EVERYDAY SOBRIETY TESTS



ANNCR: The following video shows examples of real-world field sobriety tests that we can use to help us realize we may be under the influence.

"SOBRIETY TESTS" (Female)

We cut to a card that says, "If you fail your test."

We cut back to see the woman realize she's trying to open the wrong car. She then looks up to see a police car drive by.

We cut to another card that says, "You'll fail their test."

SUPER: YOU'LL FAIL THEIR TEST.
