WHIHBCU STUDENT RECOGNITION

BACKGROUND

The White House Initiative on Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) is excited to announce the relaunch of their Student Recognition Program. This recognition is designed to identify current HBCU students for their dedication to academics, leadership and civic engagement. Moving forward rather than having students self-nominate we will only receive application forms and requested materials from HBCU Presidents/ Chancellors or surrogated HBCU faculty. No more than 2 nominations can be submitted from an HBCU.

HBCU Students are able to self-nominate and faculty are able to provide recommendations to the office of the president; the HBCU President will make the final decision and select no more than 2 students to be recognized from their institution.

PROGRAM DETAILS

Students will be recognized and acknowledge by the White House Initiative on Historically Black Colleges and Universities for one academic school year. During the course of an academic school year selected members of the WHIHBCU Staff will reach out to recognized students to inform them of outreach and engagement opportunities that they can take advantage of or communicate to their fellow students. Recognized students will also receive a formal invitation to attend the 2018 Annual HBCU Week Conference where they will engage with WHIHBCU staff, attend professional development sessions and explore the nation's capital.

Through personal and professional relationships with community-based organizations, public and private sector entities, selected students will share promising and proven practices with key stakeholders that support opportunities for all young people. In addition, this opportunity will also allow students to participate in regional events, as well as, web chats facilitated by WHIHBCU staff and other professionals from a wide range of disciplines that support a spirit of engagement, entrepreneurship, personal and professional development.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES

The nominated student must be a **current** undergraduate, graduate, or professional student at a Historically Black College or University (HBCU). Student must be enrolled for the 2018-2019 academic school year.

- Participating students should not directly participate or intervene in any political campaign while on duty.

- Participating students should assess and articulate their own professional aspirations, as well as the needs of their institutions, to determine the many ways that our initiative might be able to support them, their fellow students and institutions.
