Revisions to the Information Collection

• **<u>Change #1</u>**: In Question 4, we are removing "in a husband and wife" and entering "as spouses?"

Justification #1: In recognizing same-sex couples, we now use gender-neutral language acknowledging that a question or a statement on a form could refer to two same-sex individuals in a marriage.

• **<u>Change #2</u>**: In Question 5.B, we are removing "husband and wife" and entering "spouses"

Justification #2: In recognizing same-sex couples, we now use gender-neutral language acknowledging that a question or a statement on a form could refer to two same-sex individuals in a marriage.

- **<u>Change #3</u>**: In Question 6, we are revising the question:
 - From: "Did you have an understanding to your relationship when you began living together?"
 - To: "Did you and the person you were living with have an understanding about your relationship when you began living together?"

Justification #3: In recognizing same-sex couples, we now use gender-neutral language acknowledging that a question or a statement on a form could refer to two same-sex individuals in a marriage and rewriting the question for grammatical purposes.

• **<u>Change #4</u>**: In Question 7, we are revising the question:

From: "Did you have an understanding as to how long you would live together?"

To: "Did you and the person you were living with have an understanding about how long you would live together?"

Justification #4: In recognizing same-sex couples, we now use gender-neutral language acknowledging that a question or a statement on a form could refer to two same-sex individuals in a marriage and rewriting question for grammatical purposes.

• **<u>Change #5</u>**: In Question 12.A, we are changing language:

From: "Before you lived together (MAN'S NAME)"

To: "your name before you lived together"

Justification #5: In recognizing same-sex couples, we now use gender-neutral language acknowledging that a question or a statement on a form could refer to two same-sex individuals in a marriage.

• **<u>Change #6</u>**: In Question 12.B, we are changing language:

From: "Before you lived together (WOMAN'S NAME)"

To: "The person's name before you lived together"

Justification #6: In recognizing same-sex couples, we now use gender-neutral language acknowledging that a question or a statement on a form could refer to two same-sex individuals in a marriage

• **<u>Change #7</u>**: In Question 12.C, we are changing language:

From: "Since you lived together (MAN'S NAME)"

- **<u>Change #11</u>**: In Question 19, we are adding the following headings to the chart:
 - "Name" in the first column
 - "Address" in the second column
 - "Relationship" in the third column.

Justification #11: We are making this change to be consistent with headings on the charts throughout the form.

• **<u>Change #12</u>**: In Question 21.A, we are revising the language:

From: "Did you ever live with any other person as Husband and Wife?"

To: "Did you ever live with any other person as spouses?"

Justification #12: In recognizing same-sex couples, we now use gender-neutral language acknowledging that a question or a statement on a form could refer to two same-sex individuals in a marriage.

- **<u>Change #13</u>**: In Question 22.A, we are revising the language:
 - From: "Did the person named in Item 3 ever live with anyone else as Husband and Wife?"
 - To: "Did the person named in Item 3 ever live with anyone else as Spouses?"
