Dear Ms. Lambie:

Oklahoma expended \$38,387,173 for mandatory minimum and optional supplementary payments for the period of January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014. Of this amount, \$616,715 was applied to the CY 2013 shortfall of \$616,715 and \$8,337 was paid to individuals in Medicaid facilities with an SSI living arrangement code of "D". Therefore, Oklahoma's supplementary payments for pass-along purposes for CY 2014 totaled \$37,762,121. With the State's current pass-along requirement at \$38,505,275, Oklahoma incurred a shortfall of \$743,154 for CY 2014 (See Attachment).

Oklahoma will satisfy the 2014 shortfall in the following 12-month period, per 20 CFR 416.2096(c)(2), in order to meet the 2014 pass-along requirement.
