The reports shall be numbered consecutively beginning at the start of the crop year and shall be certified by a responsible official of the reporting handler. The acquisition of the raisins or raisin material reported herein was shown on Form RAC-28.

- 1. Enter ultimate disposition as "stock feed" or "distillery."
- 2. Enter date shipped or otherwise disposed of.
- 3. Enter varietal type.
- 4. If off-grade was received under exemption, mark an "X" in column.
- 5. Enter weight of residuals including stemmer waste, tailings, etc.
- 6. Enter weight of off-grade raisins exclusive of residuals.
- 7. Enter totals of residuals and off-grade disposed of during reporting period. If more than one sheet is used totals should be brought forward to first sheet.
- 8. Consult RAC Field Representatives on any points not clear to you.

This report is required by law (7 U.S.C. 608d, 7 CFR 989.173(c)(4)). Failure to report can result in a fine of \$1,100 for each such violation, and each day during which such violation continues shall be deemed a separate violation.
