Pacific Northwest Bumble Bee Symposium Questionnaire

The Pacific Northwest (PNW) is home to at least 27 species of bumble bee – more than half of all bumble bees native to North America. The PNW holds the historic range of several of the species that are currently in ESA review (Franklin’s, Western, Suckley’s) and others of conservation concern (Morrison’s, others). Some coordinated, landscape-scale conservation efforts are underway (the Oregon Bee Atlas, the PNW Bumble Bee Atlas, and others), but much work remains to be done and significant research opportunities exist. This symposium aims to gather Bumble Bee conservationists from different organizations in the Pacific Northwest to discuss Bumble Bee conservation, the projects being conducted, and the research that still needs to be done.
