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<b>Who should use?</b>	Manufacturers of recreational boats, permanently installed gasoline fuel tanks, USCG Type fuel hoses and navigation lights
<b>What is this collection about?</b>	This information collection requires manufacturers to display various labels evidencing compliance: Hull Identification Numbers; U.S. Coast Guard Maximum Capacities Label; Gasoline Fuel Tank Label; USCG Type Fuel Hose Label; and Certified Navigation Light Label.
<b>Where do I find the requirements for this information?</b>	The labeling regulations appear in 33 CFR 181 and 183 and 46 CFR 25.10-3. 46 U.S.C. 4307(a)(1)(A)(i) prohibits the manufacture or sale of a recreational boat, unless it complies with Federal regulations.
<b>When should information be submitted to the Coast Guard?</b>	The labels should be displayed on new recreational boats, permanently installed gasoline fuel tanks, USCG Type fuel hoses and navigation lights before the boat is sold or offered for sale.
<b>How is the information submitted?</b>	By means of labels affixed to recreational boats, f permanently installed gasoline fuel tanks, USCG Type fuel hoses and navigation lights. <b>What happens when information is received?</b>	The labels enable identification of individual boats, their date of construction, and the standards with which they and their installed equipment comply
