About the Study

NLTS 2012 is a national study of young adults' high school experiences and how they transition from high school to the workforce and higher education. In addition to survey responses about school experiences, NLTS 2012 collects enrollment, financial aid, employment, and other related information from institutions and sources such as federal databases.

Why NLTS 2012 is Important

The information collected by NLTS 2012 will produce national statistics used by policymakers at the local, state, and national level to improve educational practices and learning in the United States. NLTS 2012 is the only source of information that can provide a national picture of the experiences of youth. Each young adult was selected to represent thousands of others, and there is no substitute for each person's participation.

How to Participate

It's quick and easy! It only takes about 5 minutes, and there are three options:
