

SUBJECT: Announcing the FY2016 State Library Administrative Agency data collection!

Dear Chief Officer:

IMLS is pleased to announce that the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016 State Library Administrative Agency (SLAA) data collection will open in January 2017! We anticipate that the survey data will be released in Summer 2017, and statistical reports summarizing the results within one month of the data release.

What's New?

Starting with FY 2012, the SLAA survey is being collected every other year. Other than a minor name change (formerly StLA) though, the survey has changed very little from FY 2010. Please see the FY 2016 SLAA Survey Questionnaire and Instructions on the IMLS web site for your reference and to help you begin gathering the data that will be collected in January: <https://www.ims.gov/research-evaluation/data-collection/state-library-administrative-agency-survey>.

We are pleased to announce that the American Institutes for Research (AIR) will continue working with us on the FY 2016 SLAA collection. AIR is one of the largest social science research organizations in the world and has been conducting social and behavioral research since 1946. AIR has a long history of designing and supporting federal statistical surveys, particularly for the U.S. Department of Education, and members of their SLAA team worked on the SLAA collection when it was sponsored by the National Center for Education Statistics. The AIR SLAA team is currently designing the data collection web-tool and implementing processes to collect and release the FY 2016 SLAA data in a timely manner.
