In order for a state to operate its own dispute resolution program, the states us the HUD Form 310 to certify that its program meets the requirements of 42 U.S.C. 5401-5426, and must recertify every three years. The state does this by filling out the HUD 310 DRSC form and submitting to HUD for evaluation. HUD Form 311 allows persons to provide the federal manufactured housing dispute resolution program information to resolve a dispute, they will need to submit information on the home and parties involved in the dispute. Note: This is a renewal with no changes from previously approved form.
