USCG is submitting this PTA to discuss the Self-propelled Liquefied Gas Vessels information collection, which is associated with OMB Control Number 1625-0029. This collection provides information to ensure that USCG has sufficient information to determine if a vessel complies with certain safety and environmental protection standards. Plans and records for construction, modification, or operation of U.S. or foreign vessels submitted and maintained on board are required for compliance with these standards. There is no form associated with this collection; however, the PII collected includes basic business contact information such as the name and address of the vessel owner/operator. The records that USCG receives are maintained in Marine Information for Safety and Law Enforcement (MISLE) database.

The DHS Privacy Office agrees that this information collection is privacy-sensitive.

PIA coverage is provided by DHS/USCG/PIA-008 MISLE, which outlines the risks of capturing information required to support the Coast Guard's marine safety, security, environmental protection and law enforcement programs. SORN coverage is not technically required as the information is retrieved by search using vessel-specific information. However, DHS/USCG-013 MISLE does provide notice of this type of information collection.
