Dear Primary Care Practice Leader:

RAND is inviting 150 selected primary care practices across the nation to participate in a study of the use of the CAHPS[®] PCMH items as part of their PCMH transformation. The Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) has funded this initiative as part of our ongoing efforts to evaluate the effectiveness of CAHPS[®] instruments, including the use of the Primary Care Medical Home CAHPS[®] items in transforming primary care.
