Tusks from each walrus should be tagged in pairs

- 1. Record the date tusks are tagged.
- 2. Village or town where tusks are tagged.
- 3. Record tag number of plastic-headed wire tag used for left tusk. (Use non-Native blue tag)
- 4. Record tag number of plastic-headed wire tag used for right tusk. (Use non-Native blue tag)
- 5. Record the date found.
