Applicants for MLK Day and September 11 will submit an application following the application instructions. Applicants may apply for MLK Day, September 11, or both. The application is required to be considered for grant funding support from MLK Day or September 11. CNCS will use the information collection to select grantee organizations through a competitive process.

A3. Minimize Burden: Use of Improved Technology to Reduce Burden

CNCS will be accepting applicants' response to these questions electronically via eGrants, CNCS' secure online grants management system.

A4. Non-Duplication

There are no other sources of information by which CNCS can meet the purposes described in A2 (above).

A5. Minimizing for economic burden for small businesses or other small entities.

This collection of information does not impact small businesses because they are not eligible to apply to be a September 11 or MLK Day of Service grantee. There is no economic burden to any other small entities beyond the cost of staff time at small nonprofits to collect and report the data. This is minimized to the degree possible by only asking for the information absolutely necessary to assess an organization's eligibility to apply and capacity to administer a September 11 or MLK Day of Service grant.

If the information is not collected, CNCS will be unable to request the necessary information to assess prospective September 11 and MLK grantees.
