CNCS will be eliciting and accepting responses to these questions via preaddressed, tracked, UPS envelopes included with the mailings in which applicants receive the blank forms.

NCCC expects to distribute 8,500 forms each year. Each response is estimated to have a burden of 15 minutes, resulting in 2,125 total estimated burden hours annually.
