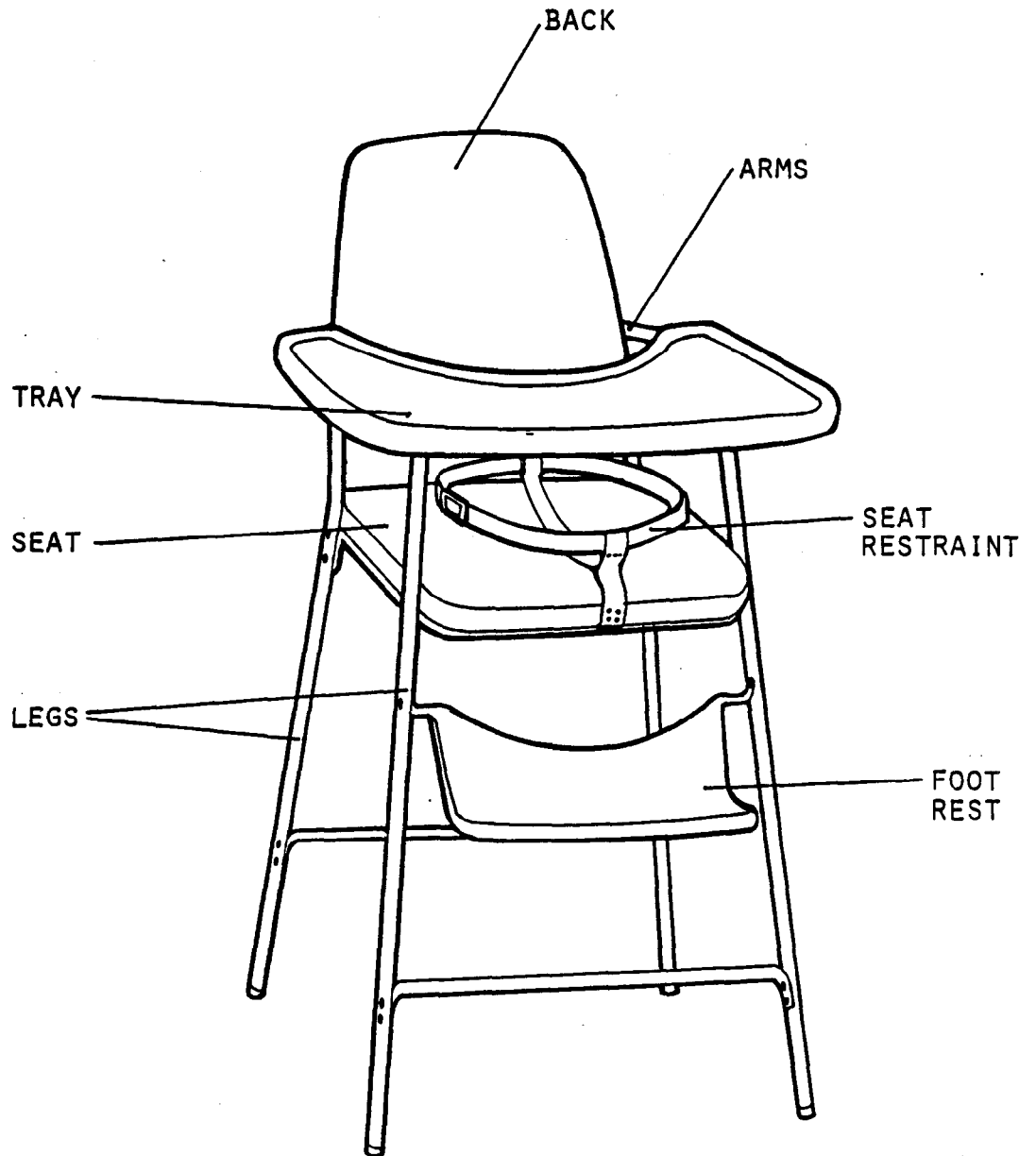


NOMENCLATURE HIGH CHAIRS



HAZARD PATTERNS

HIGH CHAIRS

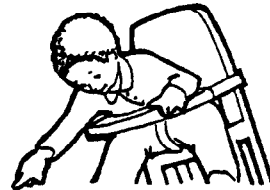
A

Escape: Where child frees self from chair by struggling, standing up, pushing on tray, and falls.



B

Reaching: Where child reaches for something from chair, loses balance and causes chair to fall.



C

Restraint-Release: Where child playing or "escaping" breaks or releases restraint system and falls.



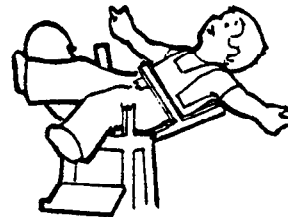
D

Lift-Out: Where child, getting out of chair or being removed, catches body part in chair, causing injury.



E

Chair or Component Fails: Where chair breaks or collapses with child in it.



GUIDELINES HIGH CHAIRS

THE VICTIM

Describe supervisor/supervision;
attentive/distracted during
accident; number and ages of
children being watched

Child (more/normal/less) active
than usual at time of accident

Child was through eating, bored

Diaper clean/dirty

Child able to balance/walk/lift
up from seated position and
stand; how well

High chair was child's or other;
length of use

Child's/adult's past experience
with this seat restraint and
ways lock/fastener released/
misassembled

Victim's clothing (describe)

Waist, thigh dimensions (PHOTO-
GRAPH with scale or tape measure)

THE TASK

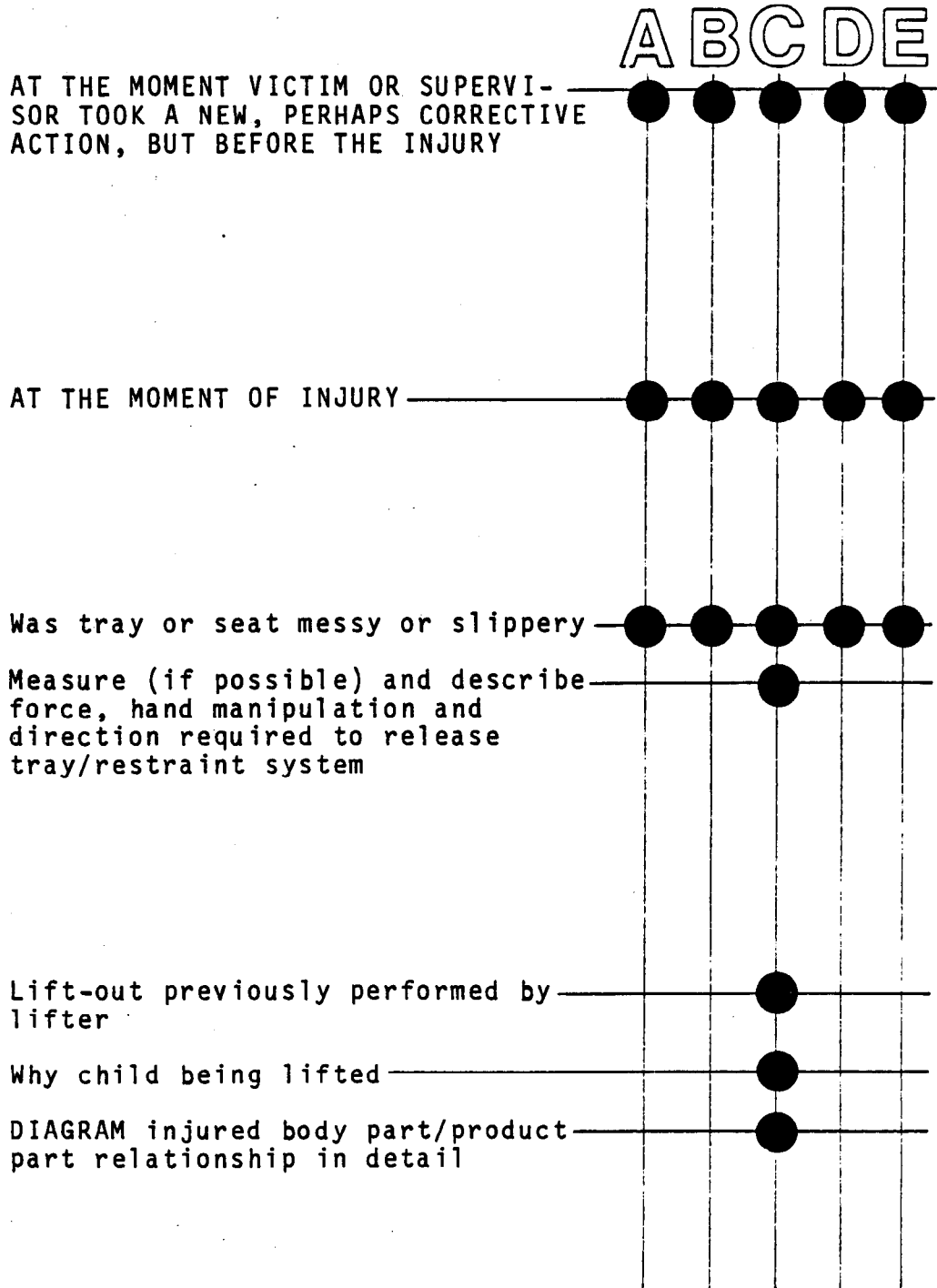

GUIDELINES HIGH CHAIRS

THE ENVIRONMENT

A B C D E

PHOTOGRAPH or DIAGRAM with dimensions or scale: room size; nearby objects/tables/counter top/furniture; high chair location

Any interference (dogs/cats/other children) possibly causing chair imbalance, collapse

Any loud noises (lawnmower/TV/music...) masking sound of child's playing/struggling/standing... before accident

If victim reaching for something (toy, bottle) possibly causing accident, describe object and where placed

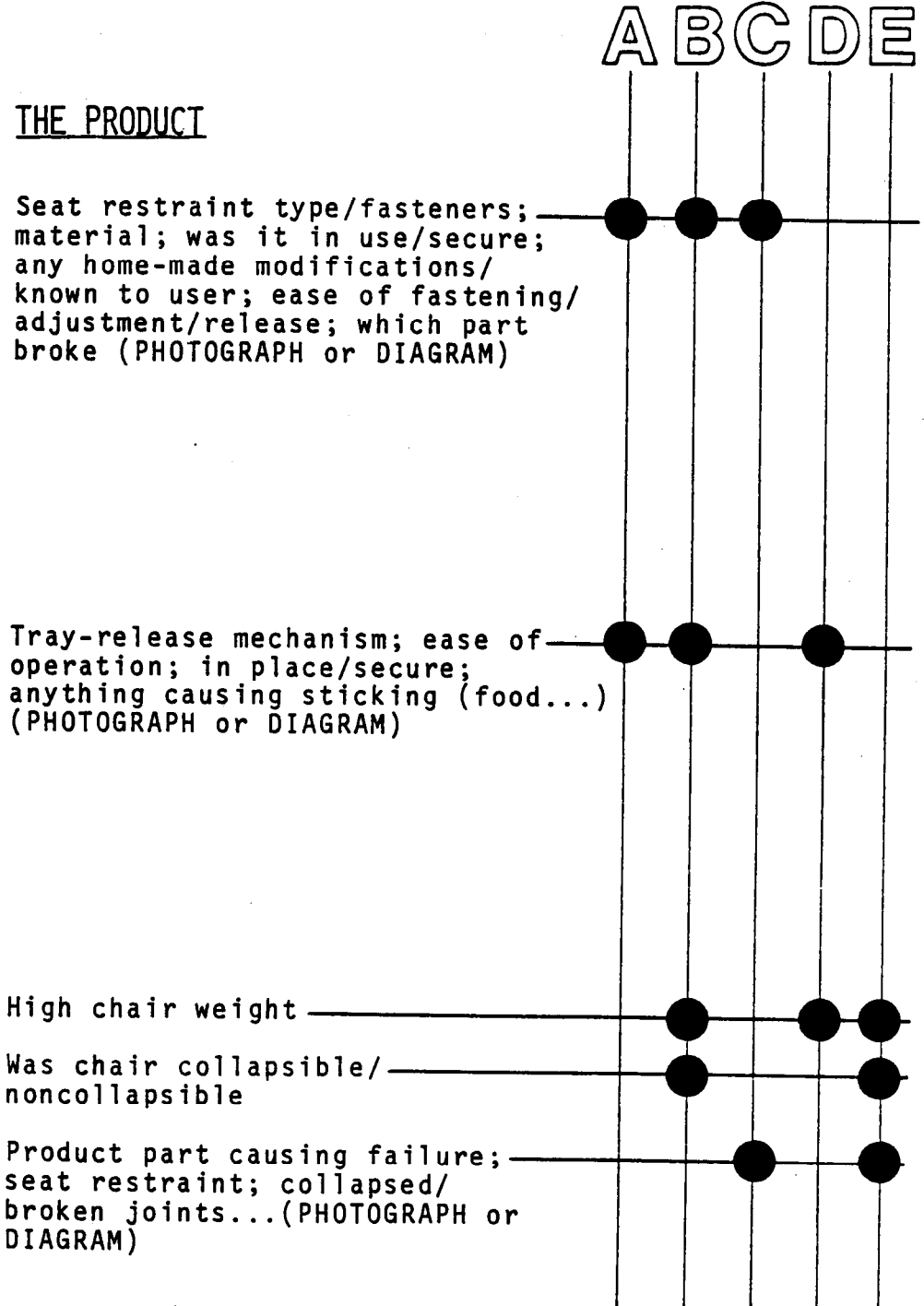
Floor material and condition

Lighting/can supervisor see victim

Victim at home

Product part causing injury
(PHOTOGRAPH or DIAGRAM)

Completely describe high chair:
age, new/used; material/
condition of seat; tray; legs;
back; arms, center of gravity
(PHOTOGRAPH or DIAGRAM, dimension)
