i4. This study will look at two groups: those who receive the [PROGRAM NAME]'s program services, and those who receive referrals to other existing services in the community. The study will compare outcomes for the two groups. A computer will randomly select which group you will be in. One of the groups will receive [PROGRAM NAME] program services at no cost to them. i5. At any time, after you have been randomly assigned, you can call Mathematica's help line to say that you no longer want the program to share information about you with the Mathematica researchers, and that will have no effect on the services available to you.

Everything you tell the researchers will be used for research purposes only, unless we are required by law to release it for some other purpose.
