Dear Governor Ivey:

As Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary for Mental Health and Substance Use, and Chair of the Interagency Coordinating Committee on the Prevention of Underage Drinking (ICCPUD), I would like to thank the State of Alabama for participating in the annual surveys of state-supported underage drinking enforcement and prevention programs between 2011 and 2016. These surveys were conducted in accordance with the Sober Truth on Preventing Underage Drinking (STOP) Act [Pub. L. No. 109-422, § 2, 120 Stat. 2890 (2006)], which calls on the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services to produce an Annual Report on state-level underage drinking prevention activities, policies, enforcement efforts, and expenditures.

The surveys, completed by all 50 states and the District of Columbia, were developed in coordination with the ICCPUD's federal agency partners and other interested parties. The data collected in these surveys are used to produce an Annual Report on each state's underage drinking prevention efforts, the first comprehensive document of its kind. The current Report, including your state's contribution to the survey, is available publicly at <https://www.stopalcoholabuse.gov/resources/reporttocongress/rtc2016.aspx>.

As called for in the STOP Act, SAMHSA is requesting that states complete another survey in early 2017 for the 2018 Annual Report. Last year, the individual identified as responsible for coordinating your state's response to the STOP Act survey was:


