| <p>11 Describe the purpose of the system.</p>   | <p>iQualR (iQualR) is system that works in conjunction with iQualA (iQualA) to conduct qualitative research used to investigate HIV risk and progression of disease among affected communities as well as the systems funded to address HIV prevention, treatment, care, as well as surveillance. The primary intent of the iQualR system is to understand issues surrounding HIV risk in the U.S. Learn more about how affected community or peer norms, and risk behaviors. Understand individual HIV risk management, barriers and facilitators for use of biomedical interventions (i.e., PrEP, nPEP). Understand factors that promote resiliency among at-risk communities and have a better understanding of these goals will enable the program to better assess how they are meeting the National HIV/AIDS Strategic Plan.</p>   |

The iQualR system currently includes four active task orders that enable data owners to collect data out-in-the-field and/or by one-on-one interview.</p> <p>iQualR only collects and stores the participant's birth year, race and ethnicity, gender, sex, sexual orientation, city of residence, and HIV status.</p> <p>This data is collected through four active task orders with iQualR and conducted by interviews with HIV - negative from 4 MSAs (Atlanta, GA; New Orleans, LA; Columbia, SC; and Miami, FL). Individual data is collected and maintained by iQualR.</p> <p>iQualR does not store users names and passwords; it does authenticate all its users against Active Directory, a separate access authentication tool that has its own PIA.</p> |
