action bar to successfully save the entered information within the field set before being able to navigate away from the screen using the 'Previous' and 'Next' buttons. Refer to **Section 3.6** for more information regarding the save functionality in an expandable/collapsible field set.
- **Attach Document:** Click the 'Attach Document' button to generate the 'Attach Documents' pop-up window. Refer to **Section 3.7** for additional details regarding the attach document functionality.

4.17 Production Volume and Hazard/Safety Information

You can navigate to the ‘Production Volume and Hazard/Safety Information’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Additional Chemical Information’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Production Volume and Hazard/Safety Information’ link within the navigation tree.

The ‘Production Volume and Hazard/Safety Information’ screen collects different information regarding a chemical’s production and hazard elements.

Production Volume: The ‘Production Volume’ section captures information about production for the respective chemical or polymer for the ‘Maximum first 12-month production’ and the ‘Maximum 12-month production.’ The ‘Maximum first 12-month production’ value should be less than or equal to the ‘Maximum 12-month production’ value. The maximum volume may not exceed 100,000,000,000,000 kg/year for either field. The entered values will automatically display decimal points upon navigating away from the page. Decimals are allowed up to the milligram (.000001). Estimates should be on a 100% new chemical substance basis. Your production volumes should be estimated as accurately as possible, but you are not bound to your estimates unless you check the ‘Binding’ checkbox and are creating an LVE or LVE modification submission. Include amounts you intend to produce for export. Provide an estimate of the first 12 months of production and the maximum production volume for any consecutive 12-month period during the first three (3) years of commercial manufacture. You may upload an attachment to enter additional production information.

Hazard Information: The ‘Hazard Information’ section captures information regarding hazards that the company chooses to disclose. For EPA to take respirator use into account when evaluating risks posed by a new chemical, the MSDS (material safety data sheet) for the substance must specify a respirator that is appropriate for the types of anticipated exposures. For the same reason, all respirators must be certified by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), and be referenced in the MSDS as “NIOSH certified” respirators.

If any type of risk assessment is prescribed to determine personal protective equipment (PPE) requirements, such risk assessment must be performed by a qualified Industrial Hygienist (IH) or other authorized occupational safety and health specialist.

Engineering controls are the preferred methods for managing workplace exposures to hazards. If these controls are inadequate or lacking, personal protective equipment must be used.

For EPA to take glove use into account when evaluating risks posed by a new chemical, the MSDS for the substance must specify gloves that are impervious to the substances of concern, as well as suitable for the type of tasks.

Close-fitting goggles or a full-face piece facemask are preferred for vapor, mist, or fume exposures, or wherever workplace contaminants can readily bypass loose-fitting equipment.

The information is collected in a file attachment. The system will display instructional text for you to identify which forms should be uploaded.

Provide the MSDS for the PMN substance or intermediate or product mixture (that contains it) as an attachment to the PMN. Also, include hazard warning statements or labels, if relevant. The personal protection requirements of the MSDS become integral requirements of an LVE notice.

- **CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim the production volume information as confidential.
- **Binding:** Check the ‘Binding’ checkbox to claim the production volume information as binding. This checkbox is enabled for LVE or LVE modifications only.
- **Maximum first 12-month production:** Provide an estimate of the first 12 months of production. The entered value must be a numerical value and must be greater than zero but

less than 100,000,000,000,000 kg/year. This field accepts decimals to the milligram and is a required field if you do not have a pending Joint Submission and/or Letter of Support.

- **Maximum 12-month production:** Enter the data associated with the production volume. Provide an estimate of the maximum production volume for any consecutive 12-month period during the first three (3) years of commercial manufacture. The entered value must be a numerical value and must be greater than zero but less than 100,000,000,000,000 kg/year. This value must be greater than or equal to the 'Maximum first 12-month production' value. This field accepts decimals to the milligram and is a required field if you do not have a pending Joint Submission and/or Letter of Support.
- **Binding:** Check the 'Binding' checkbox to claim the hazard information as binding.
- **Attachments:** Select the section of the page with which the attached document is associated. This drop-down menu contains the following value: 'Production Information Section' and 'Hazard Information Section.'
- **Attach Document:** Click the 'Attach Document' button to generate the 'Attach Documents' pop-up window. Refer to **Section 3.7** for additional details regarding the attach document functionality.
- **Section:** Displays the section with which the document is associated.
- **File Name:** Displays the file name and file extension of the file that is uploaded on the 'Attach Documents' pop-up window. Click the file name link to navigate to the 'Attach Documents' pop-up window to make any edits.

4.18 Use Information

You can navigate to the ‘Use Information’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Production Volume and Hazard/Safety Information’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Use Information’ link within the navigation tree.

The 'Use Information' screen is used to capture data about how the new chemical substance is intended to be used by function and application. Function refers to the chemical purpose for which the substance is designed and is often based on the physical and chemical properties of the substance. Application refers to how the substance is used in particular processes or products. An example of a function and application would be as a dispersive dye for finishing polyester fibers. When you navigate to the screen, the screen contains instructional text and an 'Add Use' button. When you click the 'Add Use' button, an expandable/collapsible field set will open and display the 'Use Information' fields. Upon saving the entry, the expandable/collapsible field set collapses and displays the 'Category of Use' and 'Production %' values.

You will first enter a description for the 'Category of Use' field. Each use will center on the 'Category of Use' and the different variables surrounding it. The category of use information should be specific enough to allow EPA reviewers to anticipate potential exposure patterns for the new substance (e.g. merely indicating "Dye" is not sufficient – is it photographic dye, a reactive dye for nylon fibers, or a dye to be incorporated in a polymer making film?). LVE notices limit you to your stated category of use(s), so make sure your description fully encompasses all intended uses for any LVE. When you claim the 'Category of Use' as CBI, you are required to enter a 'Generic Use Description.' The generic use description will be available publicly.

The table captures the different elements of use that the PMN form captures. The 'Production %' and '% in Formulation' values will be captured to indicate how the product will be used and at what percent in that use. Each use must capture the percent of the production and percent in formulation for each category of use. The 'Production %' must equal up to 100% for all uses, and the field can be declared CBI. The '% in Formulation' value can equal up to 100%, and the field can be declared CBI.

The '% of substance expected' per use is captured for the following categories: 'Site Limited,' 'Consumer,' 'Industrial,' and 'Commercial.' The '% of substance expected' value must total 100%. The '% of substance expected' values can be claimed as CBI or listed as binding. These use types are used to determine the risks that the chemical will place on society.

- **Add Use:** Click the 'Add Use' button to add a new use information expandable/collapsible field set.
- **Cancel:** Click the 'Cancel' link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to prevent edits from saving and to remove a field set. The 'Cancel' link displays when the expandable/collapsible field set is open for editing. A confirmation message displays to confirm the action.
- **Edit:** Click the 'Edit' link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to modify the information entered in the fields. The 'Edit' link displays when the expandable/collapsible field set has been saved and the data is not currently editable.
- **Delete:** Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to delete the field set. A confirmation message displays to confirm the deletion.
- **Expand All:** Click the link located at the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field sets to expand a series of field sets.

- **Collapse All:** Click the link located at the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field sets to collapse a series of field sets.
- **Category of Use:** Enter the category of use for the specific chemical substance by function and application. This is a required field.
- **CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the category of use information as confidential and generate the 'Generic Use Description' field. Claiming the 'Category of Use' field as CBI and then un-checking the 'CBI' checkbox generates a confirmation message that all attached documents will be deleted.
- **Binding:** Check the 'Binding' checkbox to claim the category of use information as binding.
- **C.2.b. Generic Use Description:** Enter the generic use description of the chemical. This field is displayed when the 'Category of Use' field is claimed CBI. If you claim any category of use description as confidential, enter a generic description of that category. This field is required when the 'Category of Use' field is claimed CBI.
- **Total Production for this Use %:** Enter an estimate of the percent of total production for the first three years devoted to each category of use for the specific chemical. For example, site-limited means the substance will only be used on the adjacent property unit where manufactured and will not intentionally be removed from the site except for waste disposal.
- **Consumer %:** Enter the consumer percentage of substance expected per use for the submitted substance. Blank fields are recognized as zeroes. This field allows for decimal values. Break down the use(s) by percentage for the indicated end user categories. Consumer use means that private individuals will use the chemical substance or products containing the substance for personal use or enjoyment.

- **Industrial %:** Enter the industrial percentage of substance expected per use for the submitted substance. Blank fields are recognized as zeroes. This field allows for decimal values. Break down the use(s) by percentage for the indicated end user categories. Industrial use means that the chemical substance or product containing the substance will be used at the locations of other manufacturers or processors.
- **Commercial %:** Enter the commercial percentage of substance expected per use for the submitted substance. Blank fields are recognized as zeroes. This field allows for decimal values. Break down the use(s) by percentage for the indicated end user categories. Indicate percentage of product volume expected for the listed “use” sectors. Commercial use refers to the chemical substance or product containing the chemical substance being used by a company to provide a consumer service.
- **If you have provided a “consumer” use, provide details:** Enter consumer use details. Provide a detailed description of the use(s) of this chemical substance in consumer products. In addition, include estimates of the concentration of the new chemical substance as expected in consumer products and describe the chemical reactions by which this substance loses its identity in the consumer product. This is a required field if the ‘Consumer % of substance expected per use’ field is populated and is a value greater than zero (0).
- **CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim the ‘If you have provided a ‘consumer’ use, provide details’ information as confidential.
- **Attach Document:** Click the ‘Attach Document’ button to generate the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window. Refer to **Section 3.7** for additional details regarding the attach document functionality.
- **File Name:** Displays the file name and file extension of the file uploaded on the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window. Click the ‘File Name’ link to navigate to the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window to make any edits.
- **Description:** Displays the description associated with a document.
- **Pages:** Displays the number of pages a document contains.
- **CBI:** Indicates the CBI status of a document by displaying either a ‘Y’ or an ‘N.’
- **Actions:** Click the ‘Delete’ icon (✖) to delete the entire attached document row permanently from the system. A warning message displays to confirm deletion of the document.
- **Save:** Click the button to save the information entered within the expandable/collapsible field set. You must click this button instead of the ‘Save’ icon (💾) located within the bottom action bar to successfully save the entered information within the field set before being able to navigate away from the screen using the ‘Previous’ and ‘Next’ buttons. Refer to **Section 3.6** for more information regarding the save functionality in an expandable/collapsible field set.
- **Production Total:** Displays the total production percentage for all uses. This value must be equal to 100, unless a Joint Submission or Letter of Support is pending, in which case the total value requirement is not immediately applicable.

You can navigate to the 'Physical and Chemical Properties Worksheet' screen by clicking the 'Next' button from the 'Use Information' screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the 'Physical and Chemical Properties Worksheet' link within the navigation tree.

The 'Physical and Chemical Properties Worksheet' screen is used to capture optional information about a chemical's properties. The chemical properties are used by EPA to determine additional safety data about a chemical. The properties are used to determine potential risks and exposures of the chemicals.

The properties for a chemical are captured in an expandable/collapsible field set format. The following categories may apply to a chemical: 'Physical state of neat substance,' 'Vapor Pressure @ temperature,' 'Density/relative density,' 'Solubility @ temperature ___ solvent __,' 'Solubility in water @ temperature __,' 'Melting temperature,' 'Boiling/sublimation temperature @ __,' 'Spectra,' 'Dissociation constant,' 'Particle size distribution,' 'Octanol/water partition coefficient,' 'Henry's Law constant,' 'Volatilization from water,' 'Volatilization from soil,' 'pH @ concentration [concentration],' 'Flammability,' 'Explosibility,' and 'Adsorption/coefficient.' All of the properties will capture the relevant values for a chemical. Each property may be claimed individually as CBI.

To enter physical/chemical property information, select a physical/chemical property from the drop-down menu and click the 'Add Property' button. The expandable/collapsible field set will expand and display all fields that should be entered for that property. You are then able to enter all relevant information regarding that property. Value fields are able to accept '<' or '>' symbols. When all information is entered, click the 'Save' button. Each property may only be entered once per chemical.

You may also enter an option for 'Other.' The 'Other' option will allow you to enter a user-specified property and any relevant values. The property will capture the relevant values for the chemical and the property measurement can be identified as 'Measured' or 'Estimate.' The 'Other' option may be claimed individually as CBI. You may enter multiple properties as 'Other.'

You may upload attachments for the chemical properties on the 'Physical and Chemical Properties Worksheet – Continued (Optional)' screen.

EPA's risk assessment process does utilize physiochemical properties, as some of the attributes listed here can relate directly to chemical risks. Among the most useful parameters of a new substance to EPA are the boiling point, the melting point, vapor pressure, the octanol/water partition coefficient, water solubility, Henry's Law Constant, hydrolysis, spectral data, mass spectrometry (MS), proton and C13 Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (NMR), Infrared (IR), and Ultraviolet (UV) absorption, and the soil/sediment absorption coefficient. In the absence of this data, EPA will estimate to the extent possible physiochemical data to aid in their risk evaluations.

Indicate whether the value you provide is based on an actual test measurement ('Measured') or is based on an estimate ('Estimate'). Note that EPA staffers indicate that data qualifiers such as 'negligible' or 'soluble' are not useful descriptions.

You are not required to generate the listed test data if you do not have it.

Physical/chemical properties data may be so unique that they could in the future link the PMN substance to a commercial product or may tend to identify unique classes of chemical substance, and therefore some data elements may represent confidential business information. Review the CBI status of each entry carefully, and avoid making unsupportable claims.

Please note that in IE 7, all physical/chemical properties you wish to add must be identified before navigating away from this page; otherwise, the properties are removed from the 'Add Property' drop-down menu. In addition, you will be able to add the 'Henry's Law constant' property more than once, and the chemical property fields located within the expandable/collapsible fields sets on this page will be disorganized. After clicking the 'Next' button, you will navigate to the 'Physical and Chemical Properties Worksheet – Continued (Optional)' screen. After clicking the 'Previous' button, the physical/chemical properties have been removed from the 'Add Property' drop-down menu.

- **Boiling/sublimation temperature @ [pressure] torr:** Enter the value of the pressure in torr for which the boiling/sublimation of the chemical substance was determined. Value fields are

able to accept '<' or '>' symbols. This is a required field if the 'Boiling/sublimation temperature @' property is selected.

- **Boiling/sublimation temperature @ - Measured or Estimate:** Indicate whether the property value is 'Measured' or based on an 'Estimate' by selecting the appropriate value from the drop-down menu. This is a required field if the 'Boiling/sublimation temperature @' property is selected.
- **Boiling/sublimation temperature @ - CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the 'Boiling/sublimation temperature @' property as confidential.
- **Density/relative density - Value:** Enter the density/relative density value of the chemical substance in g/cm³. Value fields are able to accept '<' or '>' symbols. This is a required field if the 'Density/relative density' property is selected.
- **Density/relative density - Measured or Estimate:** Indicate whether the property value is 'Measured' or based on an 'Estimate' by selecting the appropriate value from the drop-down menu. This is a required field if the 'Density/relative density' property is selected.

The ‘Physical and Chemical Properties Worksheet – Continued (Optional)’ screen is used to capture all the studies and attachments that refer to the chemical properties captured on the ‘Physical and Chemical Properties Worksheet’ screen. When you first access the ‘Physical and Chemical Properties Worksheet – Continued (Optional)’ screen, instructional text, an ‘Attach Document’ button, and an attachments table display.

When you attach a document, the properties that were selected on the ‘Physical and Chemical Properties Worksheet’ screen will be listed with checkboxes in the ‘Attach Documents’ window for you to select with which properties an attachment is associated. Check the properties that are relevant to the document, and then select a type and subtype value for the document. You will be able to attach a document, enter a description of the document, and list the number of pages.

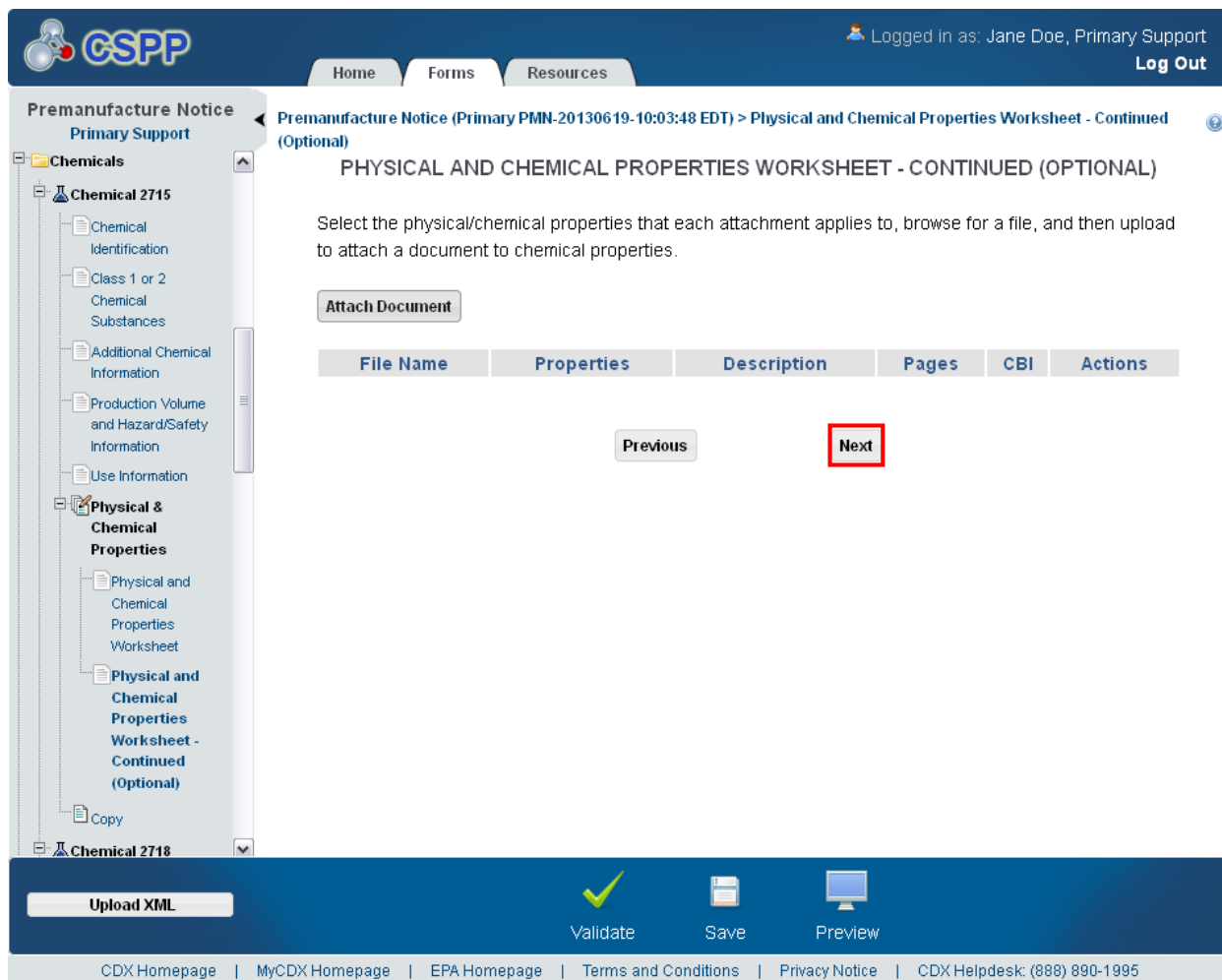

If a user indicates there are submitter-controlled sites, the ‘Submitter Operation Information,’ ‘Occupational Exposures,’ and ‘Environmental Releases’ screens are automatically generated within the ‘Submitter Controlled Operations’ folder within the navigation tree. If a user indicates there are sites controlled by others, the ‘Industrial Sites Controlled By Others,’ ‘Exposures/Releases,’ and ‘Byproduct Information’ screens automatically generates within the ‘Operations Controlled By Others’ folder within the navigation tree upon clicking the ‘Next’ button. Toll manufacturing sites are considered sites controlled by the submitter.

- **Do you have sites controlled by the submitter?:** Select the ‘Yes’ radio button to indicate that you have submitter controlled sites to identify; this response automatically generates the screens within the ‘Submitter Controlled Operations’ folder in the PMN navigation tree upon clicking the ‘Next’ button. Select the ‘No’ radio button if you do not have any submitter-controlled sites to identify. An error message displays if a submitter-controlled site displays within the navigation tree and the ‘No’ radio button is selected.

Complete the 'Operations Controlled By Others' section within the navigation tree for typical processing or use operations involving the new chemical substance at sites not controlled by the submitter. Importers do not have to complete this section for operations outside the U.S.; however, you must report any processing or use activities after

import. Complete a separate ‘Operations Controlled By Others’ section for each type of processing, or use operation involving the new chemical substance. If the same operation is performed at more than one site, describe the typical operation common to these sites. The screen first captures whether there is any data for other controlled sites. If there is no data for sites controlled by others, the screen will not update and the option of selecting the ‘Next’ button is available. If there is data for sites controlled by others, an additional question will appear. The screen then captures whether site-specific data for the chemical is known for ‘Sites Controlled By Others.’ If you indicate that there is site-specific data by selecting the ‘Yes’ radio button, the screen will generate a text field to enter the ‘# of unknown sites’ and a ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim the number of unknown sites as confidential. If there is no site-specific data, the screen displays a text box to capture the number of unknown sites.

The ‘Submitter Operation Information’ screen captures information about an operation that occurs at a particular site or group of sites. You are asked a series of questions and, based on the

responses, information will display to fill out a series of fields about a specific operation. The guided approach is designed to eliminate errors and ensure the completion of all relevant sections for a site. You will be able to enter an operation alias to identify the operation. Importers are not required to complete this section for operations outside the U.S.; however, any industrial processing or use operation that takes place after import must be described. It should be noted that Toll manufacturing sites are considered to be sites controlled by the submitter.

You will first be asked to select the site(s) and chemical(s) for the operation and will then select the applicable operation type checkboxes.

If you select an option other than 'Use' for the operation type, you will be asked whether the chemical is manufactured or processed as a 'batch' or 'continuous' process. Based on the property selected, fill in the relevant information. If you select the 'Use' operation type, then there will be no further options on this screen. The follow-up screens are used to capture specific information about the operation type process.

Include interim storage and specify transport containers (e.g., 5-gallon pails, 55-gallon drum, rail car, tank truck, etc.). (2) Provide the identity, approximate weight (by kilograms (kg) kg/day or kg/batch on a new chemical substance basis), and entry point of all starting materials, feedstocks (including reactants, solvents, catalysts, etc.), products, recycle streams, and wastes. Include cleaning chemicals (note frequency if not used daily or per batch). (3) Identify by number the points of release, including small or intermittent releases, to the environment of the new chemical substance. If releasing to two media at the same step, assign a second release number for the second medium.

You may claim the process description or attachment as CBI. If an attached document is claimed as CBI, the system requires a sanitized version of the attached document to be uploaded. The information contained within the ‘Physical Forms and % New Substance’ field in the thick client separates into two (2) separate fields, the ‘Physical Form(s)’ field and ‘% New Substance’ field when these fields are populated via an XML file generated from the ePMN thick client. This is a required field.
- **Binding:** Check the ‘Binding’ checkbox to claim the physical form(s) information as binding.
- **% New Substance (5):** Enter the percentage of new chemical substance (if part of a mixture) at the time of exposure. A value of zero (0) entered in this field will display an error. Please pay particular attention to the information within if this field is populated via XML file. The information contained within the ‘Physical Forms and % New Substance’ field in the thick client separates into two (2) separate fields, the ‘Physical Form(s)’ field and ‘% New Substance’ field when these fields are populated via an XML file generated from the ePMN thick client. This is a required field that accepts decimal values.

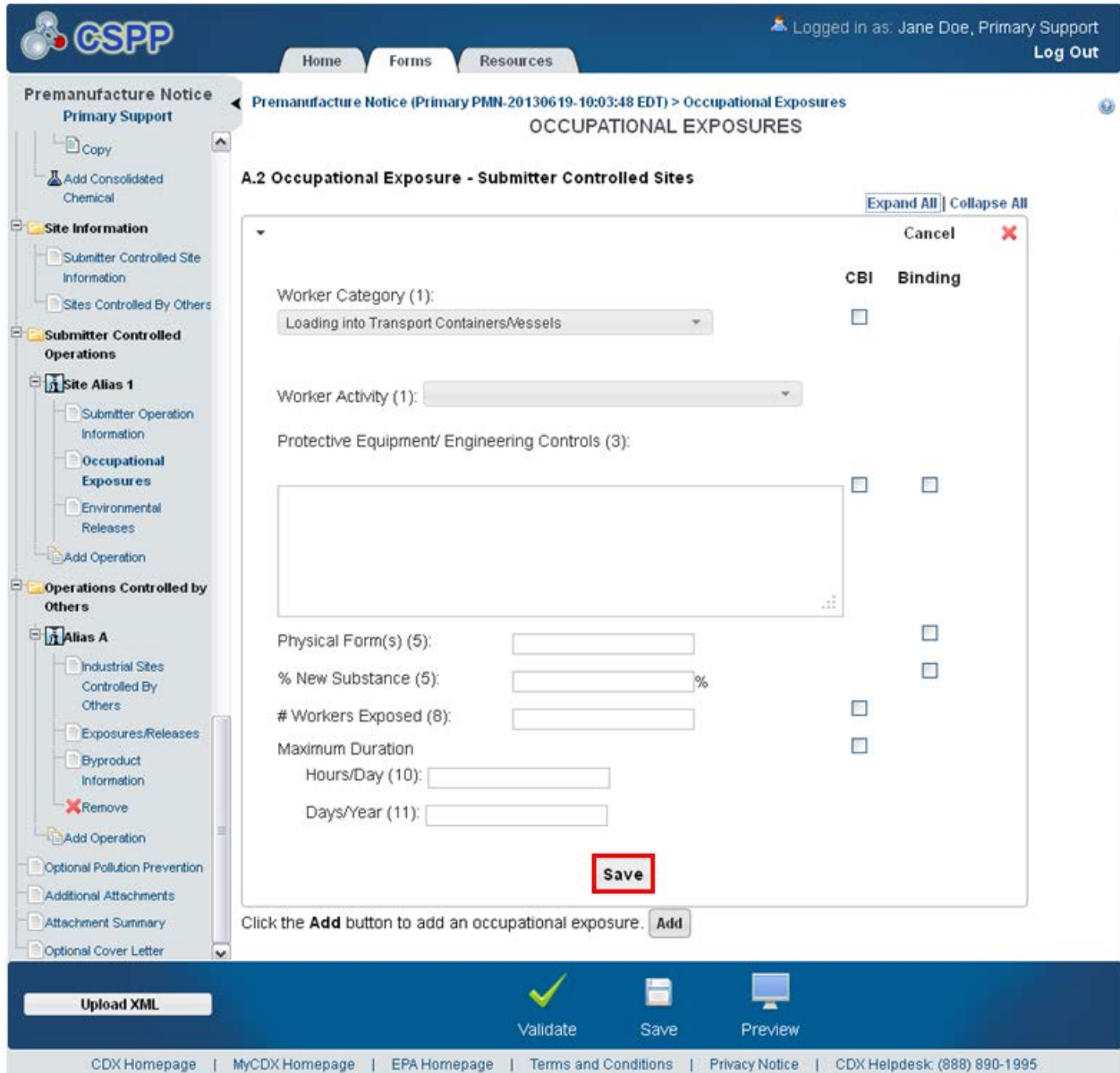

You can navigate to the ‘Environmental Releases’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Occupational Exposures’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Environmental Releases’ link within the navigation tree.

The ‘Environmental Releases’ screen captures information about the environmental release and disposal status of a particular site. The information on exposure and environmental release is related to the flow diagram/process description on the ‘Submitter Operation Information’ screen. This page is duplicated and populated for each flow diagram supplied in the PMN (manufacturing, each processing description, and any use diagrams). The information provided should focus on the PMN substance. EPA reviewers pay particular attention to human exposure and environmental release data under their TSCA mandate to protect against unreasonable risks from new chemical substances. In the absence of this information, EPA will make its own estimates of worker exposure and environmental release, which are usually conservative. You should present data that is accurate and as complete as possible.

- **Amount of new substance released to Environment kg/batch:** Select the radio button to claim that the amount of new substance released to the environment is measured in kilograms per batch.
- **Amount of new substance released to Control Technology (2b):** Enter the amount of new substance released to control technology. For each site, describe any additional disposal methods that will be used and whether the waste is subject to secondary or tertiary on-site treatment. Indicate if you want this information to bind. Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox if the information is confidential. This is a required field.
- **Binding:** Check the ‘Binding’ checkbox to claim the control technology description as binding.


- **Release after Control Technology (5b):** Enter the release after control technology. Estimate the amount released to the environment after control technology (in kilograms per day). This is a required field.
- **Save:** Click the button to save the information entered within the expandable/collapsible field set. You must click this button instead of the 'Save' icon () located within the bottom action bar to successfully save the entered information within the field set before being able to navigate away from the screen using the 'Previous' and 'Next' buttons. The 'Industrial Sites Controlled By Others' screen captures information about activities occurring at a particular site or group of sites. You will be able to enter an operation alias to identify the operation. Importers are not required to complete this section for operations outside the U.S.; however, any industrial processing or use operation that takes place after import must be described.

You will first be asked to select the site(s) and chemical(s) for the operation. You will then proceed to the next screen to enter resources concerning the operation. The system provides a field to add an operation process description.

The site(s) and chemical(s) for the operation must be identified. The system then navigates to the next screen to enter resources concerning the operation. The screen also displays a field to add an operation process description. In the operation description, include the following information: (1) Diagram the major unit operation steps and chemical conversions, including interim storage and specify transport containers (e.g., 5-gallon pails, 55-gallon drums, rail cars, tank trucks, etc.). On the diagram, identify by letter and briefly describe each worker activity. (2) Either in the diagram or in the text field, provide the identity, the approximate weight (by kg/day or kg/batch, on a 100% new chemical substance basis), and entry point of all feedstocks (including reactants, solvents and catalysts, etc.), products, recycle streams, and wastes. Include cleaning chemicals (note frequency if not used daily or per batch). (3) Either in the diagram or in the text field, identify by number the points of release, including small or intermittent releases, to the environment of the new chemical substance.

- **Operation Alias:** Enter the operation alias. This is a required field if the form is pending a Joint Submission or a Letter of Support.
- **Add Facility:** Click the button to generate the 'Add Facility' pop-up window and select a site from the drop-down menu to add to the 'Industrial Sites Controlled By Others' screen. Refer to **Section 3.9** for additional details regarding the add facility functionality.
- **Site Name:** Displays the site name.

The ‘Optional Pollution Prevention’ screen provides fields for companies to enter data about their pollution prevention efforts. The company has the option of entering information as a free text field or as an attachment. The company can claim the information as confidential by checking the ‘CBI’ checkbox.

The system allows an uploaded document to be claimed as CBI. If a document is claimed as CBI, the system requires the sanitized version of the attached document to be uploaded. To access or edit previously attached documents, click the appropriate file name of the document within the ‘File Name’ column of the document table.

The attachment table displays the file name and file extension of the document, the document description, the number of pages the document contains, and the CBI status of the document. Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) located within the 'Actions' column to delete unwanted documents.

You may provide information not reported elsewhere in this form regarding your efforts to reduce or minimize potential risks associated with activities surrounding manufacturing, processing, use, and disposal of the PMN substance. Include new information pertinent to pollution prevention, including source reduction, recycling activities and safer processes or products available due to the new chemical substance. Source reduction includes the reduction in the amount or toxicity of chemical wastes by technological modification, process and procedure modification, product reformulation, and/or raw materials substitution. Recycling refers to the reclamation of useful chemical components from wastes that would otherwise be treated or released as air emissions or water discharges, or land disposal. Quantitative or qualitative descriptions of pollution prevention, source reduction and recycling should emphasize potential risk reduction in addition to compliance with existing regulatory requirements. You should consider the entire life cycle of the PMN substance in your evaluation.

Also consider opportunities for product stewardship or other risk management controls that could significantly reduce risk characteristics of the new substance (e.g., disposal techniques that can be easily implemented and substantially reduce waste toxicity).

Initiatives in the New Chemicals Program such as Environmental Technology Initiative (ETI) for Chemicals, and the Pollution Prevention Recognition Project, are geared towards incorporating

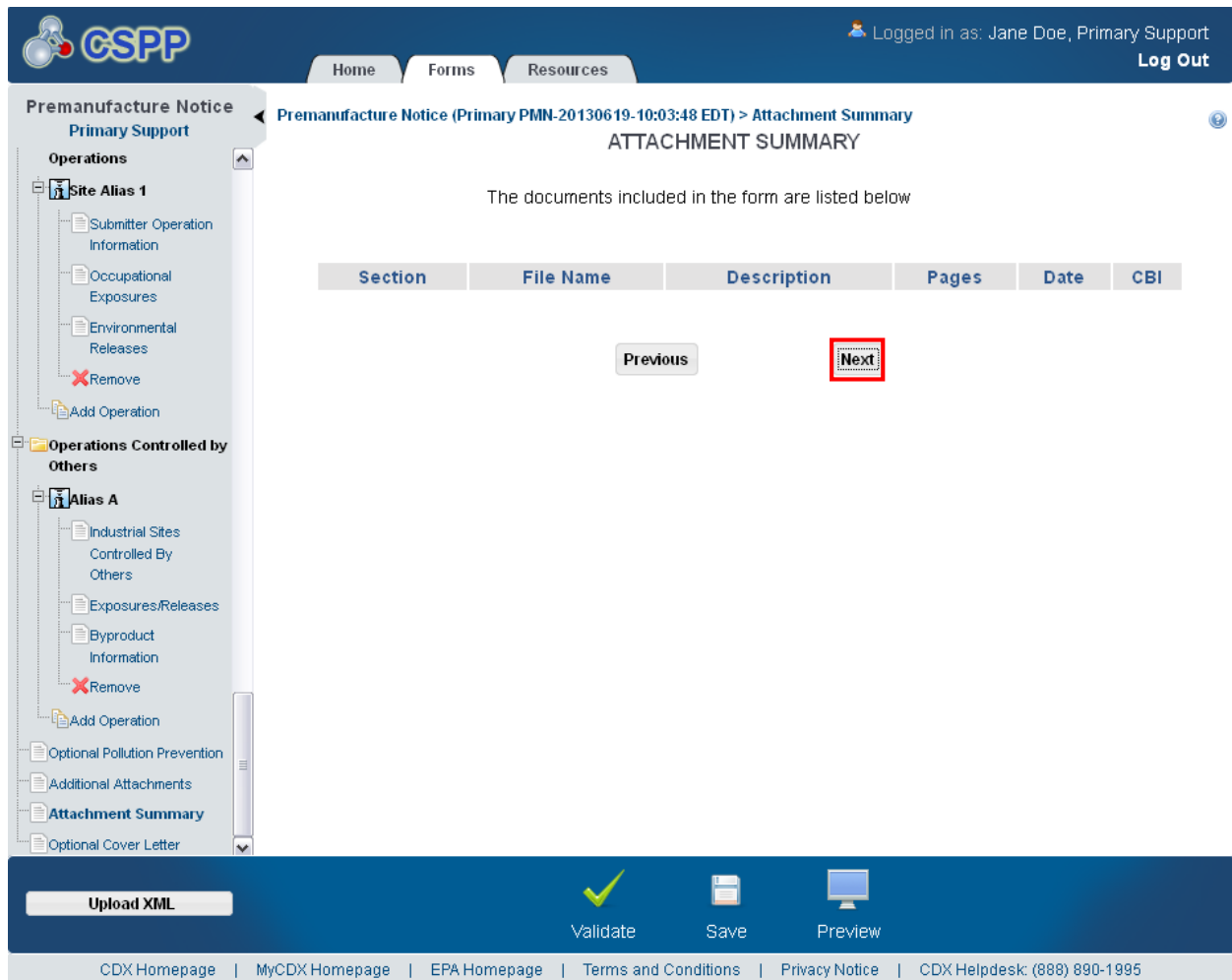

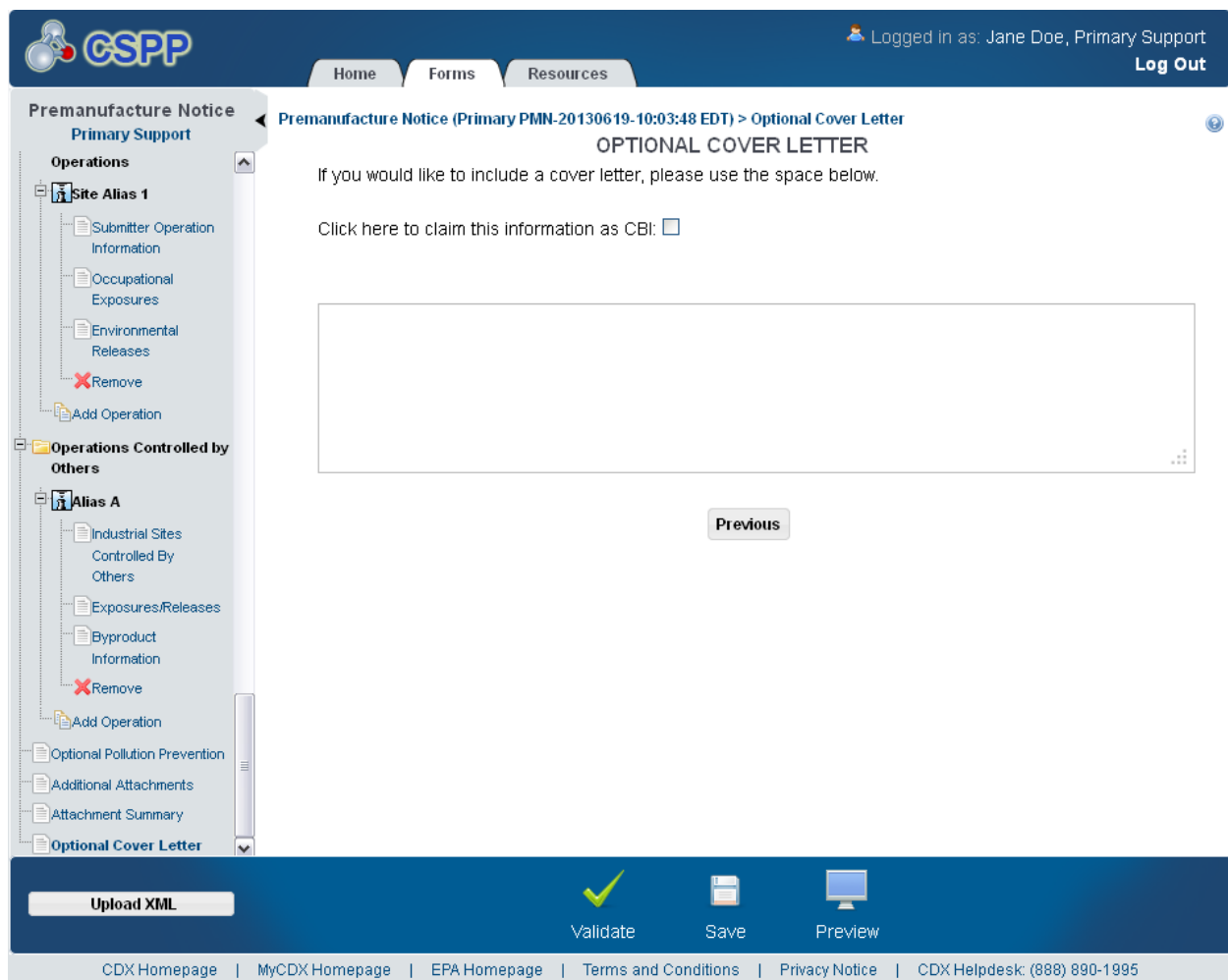

The 'Upload XML' screen is used to upload a PMN XML file (created from the PMN thick client with a file type of .pmn_tsca or the ZIP file generated from a CoR) into a current PMN form for PMN forms with numerous chemicals. You also have the option to export a current PMN form into an XML file using the 'Export XML' link. The upload XML functionality is only available for a PMN form.

If you upload an XML file into a pre-populated form, the XML file overwrites the contents of the pre-populated form. In addition, uploading any file removes the attached documents within a form, which must be re-attached. You must also add any sites identified within the form to your CDX registration profile.

After uploading a file, click the 'Preview' icon () located in the bottom action bar to view a PDF preview of the form ensuring that all the data has populated correctly and any other information is displayed accurately. In particular, ensure that the 'Letter of Activity (1),' 'Protective Equipment/Engineering Controls,' 'Physical Form,' 'Media of Release,' 'Control Technology,' and '% New Substance' fields of entry have been populated correctly.

Please note that in IE 7, if an upload fails, the action bar at the bottom of the screen might be misaligned when the 'Upload XML' screen reloads.

- **Upload archive file:** Click the button to generate the 'File Upload' window to search for the ZIP copy of record archive file populated with PMN information. The copy of record archive file must contain the XML form in a file labeled 'formdata.xml.' The application processes the ZIP copy of record archive file and displays any applicable error messages.
- **Export XML:** Click the button to generate the XML file of the current PMN form that a user can download.

5 Edit a Biotechnology Form

The Biotechnology form is used to collect information about “intergeneric” microorganisms that will be manufactured or imported into the United States. EPA collects the information provided in a Biotechnology form through a free text box and attachments. The Biotechnology form does not have a structured data format, but there are several types of Biotechnology notices that can be filed. The different types are as follows: ‘Microbial Commercial Activity Notice (MCAN),’ ‘TSCA Experimental Release Application (TERA),’ ‘Tier I Exemption,’ ‘Tier II Exemption,’ and ‘Biotechnology Test Market Exemption (TME)’ forms. All the forms have the same upload requirements, and EPA will retain responsibility for verifying the correct information is received.

5.1 Edit Biotechnology Form

To edit a Biotechnology form, navigate to the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen, and click the alias link in the ‘Alias’ column of a Biotechnology form with a status of ‘In Progress.’ Refer to **Section 3.3** for additional details regarding the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen.

Refer to **Section 3.4** for additional details regarding the enter passphrase process.

5.2 General Form Information

You can access the ‘General Form Information’ screen by clicking the alias link in the ‘Alias’ column of an ‘In Progress’ form and entering a passphrase on the ‘Enter Passphrase’ screen.

The ‘General Form Information’ screen presents a list of text fields and drop-down menus for you to input identifying information for the specific form. You will have the option to assign a ‘Form Alias’ to help you identify the form. A form alias is helpful when a user or company has multiple forms and/or when you must differentiate between forms to the help desk. Upon navigating to the ‘General Form Information’ screen, the system will auto-generate a default alias in the following format: <Form Type-YYYYMMDD-HH:MM:SS Time Zone>.

Select the submission type from the ‘Type of Submission’ drop-down menu. The ‘Type of Submission’ drop-down menu displays the following values:

- MCAN (Microbial Commercial Activity Notice)
- TERA (TSCA Experimental Release Application)
- Tier I Exemption
- Tier II Exemption
- Biotechnology TME (Text Market Exemption)

The system will provide a ‘TS Number’ field for you to enter a TS number to tie support forms or Joint Submissions to the original Biotechnology form. The TS number must be a six (6) character alphanumeric combination. The TS number should include two (2), three (3), or four (4) letters. Company names, recognizable words, and numeric series are not recommended.

The ‘Text/Comments’ text box is required when an attachment is not provided. A ‘CBI’ checkbox is displayed above the ‘Text/Comments’ text box to claim the information as confidential.

The ‘General Form Information’ screen displays the option to attach a document by clicking the ‘Attach Document’ button.

- **Form Alias:** Enter the form alias. Upon navigating to the screen, the system auto-generates an editable alias comprised of <Form Type-YYYYMMDD-HH:MM:SS Time Zone>. This is a required field.
- **Type of Submission:** Select the submission type from the drop-down menu. This drop-down menu contains the following values: ‘MCAN (Microbial Commercial Activity Notice),’ ‘TERA (TSCA Experimental Release Application),’ ‘Tier I Exemption,’ ‘Tier II Exemption,’ and ‘Biotechnology TME (Test Market Exemption).’
- **TS Number:** Enter the TS number. The TS number can be any six (6) character alphanumeric combination and should include two (2), three (3), or four (4) letters. Company names, recognizable words and numeric series are not recommended. This field is required if ‘MCAN’ is selected from the ‘Type of Submission’ drop-down menu, if a Letter of Support is pending, and/or if a joint Biotechnology form is being filed.
- **Text/Comments:** Enter a description of the form and/or attachment.
- **CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim the ‘Text/Comments’ information as confidential.
- **Attach Document:** Click the ‘Attach Document’ button to generate the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window. Upload attachments including published literature, regulations and certifications, ID data, construct data, effects data, MSDS, manufacturing details, use details, inactivation data, and/or other types of documents. At least one document is required even if a Letter of Support or Joint Submission is claimed. Please refer to **Section 3.7** for additional details regarding the attach document process.
- **File Name:** Displays the file name and file extension of a document that is uploaded on the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window.
- **Description:** Displays the description of a document.
- **Pages:** Displays the number of pages a document contains.
- **CBI:** Indicates the CBI status of a document by displaying either a ‘Y’ or an ‘N.’
- **Actions:** Click the ‘Delete’ icon (✖) to delete the entire attached document row permanently from the system. A warning message displays to confirm the deletion.
- **Check here if you are filing a consolidated Biotechnology form:** Check the ‘Check here if you are filing a consolidated Biotechnology form’ checkbox to indicate you will be submitting a consolidated form. This field is required if a value is entered in the ‘Number of Microorganisms’ text field. This field is non-editable when creating a Biotechnology amendment.
- **Number of Microorganisms:** Enter the number of microorganisms in a consolidated submission; this number should be a value from two (2) through twenty (20). This field is required if the ‘Check here if you are filing a consolidated Biotechnology form’ checkbox is checked. This field is non-editable when creating a Biotechnology amendment.
- **Check here if you are filing a joint Biotechnology form:** Check the ‘Check here if you are filing a joint Biotechnology form’ checkbox to indicate you will be submitting a joint form.
- **Check here if you have a Letter of Support pending:** Check the ‘Check here if you have a Letter of Support pending’ checkbox to indicate the form is pending a Letter of Support.

The 'Joint Submitter Information' screen presents a list of text fields and drop-down menus used to enter contact information for the joint submitter who will be submitting separate information for the Biotechnology form. The provided email address will be used to send the joint submitter the unique identification number.

- **Check here to claim this information as CBI:** Check the 'CBI' checkbox to claim the joint submitter information as confidential. When you claim CBI, you are stating that the information is confidential and should not be released to the public.
- **First Name:** Enter the joint submitter's first name. This is a required field.

- **Postal Code:** Enter the postal code of the mailing address of the joint submitter. This is a required field.
- **Country:** Displays 'United States.'

The ‘Joint Submission Information’ screen is used as a communication point between two companies. The ‘Joint Submission Information’ screen displays fields that capture information to pass to the joint submitter. A text box is used to send information to the joint submitter in an unencrypted email sent by the primary submitter. A ‘Unique Identifier for Joint Submissions’ box will also display on this screen. The unique identification number auto-generates when a user declares a joint submission is being established.

Joint Submission Process: A ‘Special Information’ field will be used to send information to the joint submitter in an email sent by the primary submitter.

When the secondary submitter accesses the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen and creates a new form, the secondary submitter will be prompted to enter the unique identification number on the ‘Create Passphrase’ screen.

- **Joint Submission Information Instructions:** Enter the information that the primary submitter is sending to the joint submitter.
- **Joint Submission Informational Text:** Displays instructional text provided by OPPT, the unique identification number automatically generated for the form, and provides functionality to email the unique identification number to the joint submitter by clicking the ‘Notify the Secondary Submitter of the Joint Submission’ link.
- **Unique Identification Number:** The unique identification number is a random number auto-generated to pass on to the joint submitter to create a joint submission.



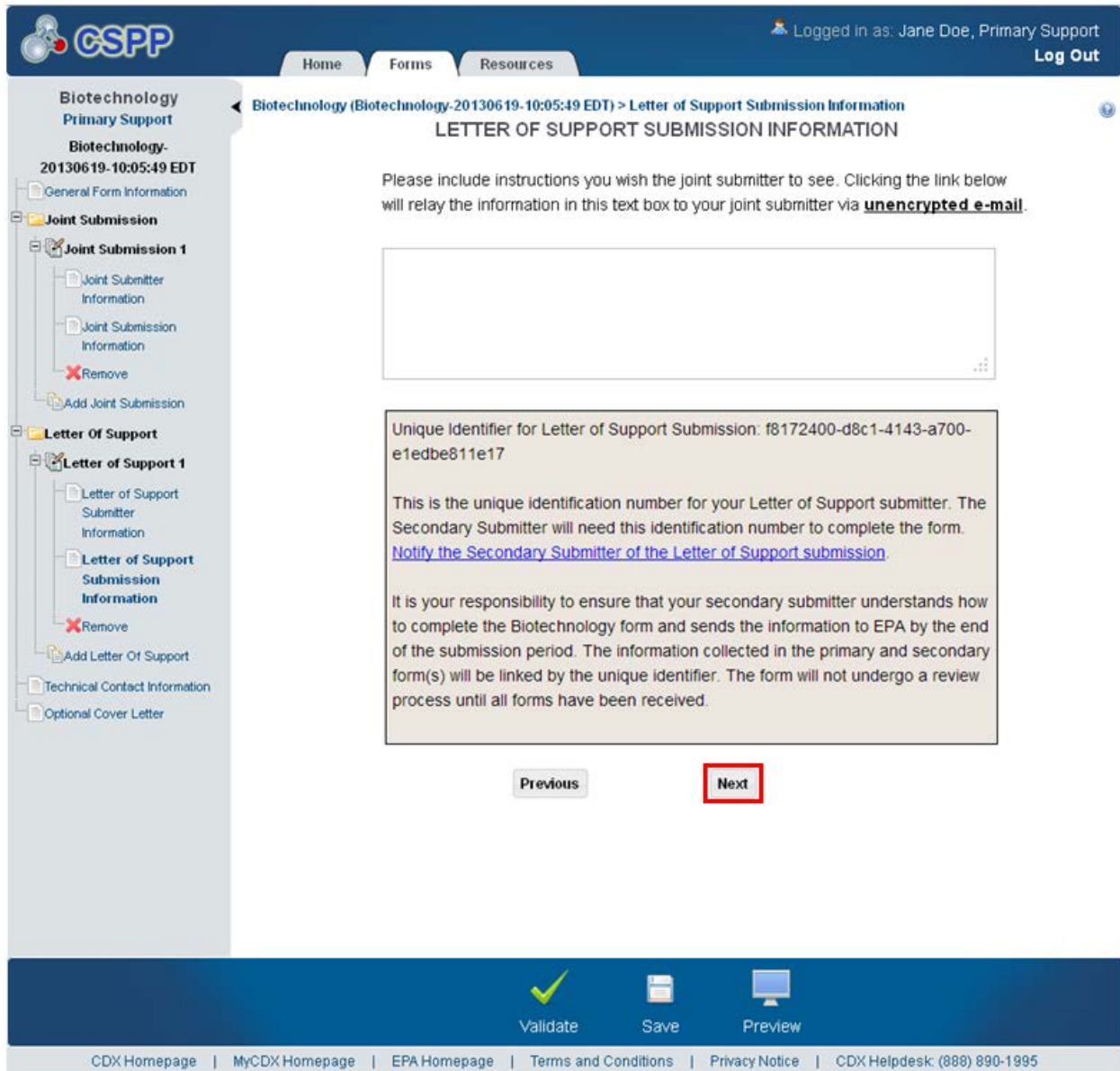



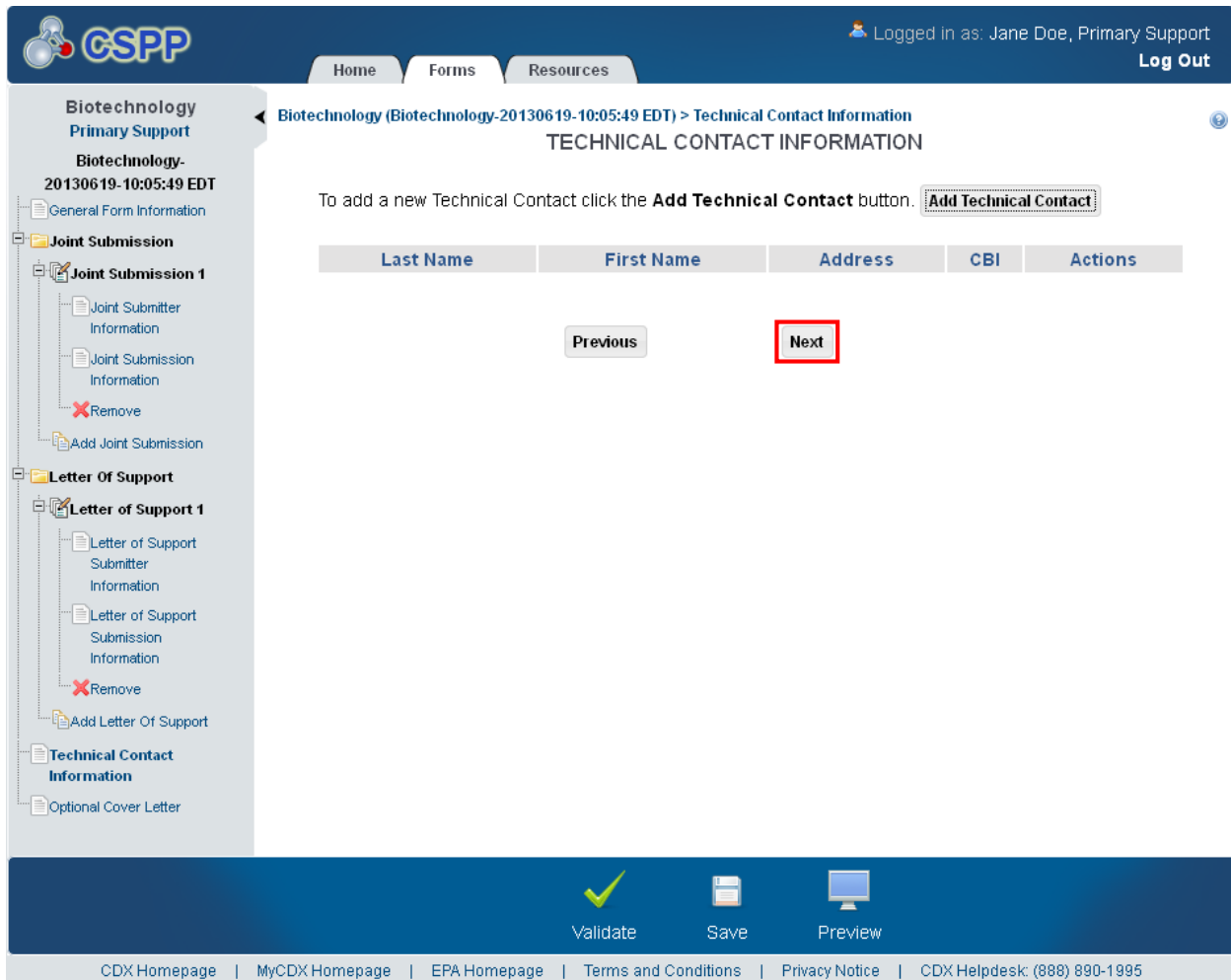

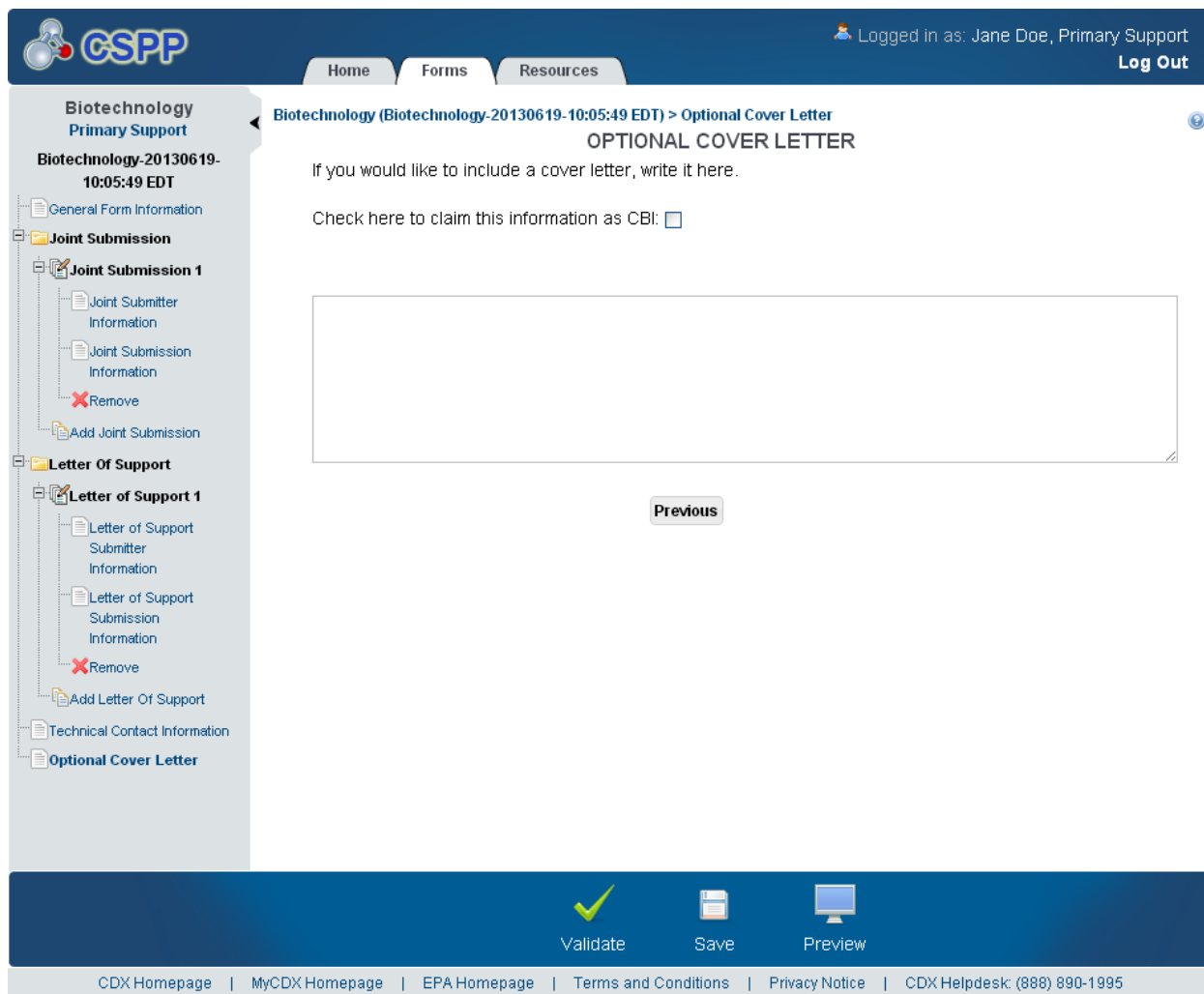

6 Edit Notice of Commencement (NOC) Form

The Notice of Commencement (NOC) form allows industry users to notify EPA when a new chemical or microorganism, submitted under a Biotechnology or PMN form, has already started manufacture or import. A NOC form cannot be submitted before the chemical or microorganism has gone through the review period by EPA. The NOC must be submitted within thirty (30) days after the start date of the first manufacture or import.

6.1 Edit NOC Form

To edit a NOC form, navigate to the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen and click the alias link in the ‘Alias’ column of a NOC form with a status of ‘In Progress.’ Refer to **Section 3.3** for additional details regarding the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen.

Refer to **Section 3.4** for additional details regarding the enter passphrase process.

6.2 General Form Information

You can access the ‘General Form Information’ screen by clicking the alias link in the ‘Alias’ column of an ‘In Progress’ form and entering a passphrase on the ‘Enter Passphrase’ screen. This screen provides fields to identify information that notifies EPA of the form alias, case number, and manufacture or import information.

The ‘General Form Information’ screen presents a list of text fields and drop-down menus to input information about the originally filed form. The ‘Manufacture/Import Information’ field presents radio buttons for you to state whether the company intends to manufacture or import the new chemical substance. When a manufacture/import radio button is selected, a calendar widget appears for you to enter the date of commencement.

- **Form Alias:** Enter a custom form alias, if applicable. Upon navigating to the screen, the system auto-generates an editable form alias in the following format: <Form Type-YYYYMMDD-HH:MM:SS Time Zone>. This is a required field.
- **Case Number:** Enter the case number pertaining to the reported chemical substance or mixture. The case number must be in the following format: P-XX-0999 for Premanufacture Notice cases or J-XX-0999 for MCAN Biotechnology cases where ‘XX’ indicates the fiscal year in which the case number is generated, and the leading ‘0’ is required. This is a required field.
- **First Commercial Manufacture:** Enter the date for the first commercial manufacture. A calendar widget appears when the radio button is selected to select the appropriate date. If you select a future date past the current date, an error displays when navigating away from the screen. Either the ‘First Commercial Manufacture’ radio button or the ‘First Commercial Importation’ field is required.
- **First Commercial Importation:** Enter the date for the first commercial importation. A calendar widget appears when the radio button is selected to select the appropriate date. If you select a future date past the current date, an error displays when navigating away from the screen. Either the ‘First Commercial Manufacture’ or the ‘First Commercial Importation’ field is required.

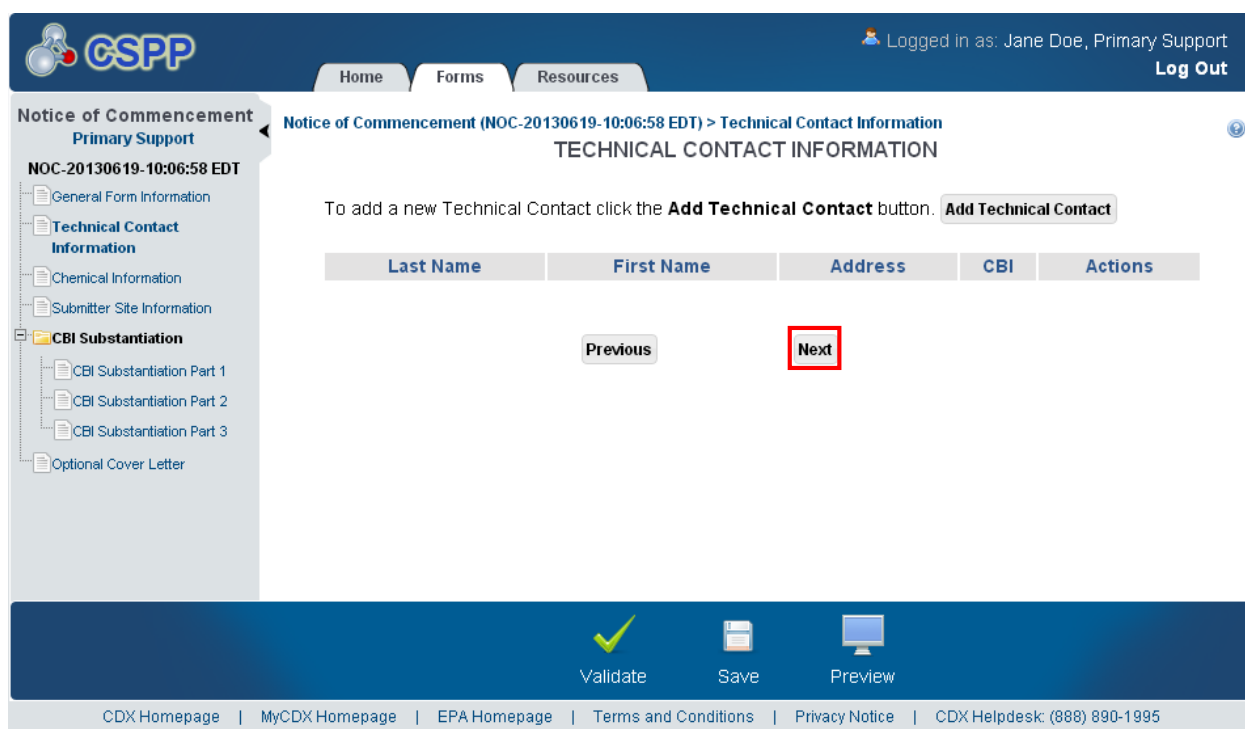

6.4 Chemical Information




You can access the 'Chemical Information' screen by clicking the 'Next' button from the 'Technical Contact Information' screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the 'Chemical Information' link within the navigation tree.

The 'Chemical Information' screen provides fields to identify the chemical the submitter has begun to manufacture or import. The 'Specific Chemical Identity' section provides fields to input information describing the chemical for which the NOC is to be filed. This screen outlines the unique chemical properties and displays the name and CASRN of the chemical. Most of the

chemicals submitted under a NOC will not be found in the ‘Search Substance Registry Services’ window, and a new chemical will have to be created. To create a new chemical, click the ‘Search SRS’ button, found in the ‘Chemical Information’ screen, and then the ‘Create New Chemical’ button to generate the ‘Chemical Not Found In Substance Registry Services’ pop-up window.

If you claim a chemical as CBI, the ‘Generic Chemical Name’ text box generates. A ‘CBI Substantiation’ folder displays within the navigation tree upon navigating away from the screen.

If you claim chemical identity as confidential, you must provide a generic chemical name for your substance that reveals the specific chemical identity of the new chemical substance to the maximum extent possible. Please note that EPA will be closely assessing the generic name at this time; please make sure that your generic name is a good generic name that only hides the proprietary parts of the chemical information.

- **Add New Chemical:** Click the ‘Add New Chemical’ button to generate the ‘Specific Chemical Identity’ expandable/collapsible field set. At least one chemical is required.
- **Search SRS:** Click the ‘Search SRS’ button to generate the ‘Search SRS’ window. Refer to **Section 3.8** for additional details regarding the search SRS functionality.
- **CASRN:** Displays the CASRN of the chemical being reported, if applicable.
- **Chemical Name:** Displays the chemical name of the substance being reported.
- **CBI:** Check the ‘CBI’ checkbox to claim the ‘Specific Chemical Identity’ information as confidential and generate the ‘Generic Chemical Name’ text box. If you claim the chemical as confidential, a ‘CBI Substantiation’ folder displays within the navigation tree after clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Chemical Information’ screen.
- **Generic Chemical Name:** Enter the generic name to associate with a chemical. This field displays only when the ‘Specific Chemical Identity’ is claimed CBI.
- **Save:** Click the button to save the information entered within the expandable/collapsible field set. You must click this button instead of the ‘Save’ icon () located within the bottom action bar to successfully save the entered information within the field set before being able to navigate away from the screen using the ‘Previous’ and ‘Next’ buttons. Refer to **Section 3.6** for more information regarding the save functionality in an expandable/collapsible field set.
- **Cancel:** Click the ‘Cancel’ link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to prevent edits from saving and to remove a field set. The ‘Cancel’ link is displayed when the expandable/collapsible field set is open for editing. A confirmation message displays to confirm the action.
- **Edit:** Click the ‘Edit’ link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to modify the information entered in the fields. The ‘Edit’ link is displayed when the expandable/collapsible field set has been saved and the data is not currently editable.
- **Delete:** Click the ‘Delete’ icon () located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to delete the field set. A confirmation message displays to confirm the deletion. The ‘Delete’ icon () is displayed when the user has clicked the ‘Add New Chemical’ button.
- **Expand All:** Click the link located at the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field sets to expand a series of field sets.

- **Collapse All:** Click the link located at the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field sets to collapse a series of field sets.
- **Substance Identity Confidentiality Status:** You will only be able to select a single radio button. If you claim the chemical as CBI, after clicking the ‘Save’ button in the ‘Specific Chemical Identity’ expandable/collapsible field set, the system will enable the first radio button and disable the second and third radio buttons. If you do not claim the chemical as CBI, after clicking the ‘Save’ button in the ‘Specific Chemical Identity’ expandable/collapsible field set, the system will disable the first radio button and enable the second and third radio button options. This section displays the following options:

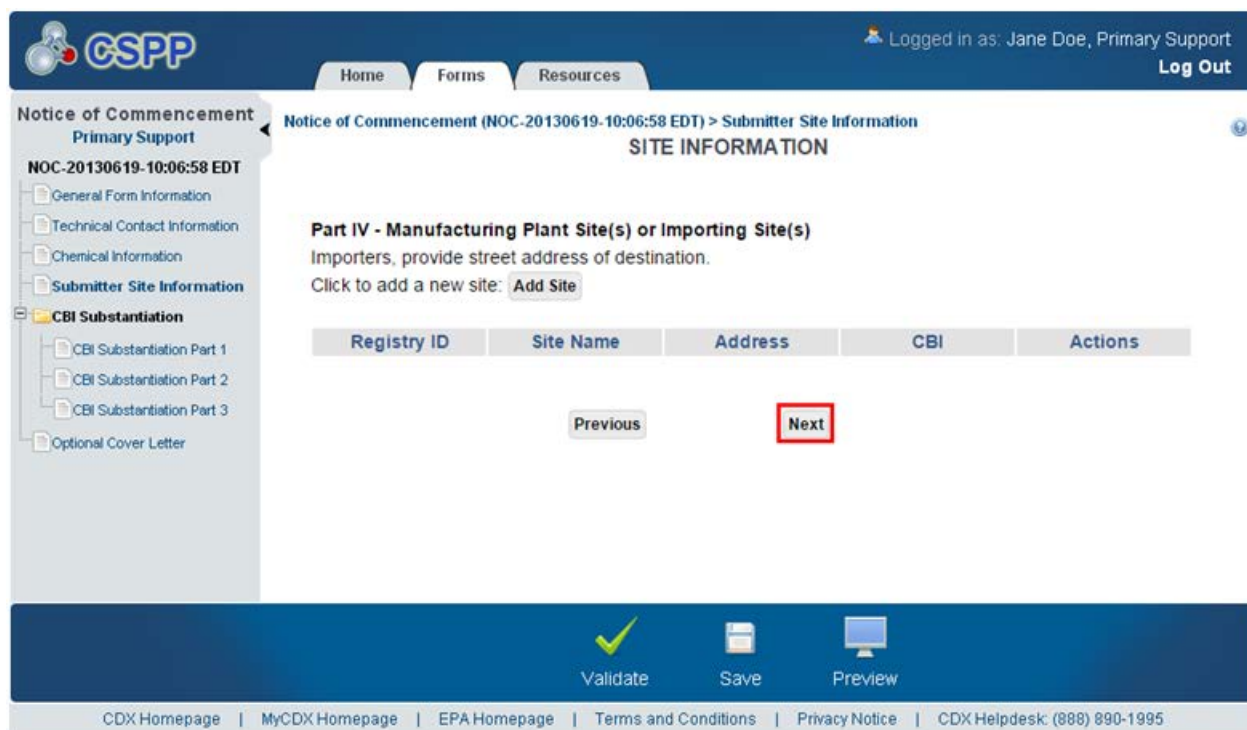

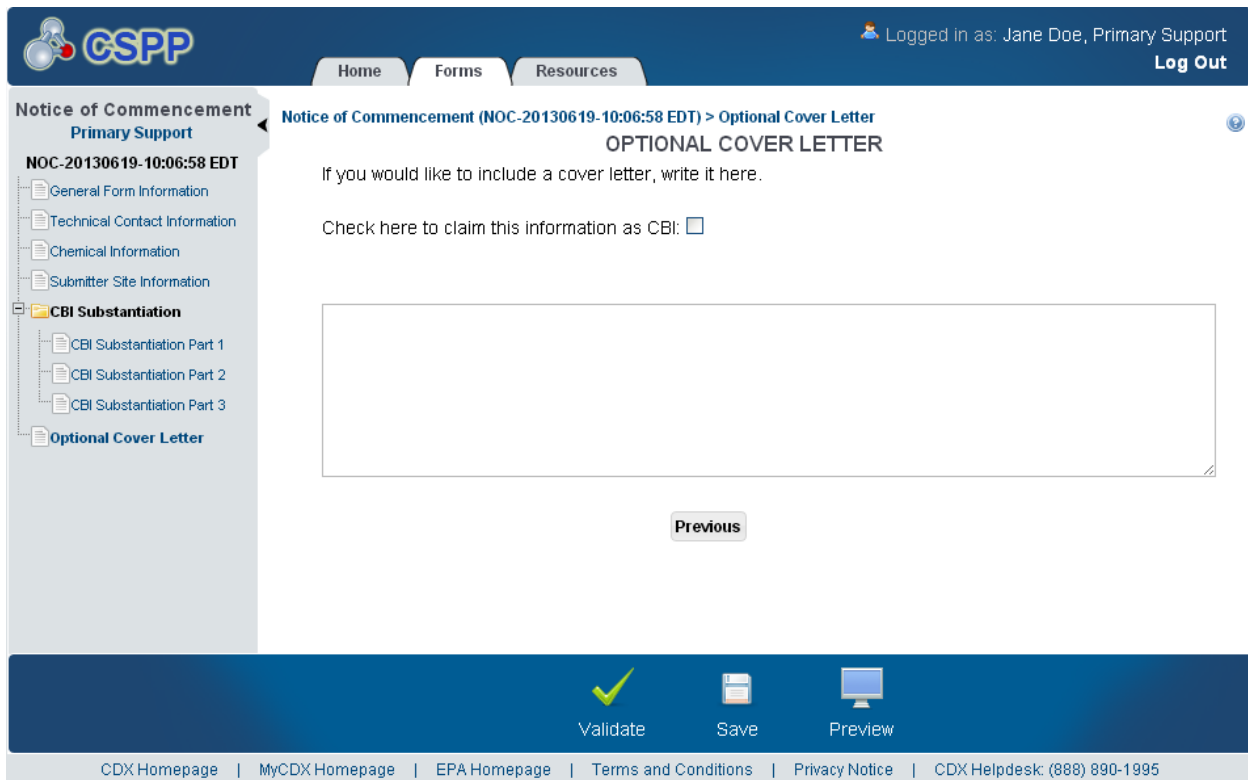

7 Edit Support Form

The Section 5 Notices and Supports application allows support forms to be submitted such as ‘Amendment,’ ‘Other Correspondence,’ ‘Suspension Request,’ ‘Transfer of Ownership,’ ‘Withdrawal Requests,’ and ‘Test Data.’ Support forms are filed separately from PMN forms due to access restrictions and/or to provide information not included in the original PMN. The Support form is used to supplement the original PMN by providing additional data that was not provided originally, withdraw a PMN application, or provide data that was requested later.

7.1 Edit Support Form

To edit a Support form, navigate to the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen and click the alias link in the ‘Alias’ column of a form with a status of ‘In Progress.’ Refer to **Section 3.3** for additional details regarding the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen.

Refer to **Section 3.4** for additional details regarding the enter passphrase process.

7.2 General Form Information

You can access the ‘General Form Information’ screen by entering a passphrase on the ‘Enter Passphrase’ screen or creating a passphrase on the ‘Create Passphrase’ screen.

The ‘General Form Information’ screen provides a list of text fields and drop-down menus for you to input information about the originally filed form.

Please note that if you are using IE 7, the action bar icons may be misaligned and hovering over the ‘Next’ button on this screen causes the button to move. In addition, the calendar widget next to the ‘Original Submission Date’ text field will be misaligned.

- **Form Alias:** Enter the form alias. Upon navigating to the screen, the system auto-generates an editable form alias comprised of <Form Type-YYYYMMDD-HH:MM:SS Time Zone>. This is a required field.
- **Case Number:** Enter the case number that connects to the original submission in the system. This is a type-ahead field that displays the forms that have been submitted under the same organization. If the case number is in the application, the remaining fields on the ‘General Form Information’ screen will populate. The ‘Original Submitter Information’ screen will also populate for forms created within the thin client. In the case of legacy submissions, case numbers must be manually entered. The case number must be in one of the following formats: P-XX-XXXX for PMN, SN-XX-XXXX for SNUN, L-XX-XXXX for LVE, LM-XX-XXXX for LVE Modifications, X-XX-XXXX for LOREX, XM-XX-XXXX for LOREX Modifications, T-XX-XXXX for TMEA, I-XX-XXXX for Mock PMN, J-XX-XXXX for MCAN, R-XX-XXXX for TERA, G-XX-XXXX for Tier-I, H-XX-XXXX for Tier-II, or BF-XX-XXXX for Bona Fide. This field does not accept -0000 as a case number suffix. This is a required field.
- **TS Number:** Enter the TS number; this field accepts any six (6) character alphanumeric combination. This value is determined by the company in order to identify the form for both payments and connecting related submissions (Letters of Support, Joint Submissions and corrections). The TS number should include two (2), three (3), or four (4) letters. Company names, recognizable words, and numeric series are not recommended.






- **Type of Support:** Select the type of support from the drop-down menu. This field contains the following values: ‘Amendment,’ ‘Suspension Request,’ ‘Test Data,’ ‘Transfer of Ownership,’ ‘Withdrawal Request,’ and ‘Other Correspondence.’ The ‘Amendment’ type is unavailable when creating an amendment. This is a required field.
- **Check if requested by EPA/Contractor:** Check the ‘Check if requested by EPA/Contractor’ checkbox to display fields to enter information to identify the requestor that asked you to submit support information.
- **Last Name:** Enter the requestor’s last name. This field displays if the ‘Check if requested by EPA/Contractor’ checkbox is checked and is required if displayed.
- **First Name:** Enter the requestor’s first name. This field displays if the ‘Check if requested by EPA/Contractor’ checkbox is checked and is required if displayed.
- **EPA/Contractor:** Select a value from the drop-down menu to identify whether the requestor is an EPA official, a contractor, or unknown. This drop-down menu contains the following options: ‘EPA,’ ‘Contractor,’ and ‘Unknown.’

- **File Name:** Displays the file name and file extension of a file that is uploaded on the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window.
- **Description:** Displays the description of a file that is uploaded on the ‘Attach Documents’ pop-up window.
- **Subtype:** Displays the subtype of a document.
- **Pages:** Displays the number of pages a document contains.
- **CBI:** Indicates the CBI status of a document by displaying either a ‘Y’ or an ‘N.’
- **Actions:** Click the ‘Delete’ icon () to delete the entire attached document row permanently from the system. A warning message displays to confirm the deletion.

8 Edit Bona Fide Form

The purpose of the Bona Fide module is to receive an official determination from EPA as to whether a substance is on the TSCA inventory. Submitters may attempt to avoid submitting a PMN by completing a Bona Fide form to establish that the chemical already exists on the inventory. The Bona Fide process is covered in a thirty (30) day period.

8.1 Edit Bona Fide Form

To edit a Bona Fide form, navigate to the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen and click the alias link in the ‘Alias’ column of a Bona Fide form with a status of ‘In Progress.’ Refer to **Section 3.3** for additional details regarding the ‘Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms’ screen.

Refer to **Section 3.4** for additional details regarding the enter passphrase process.

8.2 General Document Information

You can access the ‘General Document Information’ screen by accessing a Section 5 Notices and Supports Bona Fide form that is ‘In Progress’ and entering the passphrase associated with the selected form.

The ‘General Document Information’ screen presents text fields and checkboxes for you to input identifying information for the specific form. You will have the option to assign a ‘Form Alias’ by which the form can be identified. The form alias is helpful when you or the company has multiple forms and/or when you must differentiate between forms to the help desk. If a form alias is not entered, the system will provide an editable default alias in the following format: <Form Type-YYYYMMDD-HH:MM:SS Time Zone>.

You can claim the entirety of the submission as CBI. The entire submission will be claimed as CBI if you check the ‘I claim the entirety of the submission as CBI’ checkbox. The entire submission will be considered non-CBI if you leave the ‘I claim the entirety of the submission as CBI’ checkbox unchecked.

You can indicate that a technical contact will be identified by checking the ‘Technical Contact’ checkbox. The technical contact must possess sufficient knowledge to answer any questions EPA may have about the chemical reported in the form. The application will display a ‘Technical Contact Information’ screen when you check the ‘Technical Contact’ checkbox.

You can indicate that a Letter of Support is expected to be filed by a secondary submitter by checking the ‘Letter of Support’ checkbox. The Letter of Support shall be submitted by a Secondary Authorized Official. They will have a unique identification number that will link the submissions. The unique identification number will be sent to the Letter of Support submitter, via email, and the unique identifier will link the two forms together.

You can indicate that you are submitting on behalf of another company by checking the ‘Submitting on Behalf of Company’ checkbox. The ‘Submitting on Behalf of Company’ screen presents a list of text fields for you to input contact information for the company on whose behalf the submission is being made when submitting on behalf of another company. The application will display a ‘Submitting on Behalf of Company’ screen during the submission process when you check the ‘Submitting on Behalf of Company’ checkbox.

- **Form Alias:** Edit the form alias if necessary. Upon navigating to the screen, the screen will auto-generate an editable form alias in the following format: <Form Type-YYYYMMDD-HH:MM:SS Time Zone>. This is a required field.

- **Mailing Address 2:** Enter the second line of the Letter of Support submitter's mailing address.
- **City:** Enter the city of the Letter of Support submitter's mailing address. This is a required field.
- **State:** Select the state of the Letter of Support submitter's mailing address from the drop-down menu. This is a required field when the 'Country' field is identified as 'United States.'
- **Postal Code:** Enter the postal code of the Letter of Support submitter's mailing address. This is a required field.
- **Country:** Select the country of the Letter of Support submitter's mailing address from the drop-down menu. This is a required field.

8.7 Letter of Support Submission Information

You can access the ‘Letter of Support Submission Information’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Letter of Support Submitter Information’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Letter of Support Submission Information’ link within the navigation tree.

The ‘Letter of Support Submission Information’ screen is used as a communication point between two companies. The ‘Letter of Support Submission Information’ screen displays a comment box for you to enter information that will be passed on to the Letter of Support

submitter. A text field will be used to send information to the Letter of Support submitter in an email sent by the primary submitter. A 'Unique Identification Number for Letter of Support Submissions' box will also display on this screen. The unique identification number is generated when you declare a Letter of Support submission is being established.

Letter of Support Submission Process: When you designate that a Letter of Support submission is being filed, you will be asked to enter all the information within the 'Letter of Support Submission' folder. The forms from the primary submitter will be linked, but not combined by the system.

When the primary submitter chooses to notify the Letter of Support submitter of the unique identification number, the system will send an email to the Letter of Support submitter designated on the 'Letter of Support Submitter Information' screen. The email will contain the 'Unique Identifier Number' that will link the two forms.

When the Letter of Support submitter accesses the 'Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms' screen and creates a form to be filed, the user will be prompted to enter the unique identification number on the 'Create Passphrase' screen. Once the unique identification number has been entered, the system will link the primary and Letter of Support forms. You may add additional Letters of Supports by clicking the 'Add Letter of Support' link within the navigation tree.

- **Letter of Support Submission Information Instructions:** Enter the information that the Primary AO is sending to the Letter of Support submitter.
- **Letter of Support Submission Informational Text:** Displays instructional text provided by OPPT, the unique identifier number generated for the form, and allows you to email the unique identifier number to the Letter of Support submitter by clicking the 'Notify the Secondary Submitter of the letter of support submission' link.
- **Unique Identification Number:** The unique identification number is a random number auto-generated to pass on to the Letter of Support submitter to create a Letter of Support submission.



- **From:** Displays the email address of the Primary AO that created the form.

- **Message:** Displays a pre-determined message in the email sent to a Letter of Support submitter.
- **Additional Comments:** Enter any other additional comments or instructions to be passed onto the Letter of Support submitter.
- **Send:** Click the ‘Send’ button to generate and send the email to the email addresses identified in the ‘CC’ and ‘To’ fields.

8.8 Chemical Identification Information

You can access the ‘Chemical Identification Information’ screen by clicking the ‘Next’ button from the ‘Statement of Intent’ screen if you left the ‘Letter of Support’ checkbox unchecked on the ‘General Document Information’ screen. You can also access the ‘Chemical Identification Information’ screen from the ‘Letter of Support Submission Information’ screen if you checked the ‘Letter of Support’ checkbox on the ‘General Document Information’ screen. You can also access this screen by clicking the ‘Chemical Identification Information’ link within the navigation tree.

The ‘Chemical Identification Information’ screen identifies the type of chemical the submitter will be entering into the application. You will be able to file a Bona Fide form for a class 1 or 2/Biotechnology chemical substance or a polymer. Based on your selection, the appropriate screens for the respective chemical will appear.

This screen also provides a text field for you to identify an alias for the chemical substance. The chemical alias is required if a Letter of Support is being filed.

- **Class 1 or 2/Biotechnology Chemical Substance:** Select the ‘Class 1 or 2/Biotechnology Chemical Substance’ radio button to indicate that the chemical is a class 1 or 2/biotechnology substance. If you select the ‘Polymer’ radio button after initially selecting the ‘Class 1 or 2/Biotechnology Chemical Substance’ radio button, the application generates a notification message warning you that you will lose all data for this chemical if the chemical type changes. The user is required to select one of the two radio button options displayed in the ‘Chemical Type’ section.
- **Polymer:** Select the ‘Polymer’ radio button to indicate that the chemical is a polymer. If you select the ‘Class 1 or 2/Biotechnology Chemical Substance’ radio button after initially selecting the ‘Polymer’ radio button, the application generates a notification message warning you that you will lose all data for this chemical if the chemical type changes. The user is required to select one of the two radio button options displayed in the ‘Chemical Type’ section.
- **Chemical Alias:** Enter the chemical alias to associate with a chemical. This is a required field only if a Letter of Support is being filed.

If you selected the ‘Class 1 or 2/Biotechnology Chemical Substance’ radio button, click the ‘Next’ button to navigate to the ‘Class 1 or 2/Biotechnology Chemical Substances’ screen.

The ‘Class 1 or 2/Biotechnology Chemical Substances’ screen provides fields for you to enter information describing the chemical for the Bona Fide which is to be filed, including its name, composition, and structure.

You can add a chemical component by clicking the 'Add New Chemical' button. Upon clicking the 'Add New Chemical' button, an expandable/collapsible field set generates that contains numerous fields to identify the chemical in question. You will be able to enter multiple chemical substances, each with unique information, by clicking the 'Add New Chemical' button for each chemical substance you wish to identify.

After the document(s) is/are attached and you have clicked the 'OK' button, the 'Attach Chemical Structure' pop-up window closes and the document information will be displayed in a table format on the 'Class 1 or 2/Biotechnology Chemical Substances' screen. The attachment table displays the file name of the document and user-provided description of the document. The system allows you to delete unwanted documents by clicking the 'Delete' icon (✖) located under the 'Actions' column. To access or edit previously attached documents, click the appropriate file name of the document within the 'File Name' column of the attachment table.

Please note that if you are using IE 7, part of the content on this screen displays behind the Bona Fide navigation tree and certain fields on this screen may display twice.

If multiple class 2 chemical substances are added, one 'Class 2/Biotechnology Substances' screen will apply to all chemical substances.
- **Add Chemical ID:** You can access the 'Add Chemical ID' pop-up window by clicking the 'Add Chemical ID' button within the 'Chemical Identification Information' field set. You can search for the reported chemical(s) either by the 'CASRN' or 'CA Index Name or Other Synonym.' If you retrieve zero results, the system provides fields for you to enter the chemical information by filling in the 'Chemical Name' and the 'Chemical Abstract Services Registry Number' under the manual entry field set. The system provides functionality to enter the

selected chemical by clicking the 'OK' button located at the bottom of the 'Add Chemical ID' window.

- **Chemical Name:** The system provides fields for you to identify the 'Chemical Name' and the 'CASRN' (if available). The system provides functionality for you to search for the chemical substance using the 'Add Chemical ID' search or manually enter the chemical information in the 'Add Chemical ID' pop-up.
- **ID Method:** The system shall require that you identify which ID method was used to determine the chemical identity. If you select 'Method 1,' you are required to attach an IES report. You can also select 'Method 2 (Other Method).'
- **Attach IES Report:** To access the 'Attach IES Report' pop-up window, click the 'Attach IES Report' button that displays within the 'Chemical Identification Information' field set. After you attach the document(s), and click the 'OK' button, the 'Attach IES Report' pop-up window will close and the document information will be displayed in a table format on the 'Class 1 or 2/Biotechnology Chemical Substances' screen. The document attachment table displays the file name of the document(s) and the user-provided description of the document(s). Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) located under the 'Actions' column to delete unwanted documents. Click the file name link under the 'File Name' column to access or edit previously attached documents.
- **Molecular Formula:** Enter a molecular formula in a text field using a free text format. This field is optional.

- **Attach Chemical Structure:** Click the 'Attach Chemical Structure' button within the 'Chemical Identification Information' field set to access the 'Attach Chemical Structure' pop-up window. You can attach the file(s) and enter a description of the document regarding the chemical structure.
- **File Name:** Displays the file name and file extension of the file that is uploaded on the 'Attach Chemical Structure' window.
- **Description:** Displays the description of the chemical structure.
- **Actions:** Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) to delete the entire attached chemical structure row permanently from the system. A warning message displays to confirm the deletion of the document.
- **Save:** Click the button to save the information entered within the expandable/collapsible field set. You must click this button instead of the 'Save' icon (💾) located within the bottom action bar to successfully save the entered information within the field set before being able to navigate away from the screen using the 'Previous' and 'Next' buttons. Refer to **Section 3.6** for more information regarding the save functionality in an expandable/collapsible field set.

The 'Class 2/Biotechnology Substances' screen provides fields for you to enter in information regarding a class 2/biotechnology chemical substance. A class 2/biotechnology chemical substance is a substance that may not have a defined chemical structure that has been identified. This screen provides fields for you to identify specific elements in the creation of the chemical using the following fields: 'Precursor Substances,' 'Nature of Reaction,' and 'Range of Composition (Optional).'

You will be able to enter precursor substances by searching SRS or by the manual entry fields when the substance is not in SRS. The substances will display in a table listing the 'Chemical Name' and CASRN.

The system provides fields for you to capture 'Nature of Reaction' and 'Range of Composition' in text boxes. The text boxes for both 'Nature of Reaction' and 'Range of Composition' can be claimed as CBI.

The system provides numerous fields for you to enter multiple chemical substances, each with unique information, by clicking the 'Add New Chemical' button for each chemical you wish to identify.

Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) located under the 'Actions' column to delete unwanted documents. Click the file name link under the 'File Name' column to access or edit previously attached documents.
- **Chemical Structure Diagram:** The system allows you to attach a chemical structure diagram. This field is optional.
- **Attach Chemical Structure:** Click the 'Attach Chemical Structure' button within the 'Polymer Identification Information' field set to access the 'Attach Chemical Structure' pop-up window. You can attach the file(s) and enter a description of the document.
- **File Name:** Displays the file name and file extension of the document that is uploaded on the 'Attach Chemical Structure' window.
- **Description:** Displays the description of the chemical structure.
- **Actions:** Click the 'Delete' icon (✖) to delete the entire attached chemical structure row permanently from the system. A warning message displays to confirm the deletion.

- **Add Monomer:** Click the 'Add Monomer' button to generate an expandable/collapsible field set.
- **Cancel:** Click the 'Cancel' link located in the upper right-hand corner of the expandable/collapsible field set to prevent edits from saving and to remove a field set. The 'Cancel' link displays when the expandable/collapsible field set is open for editing. A confirmation message displays to confirm the action.

If the value entered is less than or equal to '2' a warning will be displayed in the global 'Validate' function or during the submission process indicating that the 'Typical Composition' is a value that is less than or equal to 2% and asking the user whether it should be included in the 'Chemical Identity.' This is a required field.

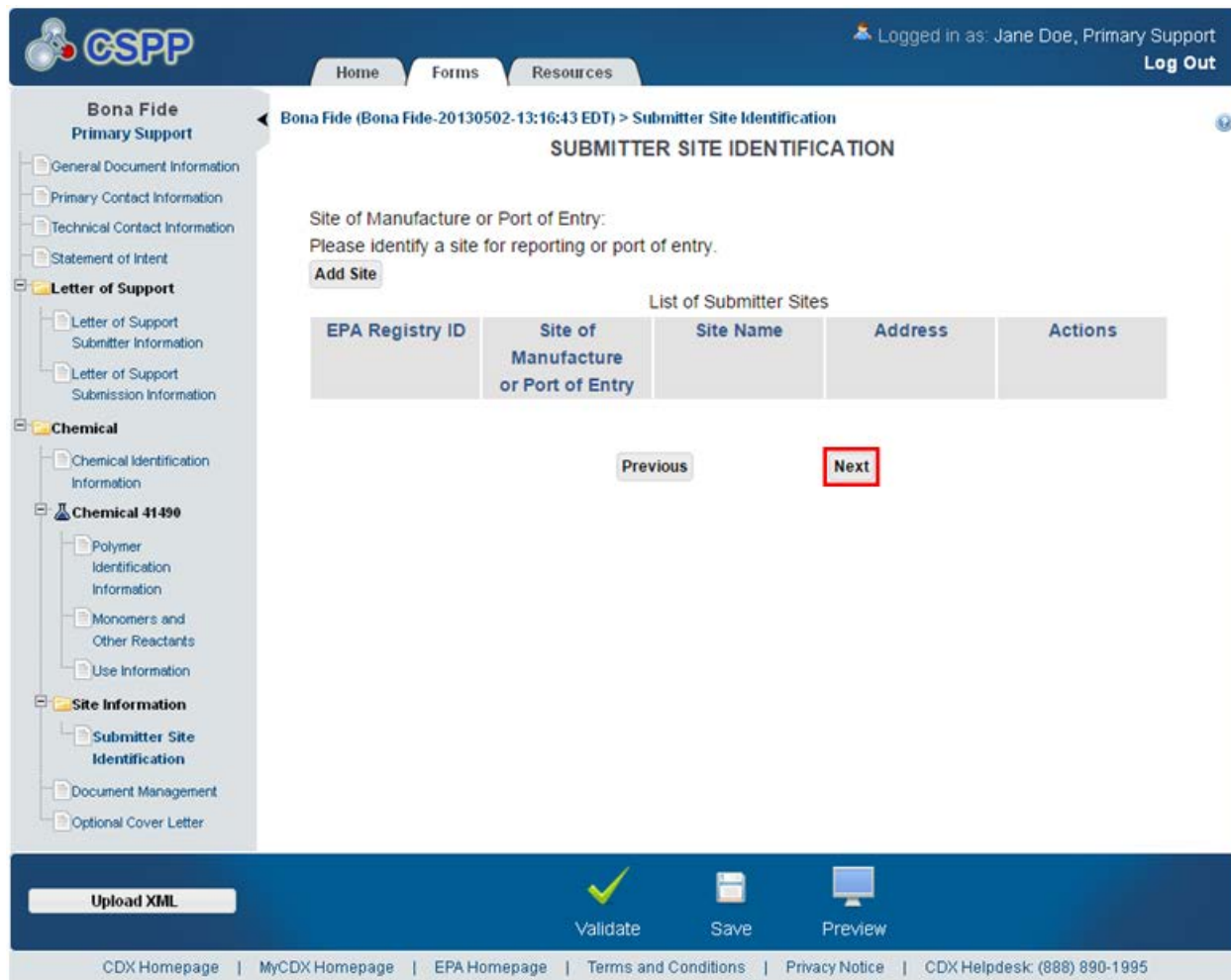

To edit an ACM form, navigate to the 'Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms' screen and click the alias link in the 'Alias' column of an ACM form with a status of 'In Progress.' Refer to **Section 3.3** for additional details regarding the 'Section 5 Notices and Supports Forms' screen.

Refer to **Section 3.4** for additional details regarding the enter passphrase process.

9.2 Contact Information

You can access the 'Contact Information' screen by entering a passphrase in the 'Enter Passphrase' screen.

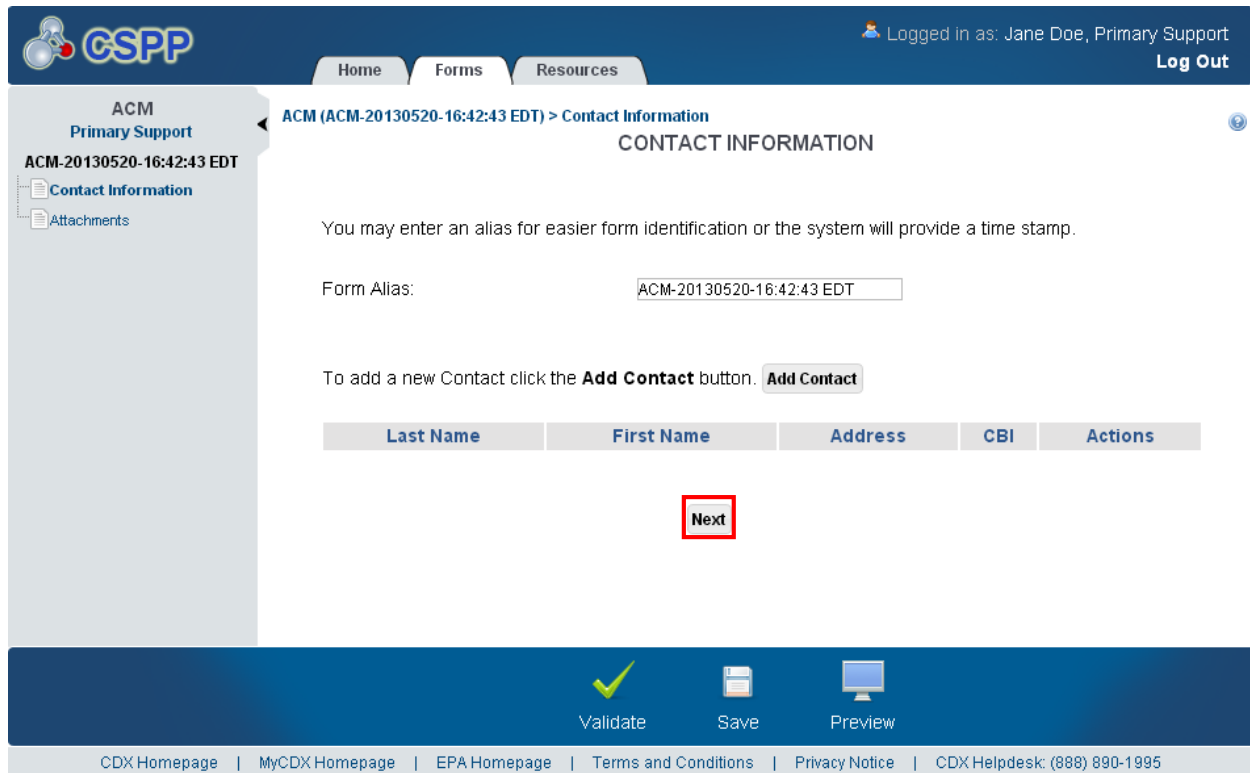


